BACKGROUNDER



Mount Kumgang, one of the most famous scenic areas of the Korean peninsula, has become a symbol of the on - off cooperation between the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK/North Korea) and the Republic of Korea (South Korea). We would like to consider what confidence building measures could initiate a transition to peace at a time of sanctions and the suspicion that any resources gained by North Korea will be used to

support the military, nuclear weapons and their delivery systems?

'Who can guide the process' is pertinent given that elections may lead to a President of the United States or a President of South Korea, who may withdraw from any prior agreements made by a previous administration. Who can guide any peace initiative into a longstanding agreement in which all parties can have assurance? (For more biographical detail Link)

Carolyn Pape Cowan, PhD is Adjunct Psychology Professor, Emerita, UC Berkeley. Philip A. Cowan, PhD is Psychology Professor, Emeritus, UC Berkeley. Together, they co-directed three longitudinal intervention studies of how family relationships affect children's adaptation.

This session will explore how the family, the "natural and fundamental group unit of society" (UDHR art. 16(3)), can be a source of women and girls' empowerment. Families in which spouses view each other as partners cherish women's gifts and encourage their development and use. In addition, families in which parents model gender equality provide their children with a blueprint for equality outside the home, reducing stereotypes, gender-based violence, and harmful practices.

This session will explore how the family empowers women and girls, particularly when gender equality is valued by men within the family. Families in which parents model gender equality in their own responsibilities at home and opportunities outside the home prepare the next generation to champion gender equality. Additionally, fathers' support for their daughters' education nurture not only girls' abilities but also their confidence. This event will examine policies and practices which can help families combat harmful stereotypes and practices and foster a future in which women and girls participate equally and successfully in public life.

Backgrounder

Since the end of the Cold War, several initiatives have been taken to enhance the conditions for peace on the Korean Peninsula, with varying degrees of success: the Framework Agreement, the Korean Peninsula Energy Development Organization (KEDO), the Six-Party Talks, and the Sunshine Policy. The recent attempts by the Trump Administration to secure an accord with North Korea and the latest meetings of the two Korean presidents raised expectations that have not been fulfilled. They have shown, however, that political will can go a long way in initiating a thawing process after decades of conflict.

A new US Administration has now settled in. South Korea is moving toward an election year in 2022. In this context, what are the chances for progress of the peace process on the Korean Peninsula? What lessons can be learned from the previous efforts at securing peace agreements? By means of its Northeast Asia Peace Initiative, UPF has been supporting the peace process on the Korean Peninsula, beginning with its Founders' meeting with Kim Il Sung in 1991: Today, 70 years after the Korean War, we are calling on world experts to contribute to the process of reunification of the two Koreas. Three panelists will draw lessons from the past and give their advice for a peaceful settlement on the peninsula.


