Family Church of Peace Flag

When there is blessing and peace in families, there will be peace in the nations and the world.



The **Family Church of Peace Flag** is a symbol of the new paradigm, where families will regain their proper position as a Blessed Central Family under the direct guidance of God.

The symbol on the flag represents the reconciliation of the family that was lost in the Garden of Eden. Every church or home that hangs this flag in a picture frame on their wall is making a bold statement that says, "When there is blessing and peace in families, there will be peace in the nations and the world."

The family is the true image and likeness of God.

In the flag's symbol is picture of a turquoise blue world globe. This globe represents water and sky, which is the beginning of God's creation that was prepared for the most precious institution; the family. The family unit is a husband and wife, mother and father, and children. From this sphere, a four position foundation is formed with God in the center.

The family image in the flag is in gold, representing the image and likeness of God. The family is riding on the wings of a peace, which is represented by a white dove surrounded by ivy leaves. The ivy represents reconciliation, harmony,

and healing. The grey color in the flag symbol represents all peoples of the world. The red hue represents life, and the gold color; truth.

The flag says, "Family Church of Peace". The word "church" does not mean a building or institution. The word "church" comes from the Bible meaning which says, "He is coming back for a church without a spot or wrinkle." This means that He is coming back for a people that are God's family, not a building.

The goal is to have this flag hanging in 144,000 homes and churches throughout America.

When each person becomes a Blessed Central Family centering on the love of God, this family becomes a love factory that produces love from the first breath of life to expiration. From factory of love, children of love are produced. When there is true love in the home, peace is drawn to that home. Where there is peace, there is the presence of true love.

From the Back of the Line The Views of A Teenager From the 1960s Civil Rights Movement

Description

From the Back of the Line: The Views of a Teenager From the 1960s Civil Rights Movement chronicles the life of a young African-American girl who moved from a follower to a leader in human rights. Sixteen-year-old Gloria Ward was arrested four times in 1962 for demonstrating against the ills of segregation and racism in her hometown of Albany, Georgia. With her teenage friends and classmates, she marched behind Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Dr. Ralph David Abernathy, Sr., Rev. Charles Sherrod, the Honorable Andrew Young, the late Rev. Samuel Wells and other, older leaders. In a widely circulated newspaper article, Gloria was criticized by a white Albany teenager, Kay Smith, who wasn't shy about expressing her racist opinions. Kay called Gloria "a pawn and a fool" for her involvement in the demonstrations. Kay eventually came to see civil rights in a different light. Although they never met as teenagers, Kay often wondered about Gloria and what had happened to her later in life. Thirty-five years after the newspaper article ran, Kay found Gloria through a mutual friend and apologized for her racist views and statements. Today the two women are close friends. Their story of forgiveness and friendship is just one part of Gloria's remarkable life story as human rights activist, teacher, wife, mother, and pastor. From the Back of the Line describes Dr. Wright's experiences growing up during the civil rights era and moving from the back of the line to leadership positions. She has written this book because she wants young people to know their civil rights history and to understand that they can and should move forward. Her story is told with passion, candor, and light humor. She tells it like it was, how she saw and participated in history From the Back of the Line. The book also contains photographs and an appendix containing quotations from notable civil rights leaders, a summary of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, and recommended reading.
