In October 2025, IAYSP Zambia carried out a three-day outreach campaign in Ndola to inspire and prepare students for upcoming examinations.

The initiative combined academic motivation with character education, emphasizing universal values such as responsibility, service, respect, and teamwork.

Led by IAYSP Vice President Clarence Phiri and U.S. youth missionary Elliot Ojeda, the program reached five schools - Premier Ladybird Education Center, Makenzie Community School, Multiple Care Community School, Lovely Smiles Christian School, and Madalitso Wits Sports Academy.



Activities included motivational talks, character lessons, group discussions, and team-building exercises, all designed to strengthen perseverance, empathy, and leadership among learners.
