Thank You! Mother, Please Take Care of Everything!

Moon, moon, bright moon, the moon
with which Lee Tae-baek used to play,
Far away on that moon,
there is a cinnamon tree.

I cut it down with a jade axe
and trimmed it with a gold axe,
To build a small cottage
where I attend my mother and father.
I want to live with them forever;
I want to live with them forever.

While laden with sadness, this traditional Korean song also stirs and uplifts the heart. The wish to live forever with one's mother and father conveys the heart of filial piety. We are utterly bereft orphans, far from our Heavenly Parent whom we have lost, and even if we lose everything, we have to find Heavenly Parent and our original homeland. Nothing leads to greater happiness than being able to attend the beloved parents for whom we long, even if it is not in a splendid palace but just a humble three-room thatched cottage.

Everything and everyone loves the sun. Only with the sun can life flourish. The moon, on the other hand, bestows something else. The sun represents splendor, the moon tranquility. When people are far from home, they tend to think about their hometown and long for their parents while looking at the moon, not at the sun. I have fond memories of gazing at the moon together with my husband. We watched it with many members during the Korean Chuseok harvest festival, and at the first full moon of the new year. Nonetheless, my husband and I could not simply lose ourselves in contemplation as we gazed at the moon.

"After this work is done ...," my husband would always say, and so would I, "After this work is finished and we have a bit of free time, we'll be able to take a break."



We thought that once we had finished the urgent work before us, we might have a little time to rest. But that time never came. Thinking of my grandmother Jo, who a century earlier had cried “Mansei!” for our nation’s independence, I poured out my youth and passion, working throughout my life to save humanity and build a peaceful world.

I have always held high the banner of peace, inheriting the March First Independence Movement’s noble spirit of non-violence and peace. I lived with a constant sense that there was never enough time and accomplished more than anyone could have imagined. I did my utmost in everything entrusted to me, living throughout the years with one heart and one will, solely for the sake of others.

As a result, I never gave my body the rest it needed. Many were the times I neglected to eat or sleep, and even being sick seemed like a luxury I could not afford.

My husband, Rev. Dr. Moon Sun-myung, was born with a strong physique, and had he taken even a little better care of his health, he would have had more time to work for a better world. But he followed Heaven's Will with unflinching devotion, without taking care of himself at all, and this damaged his health ultimately to the point of no return. During the final four or five years before his Seonghwa, he was in continual motion, living each day as if it were a thousand years.

Father Moon constantly traveled between continents, and it was usually between east and west, which takes a much greater toll on the body than traveling between north and south. Considering his age, he should not have traveled such long distances so often. If overseas travel was absolutely necessary, he should have limited such trips to once every two or three years. Yet even in the year before his Seonghwa, when he was well over 90, he traveled between Korea and America more than eight times. He gave no thought to his own health, working solely for God and humankind.

He also often spent entire nights on rough seas for days on end to help church members and young people cultivate patience and the spirit to overcome hardship. During hoondokhae, my husband had so much he wanted to share that it was not uncommon for the hoondokhae sessions to continue for more than ten hours.

Despite other urgent matters, he pushed himself to make a hurried trip to Geomun Island and Yeosu, and eventually caught a cold.

We should have gone to the hospital immediately, but he kept postponing it, saying, "We can go after this is done." By the time he reluctantly went to the hospital for an examination, his health was already very weak. He was hospitalized for a short time during the summer of 2012, but as soon as his medical examinations were finished, he stubbornly insisted on being discharged. We tried to persuade him to stay longer, but he wouldn't listen.

"I still have a lot of work to do; I can't just sit here in the hospital!" he said, scolding the people who advised him to stay. There was no choice but to discharge him. That was August 12, 2012.

When we arrived home, he suddenly said, "I want to have breakfast sitting opposite you, Omma." The members who heard this were quite surprised, because I always sat next to my husband during meals. And then, when the late breakfast was served, my husband seemed uninterested in eating. He just gazed at me as if he were trying to engrave my face in his heart. I smiled, placed a spoon in his hand, and served him some of the side dishes. "These vegetables are delicious, so take your time to eat," I said.

The next day, the sun was unusually strong, even for mid-summer. In the oppressive heat, Father Moon toured Hyojeong Cheonwon, beginning with Cheongpyeong Lake and Cheongshim Middle and High School, accompanied by a huge oxygen tank. Upon his return to Cheon Jeong Gung, he asked for a voice recorder. With the recorder in his hand, he fell into deep thought for about ten minutes, and then little by little, began recording his thoughts.

