

# Brightwood Community Swept Up Into the Media

On a crisp December morning, Minister Chi Mauuso was sweeping in front of her house as is part of her daily routine to keep the neighborhood clean and sparkling. One of her neighbors from across the street came hurrying over to her, "Minister Chi, Minister Chi, come quickly, there's a reporter over there who wants to know about our neighborhood and you are the person most qualified to speak for us. Come quickly. Here, I'll take your broom and finish your sweeping for you!"

Minister Chi crossed the street and introduced herself to Ms. Audrey Hoffer, a freelance writer for the Washington Post. In the article, Alfreda-Chi Mauuso is introduced as "the former ANC (Advisory Neighborhood Commission), commissioner, works with the Women's Federation for World Peace International,

which among other local projects teaches children character." She spoke about changes in the neighborhood, and was quoted as saying, "There were drugs that you could visibly see and leaking gasoline drums on the streets. People didn't take walks on Georgia Avenue. Now it's wonderful here. We have stores. We have many restaurants. We have a good relationship with the local police department. We have friendly people who care about the community."

The article was published in the Washington Post Real Estate section on Saturday December 17, 2016 (click here to access article). When WFWP members work to brighten up our neighborhoods, it is noticed; and amazing opportunities like this appear in the blink of an eye. It is an opportunity to introduce people to the work WFWP members are doing to make each neighborhood safe and secure for our families by "living for the sake of others."

full-time employee of the US Department of Veteran Affairs in New Jersey. She is the Medical Foster Home Program Manager that places veterans into homes to be cared for, instead of going into a nursing home. The slogan of the program is: Where Heroes Meet Angels.

Before her present employment, she worked in the field of domestic violence for seven years as a counselor for victims of domestic abuse. Having worked for that long with victims, she has acquired unique insight and understanding of people in pain, both emotional and physical. Denneze said that it is in this job she could deeply understand the status of women in the world and the need for women to come into a true understanding

of themselves.

She holds a Masters of Religious Education (MRE) and another in Social Work (MSW) is a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW), and

is a marriage and family therapist.

When WFWP was founded in 1992 on April 10, Denneze was living in her native country, Guyana, where as a founding member she was actively involved in the registration and growth of WFWP. After she moved to the US in 1995, she lived in New York and New Jersey with her husband. She attended the WFWP Bridges of Peace ceremonies, crossed the bridge numerous times, and experienced the healing and reconciliatory effects of these events.

# RECIPE: BEEF STEW WITH DILL

# The Perfect Remedy for a Chilly, Winter Day By Sarah Falconi

With the chilly weather settling in this winter season, why not rustle up a nice, hot stew? I highly recommend this homemade beef stew with dill (and veggies!), as a great recipe. It'll not only keep you full, but will also warm your insides to fight off any colds or other reled illnesses that are lurking nearby. Hope you enjoy it and have a safe, warm, and healthy winter season!

Serves: 4 to 6 people Total time: 30-50 mins. Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 pounds beef chuck, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
- Salt
- Pepper
- 1 quart chicken stock or low-sodium broth
- 6 shallots, halved
- 1/2 pound carrots, cut into 2-inch lengths
- 1 1/2 cups frozen peas
- 5 ounces curly spinach
- 2 tablespoons chopped dill
- Crusty bread, for serving



#### Instructions

1. In a large saucepan, heat the olive oil until simmering. Season the meat with salt and pepper and add it to the saucepan in a single layer. Cook over moderately high heat, turning occasionally, until browned all over, about 10

minutes. Add the stock and shallots and bring to a boil. Simmer over low heat until the meat is tender, about 1 1/2 hours.

2. Add the carrots to the saucepan and simmer until tender, about 12 minutes. Add the peas, spinach and dill and cook until the spinach is wilted, about 2 minutes. Ladle the stew into bowls and serve with crusty bread.

Note: The stew can be refrigerated overnight. Reheat gently before serving.


