The International Holy Wedding of 3.6 Million Couples was held in Washington, D.C. at the Robert F. Kennedy (RFK) Memorial Stadium on November 29, 1997. Unificationists went door-to-door, conducting "pre-blessings" of couples who wished to re-dedicate their marriages. The mobilization of 30,000 pre-Blessed couples to fill RFK Stadium in November became the top priority of members in the field. The weather cooperated, a bussing strategy was successful, and Unification News publication described the Blessing '97 as a "Resounding Victory." Ministers and members of their congregations had come from as far away as Chicago. The Washington Post set attendance at 40,000, CNN put it as 45,000, and the Associated Press counted 28,000 couples or 56,000 people.

The holiday is celebrated on the fourth Thursday of the month, and this year (2013) Thanksgiving takes place on November 28.

In his speech, True Father said, "This is the time the American people must act as a great people who put trust in God. Then this day will he a day of new hope and unification. "In God We Trust." In these four words lie America's key to survival and prosperity. America must live the will of God, and God's command at this crossroads in American history is Forgive, Love, and Unite!"

<u>November 30, 2011</u> North Korea Receives Food Aid from South Korean Civic Group

Ambassadors for the Peace Association, a civic group that is partly funded by the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (FFWPU), donated flour to *Jongju*, the birth place of True Father, founder of the FFWPU. Confirmation of the intended distribution and aid came after a South Korean official and four civilians returned from a rare trip to the North to monitor how 300 tons of flour was distributed to children. The monitors visited two kindergartens and a nursery in the northwestern city of Jongju and saw first-hand the distribution of the flour and how it is stored and prepared, said Unification Ministry spokeswoman Park Soo-jin. It was the first time that North Korea has allowed a South Korean official to travel to the isolated country to monitor aid since a conservative government took power in Seoul in 2008.