“I have offered my whole life to Heaven. I have accomplished everything for this. I have completed everything! This is the consummation, completion and conclusion.”

This turned out to be True Father’s final prayer. In it, as he brought his life to a close, he spoke of transcending the history of the Fall, returning to humanity’s original Garden of Eden, and following only True Parents on the way to the kingdom of heaven. He also proclaimed the mission of restoring the nation by guiding one’s tribe. It was a prayer and message that encompassed the alpha and omega, the beginning and the end.

Breathing with some difficulty for a moment, he squeezed my hand tightly. “Mother, thank you! Mother, please take care of everything!” Though he was struggling, he went on to say how sorry and truly grateful he was. I held his hand more firmly and reassured him with warm words and loving eyes. “Don’t worry about anything.”

On September 3, 2012, my husband, Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon, ascended into God’s embrace at the age of 93. He was laid to rest at Bonhyangwon at the foot of Mount Cheonseong. I often slip into deep thought as I gaze at the moon rising above Mount Cheonseong. “I cut it down with a jade axe and trimmed it with a gold axe, to build a small cottage where I attend my mother and father. I want to live with them forever; I want to live with them forever.” I repeat that wish to myself, over and over.

The Value of the Marriage Blessing

I first learned about True Parents in Togo, West Africa, when I was 17 years old. At that time, I began studying the Divine Principle and came to understand True Parents as the ones sent by Heavenly Parent to restore what went wrong in the Garden of Eden between our first ancestors, Adam and Eve. Through that teaching, I learned that God's original ideal was not centered only on individual salvation, but on establishing God-centered families filled with true love, harmony and true peace. True Parents came with the mission of restoring that original ideal and guide humanity back to God's lineage through the Marriage Blessing.

In 1992, I had the privilege of receiving the Marriage Blessing as part of the historic 30,000 Couples Blessing Ceremony officiated by True Parents. It was an extraordinary international Blessing at which couples from many different nations, races, cultures and religious backgrounds came together as one family under God. The atmosphere was filled with hope, joy and a vision for world peace.

Through the Marriage Blessing, True Parents seek to break down the barriers that have divided humanity for centuries and remind us that we are all children of one Heavenly Parent.

The Marriage Blessing is far more than a wedding ceremony. It is a sacred covenant and a lifelong commitment to establish families centered on God's love and to live for the sake of others. True Parents teach that world peace begins within the family. When husbands and wives sincerely love one another and raise their children with God at the center of their lives, peaceful communities and nations can naturally emerge. This vision reflects the very heart of Jesus'

teaching that the greatest commandments are to love God with all our heart, soul and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Through Marriage Blessing education, True Parents have encouraged individuals to pursue purity before marriage and faithfulness within marriage so that families may embody God's original ideal.

Nobody else in history has presented such a comprehensive vision for achieving world peace through the transformation of the family and devoted their lives so completely to realizing it. Although True Parents endured misunderstanding, criticism and persecution, they never ceased investing themselves for the sake of humanity and world peace. Their lives have been marked by an unwavering commitment to reconciliation among races, religions and nations, demonstrated through countless Marriage Blessing

ceremonies and global peace initiatives throughout the world.

True Parents first established the model of God-centered marriage through their own Holy Wedding in 1960. Jesus came 2,000 years ago with the hope of fulfilling the role of True Parent for humanity. However, because the people prepared to receive him could not fully recognize and support his mission, he walked the path of the cross before he could establish a God-centered family. The long history of Christianity culminated in the preparation, for the first time in human history, of the foundation for the advent of True Parents. On that foundation, True Father and True Mother, Holy Mother Han, fulfilled the position of True Parents and opened the way for all people to receive the Marriage Blessing.

My own family stands as a testimony to the value and beauty of the Marriage Blessing. My wife is from Japan, while I am originally from Togo, West Africa. Through the Marriage Blessing, we were able to establish a loving family rooted in faith and true love. We have been blessed with five wonderful children whom we cherish deeply and who are thriving in their lives. Among them, two have already received the Marriage Blessing themselves, continuing the beautiful tradition established by True Parents. This is the enduring value of the Blessing: to create families connected to God's lineage, where future generations inherit a tradition of loving God and loving one another beyond every boundary of culture or nationality.

