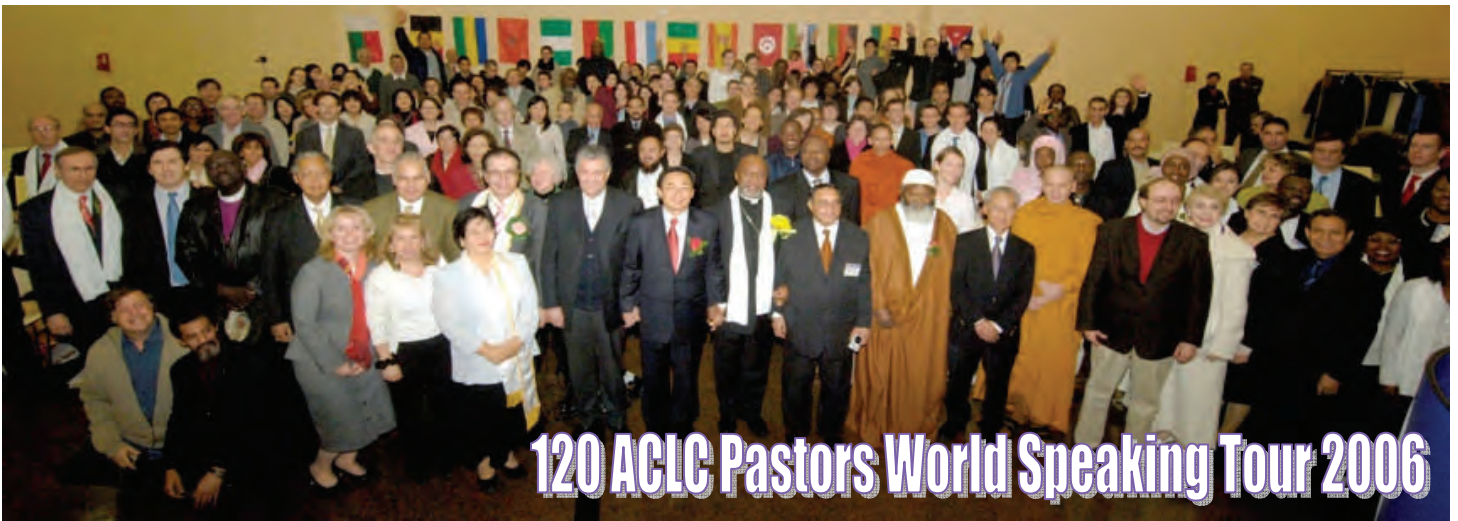

## ESTABLISHMENT

The American Clergy Leadership Conference (ACLCL) was inaugurated on May 22, 2000 when a group of 120 ministers from 17 denominations traveled to Seoul, Korea. The ACLCL is a broad-based interdenominational coalition of ministers with a singular threefold purpose: to rebuild the family, restore the community and renew the nation and the world. The ACLCL is talking the talk and walking the walk: preaching God centered family values in urban communities throughout the country. Currently, there are 5,000 members - many of whom are nationally renowned.

## STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

- **To unify** the Body of Christ, the Christian Church, and all Abrahamic faiths.
- **To foster** denominational unity and work with all religions.
- **To dissolve** racial barriers by practicing the principle of loving one's enemies.
- **To provide** moral direction for America and world leaders.
- **To promote** the blessing of marriage and the end of divorce as well as strengthening family ties and cultivating a healthy environment for youth in the family and the community.
- **To actively** participate in the renewal of the community by working together with people of faith and faith-based organizations in order to address the needs of the people around the world.
- **To be** led by the work of the Holy Spirit to inspire and direct the people of the nation.
- **To work** for an environment and culture of peace by living for the sake of others.
- **The ACLC** believes in one Creator, although people of all faiths may call him by various names.

