



MARYLAND Pearl Harbor Day Powwow Includes Bridge of Peace Ceremony

Mrs. Dottie Chicquelo, Assistant Director of the Office of Multi-Ethnic Student Education (OMSE) at the University of Maryland (UMD) invited the Maryland Chapter of WFWP to be a cosponsor of the 9th Annual Powwow on Saturday, December 7, 2013, and to conduct a Bridge

of Peace Ceremony at the gathering. Mrs. Chicquelo had also played a crucial role as the liaison to the University of Maryland during the WFWP 21st National Assembly earlier this year. She felt so inspired by her own experience on the Bridge of Peace that she got the approval of OMSE for WFWP to hold a Bridge of Peace ceremony during the

Powwow. The Powwow was scheduled on Pearl Harbor Day. The intent was to offer an opportunity to those in attendance to stand up and reconcile with former enemies of war. After the Grand Entry to open the powwow, Mrs. Angelika Selle offered an explanation of the history of the Bridge of Peace. A nine-member Japanese Women's Choir then warmed the audience when they sang, "Hand in Hand." Their singing lifted the atmosphere and deepened the ceremony.

Earlier that morning, in preparation for the bridge crossing, the participants gathered in a separate room to share their hearts deeply, sometimes in tears, and to listen to one another. This created an atmosphere

of acknowledgement, repentance, and forgiveness, and made a foundation for substantial healing to take place on the bridge. Through this foundation those in the audience could experience the Creator's heart of unconditional love moving in the room from heart to heart.

NEW JERSEY

Freezing rain didn't put a damper on the fundraiser concert for aid to WFWP Schools of Africa and to offer relief to the Philippines that took place on Friday, December 6, 2013 in Clifton, New Jersey. The rock concert sponsored jointly by the New Jersey Chapter of WFWP and the local band, *Sail the Boat*, featured three bands and a solo artist performing at the Clifton Family Church to raise funds for schools in Africa sponsored by WFWP, as well as to send relief aid to victims of the typhoon in the Philippines.



spent several months participating in service projects in Honduras under the Universal Peace Federation, and have realized how fortunate I am to have grown up in a country where things like education, good health, clean water, and food are a normal part of daily life," said Haider. ABC media sent a crew over and they stayed for four and a half hours to cover the show.

Leap Forward into 2014! WFWP USA Delegates Attend Leadership Convention in Seoul By Mrs. Angelika Selle, President WFWP USA

It was only a week and a half before leaving that word came that there would be a World Leaders Convention held on December 15, 2013 in Korea, called by our Founder, Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon. This end of the year gathering was also dedicated to the Advancement of Korean Reunification and Peace in Northeast Asia.

A small delegation of 14 ladies and gentlemen from the United States representing the FFFWP, WFWP, and UPF was invited to attend this special gathering along with 15,000 participants from Korea and 200 from Japan. WFWP sent three representatives, President Angelika Selle, Mrs. Katherine Duncan (President of Ward 5, Chamber of Commerce in Las Vegas, and Mrs. Kim Dadachanji, WFWP chairwoman of Maryland.

The team arrived safely in Seoul, welcomed by subfreezing temperatures, ice and snow on the ground. We met up with delegates from other states and 18 American students who are currently studying Korean language at Sun Moon University.
