The Authority of Marriage

In Matthew 21, the chief priests and elders asked Jesus, "By what authority are you doing these things? ...And who gave you this authority?" Jesus answered that his authority was from God through John the Baptist. In like manner, I used to tell Christians that Father's authority came from God through Jesus.

This is true, but it does not explain the authority to bestow the Blessing. It does not explain True Parents' authority.