Recently, during a pilgrimage to Japan with pastors from the American Clergy Leadership Conference, many clergy members were deeply moved by the testimonies and hearts of young Pure Waters from both America and Japan. Having been raised according to the teachings and traditions of True Parents, these young people demonstrated remarkable sincerity, purity, humility and devotion. The pastors were especially inspired by the pride these young people took in their identity as sons and daughters of blessed families and by the genuine love and respect they expressed toward their parents, their faith and True Parents. Their lives reflect the fruits of the Marriage Blessing and serve as a living testimony to the lifelong investment that True Parents have made for the sake of future generations and the realization of God's dream for humanity.

Today, our world continues to face division, conflict, broken families and moral confusion. In the midst of these challenges, the vision of True Parents offers both hope and a practical path forward. The more families that participate in the Marriage Blessing and strive to live according to God's ideal of true love, the closer humanity will come to achieving lasting peace. True peace does not begin from within political systems or institutions; it begins within the family. Blessed families who live for the sake of God and others have the power to transform communities, nations and ultimately the world into one global family under God.

“As Drops of Water Flow Together to Form a River” ... Pure Waters from Around the World Gather in Korea



In the summer of 2026, Pure Water youth from around the world are gathering in Korea. Now in its second year, Pure Water Assembly 2026 (PWA) is an international workshop where members of the rising generation from around the world live together and experience what it means to be one family under Heavenly Parent. True Peace Magazine spoke with Park Jong-eun, who is responsible for managing the workshop, about her memories of last year's assembly, what will be new this year, and the message she would like to share with Pure Waters around the world.

Q. Hello. Could you begin by briefly introducing yourself and telling us about your role in Pure Water Assembly 2026?

A. Hello. I'm Park Jong-eun from the Human Resources Development Institute, and I'm serving as the operations team leader for Pure Water Assembly 2026. Together with our staff, I am involved in everything from planning the programs to managing all the on-site implementation and arranging for the participants' daily needs. We want this workshop to be a truly meaningful experience for Pure Water youth from around the world.

Q. This is the second PWA. For those hearing about it for the first time, could you briefly tell us what kind of workshop it is?

A. Pure Water Assembly is a global youth workshop where Pure Water youth from around the world gather in Korea to learn and live together, share their hearts with one another and grow together. It is much more than listening to lectures and taking part in programs. I see it as an opportunity for young people who have grown up in different countries and have different languages and cultures to experience for themselves that we truly are one family under Heavenly Parent and True Parents.

Q. What is the main theme of this year's PWA? And what led you to choose this theme?

A. The central goal of this year's PWA is to grow as true children of Cheon Il Guk who are one with True Parents.

True Mother spoke about the Pure Waters of the second and third generations around the world, saying, "Just as drops of water join together to form a river and flow out to the sea, through the Pure Waters of the second and third generations spread throughout the world, our future will shine brightly."

Each of us may feel like just a small drop of water, but I believe that when we come together centered on True Parents, sharing one heart and one vision, we can form a river and flow out into the wider sea.

Through this workshop, I hope we can experience that we are one family beyond differences of nationality and language. I also hope that the Pure Waters from around the world can share their joys and concerns, their faith and dreams, and experience for themselves what it means to be one community with a shared culture of heart.

Q. Last year was the first PWA. Looking back, what stands out most in your memory? Are there any comments or stories from participants that have stayed with you?

A. As we prepared for the first PWA last year, we felt a great deal of excitement, but at the same time, we were nervous.

Once the workshop began, I saw Pure Waters from around the world singing praise songs together and, even when they couldn't communicate in the same language, doing their best to connect through their eyes and communicate heart to heart. Watching them naturally become one family made me realize what this workshop truly meant.

I especially remember participants telling us, "I realized that I have so many brothers and sisters around the world, and I came away knowing that I am not alone."

After the workshop, some returned to their countries and became devoted volunteers, while others found jobs

and took responsibility in their respective fields, living lives that testify to True Parents. Whenever I hear how they are doing, I'm reminded that PWA is more than a one-time event. It can change someone's heart and life and give them a new beginning.

Q. I imagine there were some programs that last year's participants particularly enjoyed. Could you tell us about some of the activities that were especially popular or memorable?

A. Many Pure Waters have told us that one of their most memorable experiences was the three days they spent in Yongpyong.

