 - 3) Make this tournament that can grow to become one that surpasses the Olympic Games by preparing excellent teams of the Region
- 2. Official name: WCSF Cain-Abel Wongu Peace Cup Cosmic Harmony Tournament 2012
- 3. Tournament to be held from 3.2~3.4 by the Heavenly Calendar (Friday, March 23~Sunday, March 25, 2012)
 ** Participants should arrive in Korea and register before March 23

- 4) Please be sure to attach the career record and introduction of the team and its athletes.
- 8. Expenses
 - 1) Each regional headquarters is responsible for the expenses of the teams and their athletes (including airfare and related expenses incurred in home nation) coming from that region.
 - 2) Organizing committee will cover for all tournament-related expenses (transportation, lodgings, meals, etc.) incurred during official tournament period (Mar 23-25).
- 9. The tournament draw will be held at the Indoor Gymnasium of the Cheonga Camp at 2:00 p.m., 2.28 by the Heavenly Calendar (Tuesday March 20, 2012).
- A representative from each region should take part in draw (committee officials will draw on behalf of a region in the case of absence).

 - 1) Date: 10:30 a.m. 3.2 by the Heavenly Calendar (March 23, 2012)
 - Pre-event performance to begin from 9:30 a.m. General audience should be seated at the venue by 9:00 a.m.

 - 3) Expected participants: 5,000
 - 4) Opening Ceremony rehearsal to be held at 4:00 p.m. on 3.1 by the Heavenly Calendar (Thursday, March 22, 2012) with all athletes.


Harmony and Unity Game

Entry team details

- 1) Entries: Registered teams from each region
- 2) Each team should consist of two men and two women

■ Game rules

- Each game will consist of four rounds. In each round, a player can roll the ball 10 times. (Each player on the four-person team should play in a round)
- 2) Players must roll the ball with one hand and release the ball below knee-level.
- 3) Balls that roll outside the mat will be disqualified.
- 4) No score will be given to a throw if the player steps beyond the starting line at the time of releasing the ball.

Soccer

Entry team details

- 1) Entries: Registered teams from each region
- 2) Each team should consist of 11 players and 7 substitutes (men only)
- 3) Each team should bring their own uniform, soccer shoes and ankle support

- 1) First half and second half of the match will be 30 minutes each with a 10 minute half-time break. (Lost time will be measured by the referee.)
- X If the game ends in a draw, the winner will be decided by penalty-kicks (five persons from each team). For the Finals, there will be an additional 10 minute (1st half) / 10 minute (2nd half) overtime.
- \times 3rd and 4th place will be decided based on goal points.
- 2) Free-kick will be granted by the referee when it is required.
- 3) Yellow card will be given to players who:
 - display unsporting behavior
 - express dissent in words and actions to the referee
 - consistently violate the rules
 - intentionally delay the resumption of the match
 - do not maintain the designated distance during free-kicks or corner-kicks
 - enters or re-enters the field without the permission of the referee
 - intentionally leaves the field without the permission of the referee
- 4) Red card will be given to players who:
 - commit a serious foul
 - commit violent conduct
 - commit handling with the intent of preventing the opponent to score (goal-keepers inside their respective penalty areas are excluded)
 - commit a foul (that would grant the opponent a free-kick or penalty kick) with the intent to prevent the opponent who is heading toward the goal from scoring
 - use foul or defamatory language
 - receive two warnings (yellow cards) in a single game

Volleyball

Entry team details

- 1) Registered teams: Men's team and women's team
- 2) Games will be held with 6 players from each team. (Team may consist up to 12 players).

