Ralph Kenneth Hendricks (known by most as Kenn, Uncle Ken, and Appa) was born on December 5, 1948 in Dickinson, ND to Oscar and Clementine Hendricks. From a young age, he had a passion for music and the arts. After graduating from Dickinson High School, Kenn dedicated two years to the U.S. military during the Vietnam War.

In August 1974, Kenn met the Unification Church in Fargo, ND and officially joined in September that same year. In July 1982, he was married to Akemi Ono from Japan in a memorable wedding ceremony of 2,075 couples. Today, he is survived by his wonderful family.

Kenn has served his community, friends, and family abundantly. He offered his musical talent at gatherings, shot a feature-length film ("Dakota Sunrise") in the North Dakota Badlands, represented Mongolia as its Tribal Messiah, served Rev. and Mrs. Moon directly in various events, was a strong supporter of the Landmark Forum, and filled every heart he met with laughter and joy. Kenn truly was, in his own words, a "prophet" of God.