They lived together in nature and took part in a variety of programs. They worked hard together, laughed together and prayed for one another, and I think it was a time when they naturally grew closer in heart.

We're planning another stay in Yongpyong this year, but we're preparing something a little different from last year.

Q. What will be the biggest difference this year compared with last year? What changes will returning participants notice?

A. This year will be different right from the start. The first three days of the schedule, including the opening ceremony, will be held primarily at Cheon Won Gung.

One of the biggest differences from last year is that we'll be able to spend more time at Cheon Won Gung. It

is such a special place, built with so much jeongseong and filled with providential significance.

We're also planning ways to help PWA participants from around the world connect more closely with the Inheritors of Heaven's Love and Blessing and build deeper relationships with them.

Q. Now I'm even more curious about what these 14 days at PWA will be like. I'm sure there are some things you can't reveal yet, but can you give us a little preview of what you have planned?

A. The entire workshop has been designed as one interconnected journey. Each program leads toward greater unity with Heavenly Parent and True Parents, stronger relationships with our brothers and sisters around the world, and a renewed determination as we look to the future.

We're also planning a special session where participants can hear firsthand about the lives of young people from other parts of the world.

I hope that hearing how other young people their age are taking on the challenges of life and fulfilling their responsibilities will help each of the participants discover their own potential and mission.

Toward the end of the workshop, we'll also have a vision session where participants can reflect on the grace and insights they have received over the 14 days and make concrete plans and resolutions about the values and goals they want to live by when they return home.

I would like to tell you more, but I think I'll keep the rest

of the program a secret so that participants can discover it for themselves when they get here.

Q. I imagine there are many staff members working behind the scenes to make this a great workshop. How are preparations for PWA going?

A. Our Human Resources Development Institute is working closely with many staff members from other departments at the world headquarters, as well as with various other organizations and outside professionals, to prepare for the workshop.

We're carefully checking every aspect of the participants' stay, including accommodations, meals, medical support, interpretation and transportation, as well as everything that has to happen for the programs themselves to run smoothly and successfully.

Thanks to the hard work and devotion of so many people, preparations are going very well.

Q. Finally, what would you like to say to the Pure Waters around the world who are looking forward to this year's PWA?

A. I think it takes a lot of courage to take that first step

into a new and unfamiliar environment.

Some of you may be nervous about being in a new place with new people, new cultures and unfamiliar languages, but you really don't need to worry.

There are many older brothers and sisters here who are eagerly waiting to meet you and are ready to take good care of you. More than anything, Heavenly Parent is waiting to embrace and love each and every one of you.

I hope you will come to the Assembly, jump in, take on new challenges and receive an abundance of love. I also hope you will actively share the love and joy you receive here with your Pure Water brothers and sisters who were not able to join us this time.

We will continue investing our whole hearts in the preparations until the very last moment so that you can have a safe and happy experience here.

Pure Water Assembly 2026, alive with the passion and faith-filled determination of Pure Water youth from around the world, will continue through August 26.

Just as drops of water come together to form a river, we look forward to the bright future these Pure Waters will create as they move out into the world with hearts united.

An Interview with Park In-gyeong, Director of Exhibitions and Collections, Central Administrative Council

“Cheon Jeong Gung and My Promise Before Heaven”

A Commemorative Ceremony Marking the 20th Anniversary of the Cheon Jeong Gung Entrance and Coronation Ceremony of the True Parents as the King and Queen of Peace in Heaven and on Earth, was held on July 29, 2026, with members of True Family and staff members from providential organizations in attendance.

The ceremony offered a meaningful opportunity to look back on the course of Heaven's providence and honor True Parents' noble achievements. An awards ceremony was also held to recognize long-serving staff members who have devoted themselves faithfully to their responsibilities over many years.

True Peace Magazine is featuring the stories of some of the long-serving staff members whose years of service have unfolded alongside the history of Cheon Jeong Gung. Having served on the Cheon Jeong Gung staff for more than 20 years, beginning during its construction and continuing to the present day, he shares what it has meant to him to attend True Parents. —Editor's note



A Path That Began with a Promise Before Heaven

Q. Please introduce yourself.

A. I am Park In-gyeong, and I work at the Central Administrative Council as the director of exhibitions and collections. My main responsibility is to collect and organize records and artifacts related to True Parents' lives, as well as materials related to events, especially those held at Cheon Jeong Gung. I'm also responsible for planning and managing exhibitions at Cheon Jeong Gung.