■ Game rules

- 1) There will be three rounds for each match. The first team to win two matches wins.
- 2) Points (rally point scoring system)
 - The team that wins 17 points in a round wins
 - The team that scores during a rally gains a point (In other words, even the receiving side can score points)
 - When the score is a tie at 16:16, the side that gains two additional points wins.
- 3) Serving
 - The team that successfully wins a point gains the right to serve.
- 4) Time-out: Each team can ask for a time-out once (1 minute) for each set.
- 5) Fouls: A point will be deducted for the following instances.
 - When the ball remains in a player's hand or arm ("holding")
 - When a player touches the ball beyond the net ("over net")
 - When a player touches the net during the game ("net touch")
 - When a player consecutively touches a ball twice (excluding blocking) ("dribble")
 - When a team fails to hit the ball across the net within three touches ("four hits")
 - When a player crosses the center line during the match ("passing the center line")
 - When the server steps on the line
 - When a player serves before the referees whistle
- 6) 3rd and 4th place will be decided based on goal points

Basketball

- Entry team details
 - 1) Entries: Registered teams from each region (Men only)
 - 2) Each team should have 5 athletes and 7 substitutes

■ Game rules

- 1) First half and second half will be 15 minutes each with a 10-minute halftime break.
- 2) 5 minute $(1^{st} half) / 5$ minute $(2^{nd} half)$ overtime will be given in the case of a draw.
- 3) Each basket will be counted as 2 points. Free throws will be 1 point each and shots made beyond the 3-point line will be awarded 3 points.
- 4) Players can be replaced when the clock is stopped and under the instructions of the referee (no limit to the number of substitutes; expelled players cannot be used as substitutes)
- 5) When a player is expelled from the court, another player can take his place.

Dodgeball

Entry team details

- 1) Entries: Registered teams from each region (women only)
- 2) Each team should consist of 20 women for each game

- 1) Three rounds will be held for each match. The first team to win two rounds wins. Each team should be divided in two, with one group playing inside the court and the other positioned outside the court. The group that plays inside the court in the first round must play outside the court in the second round. In the third round, the team can decide who should be positioned inside or outside the court.
- 2) The match begins with a jump-ball at the center of the court.
- 3) If a player is stepping on the line at the time of attack (or while wrestling for possession of the ball), the attack will be considered void.
- 4) If a player outside the court reaches into the court and places his hand on the ground inside the court to grab the ball it will be considered void.
- 5) If more than one person is hit by a live ball they will all be considered out. (This is only if the ball hits the ground after the attack.)
- 6) A player will not be considered out even if he is hit by the ball if a teammate catches the ball before it hits the ground.
- 7) An attack will be considered null if it hits a person's head.
- 8) Players hit by the ball and made "out" must immediately leave the court.
- 9) If a player catches a ball outside the court it will be considered a catch as long as one foot is firmly placed inside the court.
- 10) The team that eliminates all the opponents in the court wins.

Table Tennis

Entry team details

- 1) Registered teams: Men's and women's
- 2) One man and one woman per doubles team

■ Game rules

- 1) There will be three rounds for each match. The first team to win two matches wins. (For the finals there will be five rounds. The first team to win three matches wins)
- 2) Scoring system
 - The first team to score 21 points wins
 - When the score is a tie at 20:20, the side that gains two additional points wins.
- 3) Serving
 - The right to serve is passed to the other side for every 5 points
 - The player should throw the ball vertically into the air with his free hand when serving.

Badminton – Men, Women

- Entry team details
 - 1) Registered teams: Men's and women's
 - 2) One man and one woman per doubles team

- 1) Tournament line-up will be decided by lottery.
- 2) In the preliminary matches, the first team to win a single match wins. For the semi-finals and Finals, there will be three rounds and the first team to win two matches wins.
- 3) Points (rally point scoring system)
 - The team that wins 21 points in a round wins
 - The team that scores during a rally gains a point (In other words, even the receiving side can score points)
 - When the score is a tie at 20:20, the side that gains two additional point wins.
- 4) Serving

- The team that successfully wins a point gains the right to serve.
- The server and receiver must stand diagonally across from each other in the court.
- The shuttle must be hit below the server's waist-level
- The shuttle must fall within the receiver's court.
- When the server is about to serve, the racket head should be placed below the server's hand so that it can be visible to the receiver.

Track and Field

- 1) Entries: Registered teams from each region
- 2) Please refer to the following chart for the number of athletes per team:

- 1) International rules will be applied.
- 2) Athletes who make a false start twice in a single race will be disqualified.
