Young-Hea ⊥ Marchant was born May 11, 1951 in Seong-ju, Korea and passed away January 1, 2014. She was the fifth of nine children. Though raised in a Buddhist family, Young-Hea independently decided that she would attend a Catholic church during her junior high school years. While her attendance was initially enticed by the promise of receiving candy from the priest, she quickly established a passion for serving God and others. At the age of 16 Young-Hea attended a lecture by a Unification Church pastor and shortly thereafter became a dedicated member of the Unification Church.

During her studies Young-Hea established herself as a top student. Her successes helped her to be selected for a competitive nursing program through which she was able to obtain a degree in nursing by the time she graduated high school. Following her graduation Young-Hea went to Germany where she began practicing as a nurse. Each month she sent portions of her paycheck to Korea in order to support a small, humble Unification church and her family. Through her support the church was able to acquire a piano and her mother purchased a plot of land upon which she developed a melon farm.

In 1979 Young-Hea moved to New York where was married in 1982. In 1984 she gave birth to her first child, Helen. A year later her first son, Gavin, was born and in 1990 she gave birth to her third child, Derek. In 1991 Young-Hea moved with her family to Houston, Texas, where she had her fourth and final child, Laura, in 1992. In Houston Young-Hea dedicated her time to raising her four children and being actively involved in works to support her church.

In the summer of 2007 Young-Hea was diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), a disease that slowly took her life. Following her diagnosis Young-Hea's biggest concern was that she might become a burden for her family. She never complained about her situation, was never resentful, and continued to pray for and support others as she could. Young-Hea was a wonderful and devoted wife and mother of four who will never be forgotten. She lived her life selflessly, wholeheartedly, and touched many people.

Young-Hea is survived by her husband, Todd, and her four children.