Q. Could you also tell us a little about your family?

A. I received the Marriage Blessing in 1992 as part of the 200 Couples Second Generation Blessing, and we have two daughters. Our older daughter has also received the Blessing, and we already have two grandchildren. Our younger daughter is in her final year of university and is in the process of looking for a match so she can attend the Blessing.

My parents received the Blessing as part of the 430

Couples, and both of them spent their lives attending True Parents directly. Perhaps I have inherited that responsibility from them, and that is how I ended up working at Cheon Jeong Gung.

Q. When you first came to Cheon Jeong Gung, did you expect that you would be working here for so many years?

A. Not at all. But I did come here determined to fulfill my responsibilities to the very end.

Actually, when I first came here, it wasn't because I had made up my mind that I wanted to work at Cheon Jeong Gung. Looking back, I remember True Father asking me when I was in second grade, "What do you want to be when you grow up?"

I answered, "My parents have attended True Parents, so I will attend Hyo-jin nim." Looking back, I feel my answer somehow became a promise that I made to Heaven.

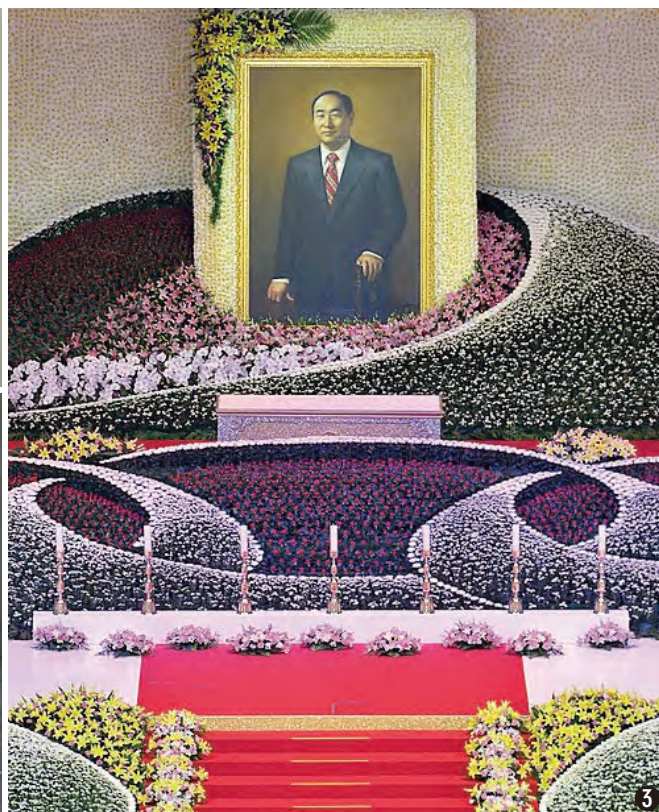
Reflecting on the course of my life, I believe Heaven created the circumstances that enabled me to come here and called me to this position.

So rather than expecting that I would be here for such a long time, I have continued working here with the determination not to forget my promise to Heaven.

Q. Do you remember what Cheon Jeong Gung was like on your first day of work or during those early days?

A. I officially began working here in 2004, so that was 22 years ago. It was around the time construction of Cheon Jeong Gung was just getting started.

They were still finishing up the foundation, so the whole place was a chaotic construction site. It was all mud, and I remember walking around the site every day to check on the progress, right up until the Entrance and Coronation Ceremony.

So rather than remembering the beautiful Cheon Jeong Gung we know today, what first comes to mind is the busy, constantly evolving construction site that it was back then.

Q. You have spent so many days at Cheon Jeong Gung. If you had to choose the one day that stands out most in your memory, what would it be?

A. The day I remember most would have to be the day of True Father's Cheonju Seonghwa. You could say that

from the very beginning, as we were preparing Cheon Jeong Gung itself, we were also preparing for the Cheonju Seonghwa.

From the outset, our approach at Cheon Jeong Gung was not to wait until something happened and then respond, but to anticipate what might happen in the future and prepare for it in advance. One thing we absolutely had to think about was being prepared for all the arrangements and observances surrounding True Parents' Seonghwas, so we gave a great deal of thought to how we could attend them properly when that time came.

Because True Father's Cheonju Seonghwa came after all those years of preparation, that day is deeply significant to me personally as well as historically.