## 2, Educational Materials and Seminars

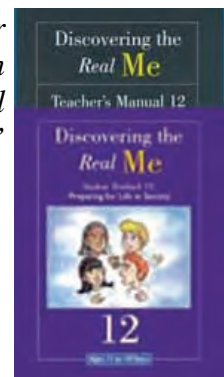

### ACLCL Pastors and the Middle East Peace Initiative (MEPI)

**A** CLC is one of the founding organizations of the MEPI and continues to organize pilgrimages to the Holy Land to allow pastors to engage in real peace making. Our spiritual roots are strengthened as we visit the holy sites and retrace the steps of Jesus and extend the call for Muslims, Christians and Jews to become active participants in the Middle East Peace experiences.

**O**ver 100 members of the American Clergy Leadership Conference (ACLCL) and Ambassadors for Peace (AFP) participated in peace mission of the Middle East Peace Initiative (MEPI). They came from forty nations in the Americas, Europe, Asia and Africa to bring together leaders from faith traditions and civil society to augment the work of peace in a key trouble spot of the world.

Following the pattern of the peace missions that began in May 2003, ACLCL clergy went to holy sites honored by Jews, Christians and Muslims and met with local religious, political and civic leaders. They engaged in dialogue, went on peace walks, participated in seminars, and shared prayers, meals, and accommodations.

“Welcome to Jerusalem, a holy land. You are filling up the holes,” said **Sheikh Abdul Aziz Bukhari**, head of the Naqshabandi Sufi method in the Holy Land. Four-time Jerusalem city

councilman **Dr. Eliezer Glaubach** reported, “There are endless barriers in the world, between races, languages, cultures and religions. Each of you who are coming to the Holy Land is led by providential power to bring hope.”

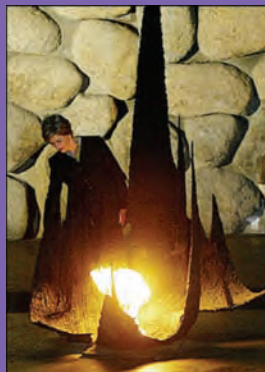
## Search for Peace in the Middle East

The search for peace in the Middle East involves the heirs of Abraham's faith. "Therefore, we must turn to God, we must find our common roots," explains ACLC Co-President, **Rev. Dr. Michael Jenkins**. "In our scriptures there are common roots, common truths, that bind us together, and though the tensions are great through dialogue and serving the needs of the people we can dissolve the tension and become one family. At the Dome of the Rock the faithful come and pray, while other sons of Abraham come and pray at the Western Wall and at the church of the Holy Sepulcher. Eventually we want to see these prayers being made in a place where guns are no longer present."

In the course of the seven-day peace mission, an imam opened a gathering with recitations from the Qur'an, a rabbi chanted a blessing over the breaking of bread, and a Christian pastor illustrated a point by singing a Gospel song. The roles sometimes rotated, as the tasty and diverse spiritual diet was complemented by abundant daily buffet meals.



### Yad Vashem's Hall of Remembrance

In a breakthrough of interreligious relations, the Vatican ended its annual boycott of the Holocaust remembrance ceremonies and sent a representative to the Yad Vashem