I even decided to become qualified as an official funeral director, so that I could personally attend True Father at the time of his Cheonju Seonghwa. There were a number of places where I could obtain that qualification, but because I felt that we had to attend True Father according to the very highest standards, I chose a program operated directly by a university.

There was one such program in Busan and another in Wonju. Busan was too far away, so I studied in Wonju for a year to prepare.

I was grateful that the preparations I made enabled me

to attend True Father directly at such an important historic moment, even though I still felt I could never do enough. That is why the day remains so memorable to me.

Holding Fast to True Father's Final Request

Q. There must have been difficult times over the years. Did you ever think about doing something else?

A. I would be lying if I said there weren't difficult times, but I never thought about doing anything else. I was determined that, no matter what, I would fulfill my responsibilities at Cheon Jeong Gung as long as I was asked.

One reason I was able to maintain that determination goes back to 2012, just a month or two before True Father's Seonghwa. After a hoondokhae session, I met

True Father in the hallway outside the hoondokhae room on the third floor of Cheon Jeong Gung. He stopped me there and spoke to me for about 30 minutes.

He told me, "A hundred years from now, a thousand years from now, our descendants will not be able to see True Parents or have any direct experience with us. The museum will be the only way for future generations to know what True Parents were like during this time. You are responsible for the museum, so you must fulfill that mission." He also told me, "When True Mother is here on her own in the future, make sure you attend her well and that she lacks nothing."

I felt that this was True Father's final request to me personally. I have held on to those words ever since, and they have helped me endure many difficult times along the way.

Q. When have you found this work especially rewarding and thought, “I’m really glad I chose to do this”?

A. Every moment has been rewarding and something to be grateful for, while at the same time there have been many difficult moments. Still, I think what has meant the most to me was being able to remain at True Father’s side during the final 13 days before he went to Heaven.

Among the many exhibitions I have worked on over the years, one that particularly stands out was an exhibition of True Father’s calligraphy held to commemorate his Seonghwa.

I had the opportunity to guide True Mother and some of the True Children through that exhibition and explain it to them. As I explained the meaning of the characters in each inscription and True Father’s intentions behind each piece in the exhibit, True Mother listened very intently. She then told me, “Don’t keep all of this knowledge to yourself. Make sure you share it widely with our members.” At that moment, I thought, “I’m finally becoming an expert whose work True Parents recognize.”

To me, her words affirmed the value of the work I had done over the years, and I was deeply grateful. It remains one of the most rewarding moments of my life.

Cheon Jeong Gung and the Commitment Shared by My Family

Q. What does Cheon Jeong Gung mean to you personally?

A. As I mentioned earlier, my being at Cheon Jeong Gung represents a promise. It represents my ongoing commitment to Heaven, and now also my determination to carry out the request True Father gave me in 2012.

That is why I feel I cannot walk away from this responsibility, no matter what difficulties I may face. I sometimes joke, perhaps a little bluntly, “Whatever happens, I just hope I don’t get fired.” But behind that joke is my sincere desire not to break the promise I made to Heaven.

I want to keep offering my filial devotion to Heaven until the last possible moment. That is why, to me, Cheon Jeong Gung is a place that represents a promise.

Q. What would you like to say to your family, who have stood by you all these years?

More than anything, I feel sorry for what I have put my family through. The reason I have been able to remain in this position is that they made sacrifices and patiently endured so much.

For example, in the early days there were many times when something urgent would come up at Cheon Jeong



Gung. I always had to sleep with my cell phone right beside my ear, and if I was summoned by True Father at 3:00 in the morning and told, “Prepare for a new calligraphic inscription,” I had to jump up, rush in and get everything ready.

I remember one particular time when I had my bag packed and ready for a family vacation, and we were planning to leave as soon as we woke up. What happened instead was that in the morning, I picked up that same bag and went straight to Cheon Jeong Gung, where I ended up staying and working for the entire week. I heard later that my young daughter had quietly wiped away her tears in a corner of the room.

In that sense, this life of attendance has not been mine alone. My entire family has walked this path with me. I feel deeply sorry toward them, and deeply grateful as well. I know there will be times like this again in the future, so I hope they will continue to be patient with me and stand by me.

Q. Finally, is there anything you would like to say to True Parents?

A. I think the most I could possibly say to True Parents is, “Thank you.”

Even though they have always known my shortcomings, they have kept me close, believed in me and entrusted me with this position all these years. What more could I possibly ask?

So the very most I can offer is, “Thank you.” That is really all I can say.

Many years from now, when the time comes for me to meet True Parents again in the spirit world, I hope I will be in a position to attend them there just as I have been attending them at Cheon Jeong Gung. Until then, I will continue living with a heart of gratitude. ㄹ

Church President Song Yong-cheon's Nationwide Great Epic Speaking Tour

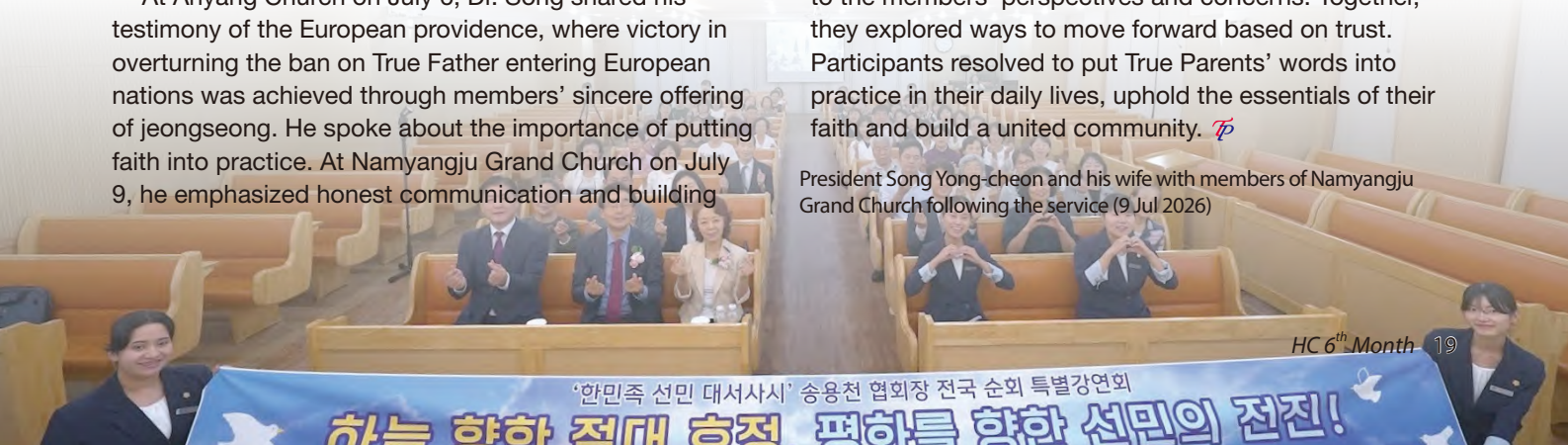

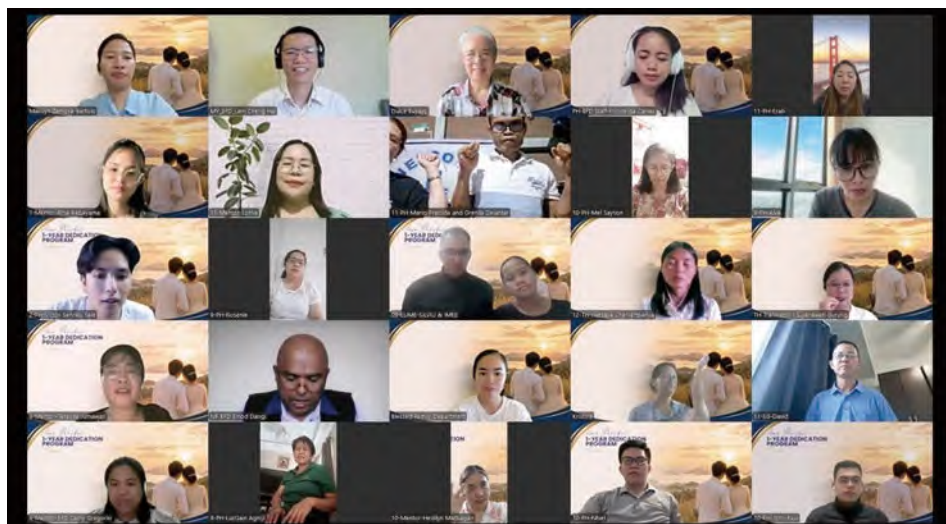