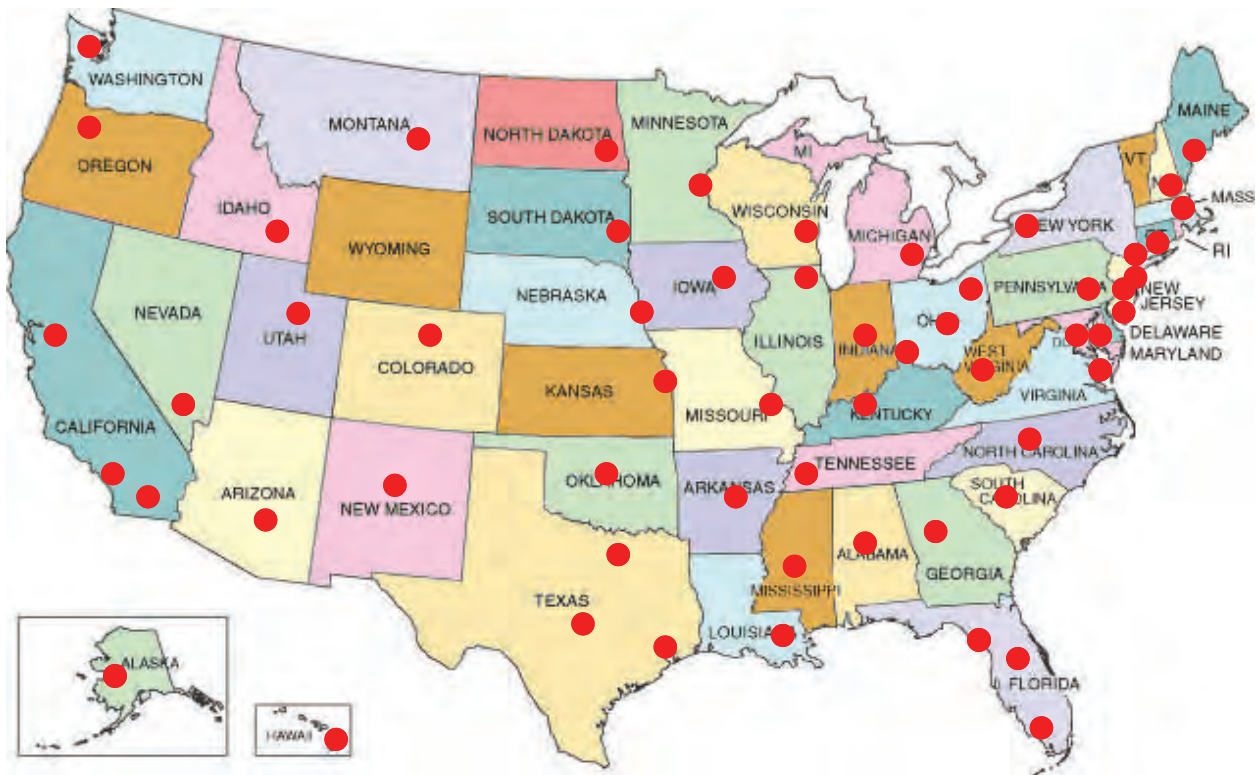



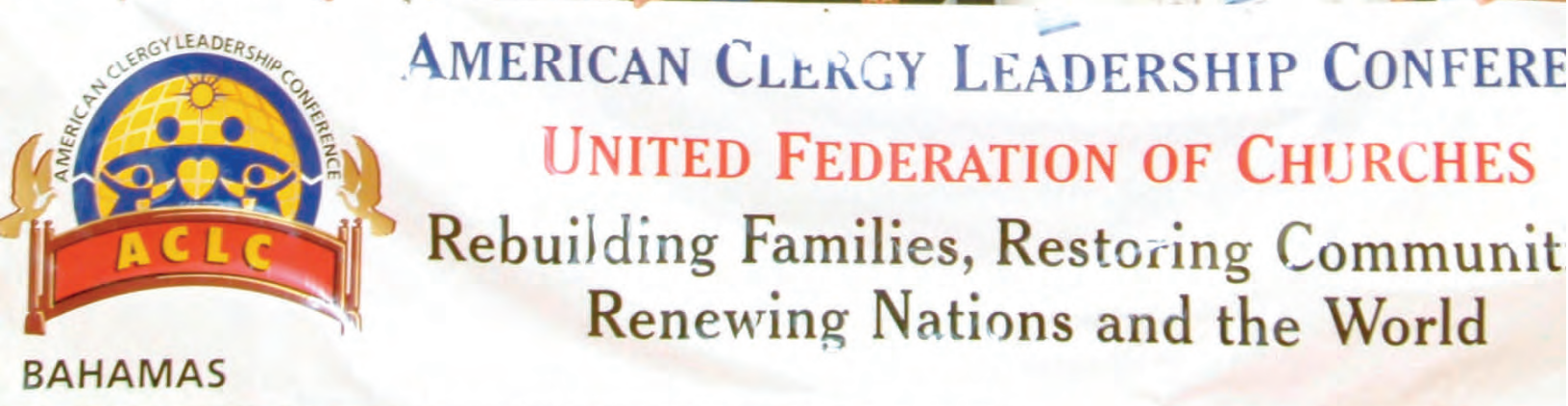
**COMPASSION FAMILY PEACE**
