As we look back on the first six months of 2021, we are grateful to God that our community is doing well despite the many challenges that our nation faces. We have continued to worship our Heavenly Parent and to love and to serve each other, and we continue to support our wider European and Middle East region by providing training, education and resources. At the same time, we painfully acknowledge that we have lost several loved and valued members of our holy community to Covid-19 and related illnesses. Our hearts and prayers go out to all the affected families and so many others.

Just before the publication of this report, government guidance has changed again and we have had to postpone our much-anticipated Annual Gathering. Some of our communities have resumed in-person Sunday worship services, but our pastors report that it has been a bit of a struggle to

encourage people to venture out once again. Fortunately, we are getting more and more experienced with Zoom and similar technologies, and for some of our programs – education in particular – we are now reaching many times more people than we ever did before.

Online technology has also brought us closer to our international community, and in particular with the initiatives being led by our co-founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, the Mother of Peace. For example, we've participated in six online rallies of hope which have featured many prominent British and European speakers including scholars, scientists, current and former heads of state and government, and spiritual leaders. Our founder's autobiography, *Mother of Peace*, has now been translated into over 20 European languages and is being sold on Amazon as well as our own bookstores.

The Universal Peace Federation and the Women's Federation for World Peace, which receive some funding from FFWPU, have both made significant progress.

Each of our communities have prepared a brief update on their activities, and there are reports from the Education, Blessing, Chaplaincy, Communications and Youth Outreach teams. Finally there is an interim financial report showing a generally healthy financial situation. Although the pandemic has reduced income from the Lancaster Gate rentals, other sources have remained steady and we have cut costs so as to maintain our current level of reserves.

Once again, we would like to thank our Trustees, our staff and volunteers, and all those who have combined efforts together to keep us moving forward as "God's Winning Team!"

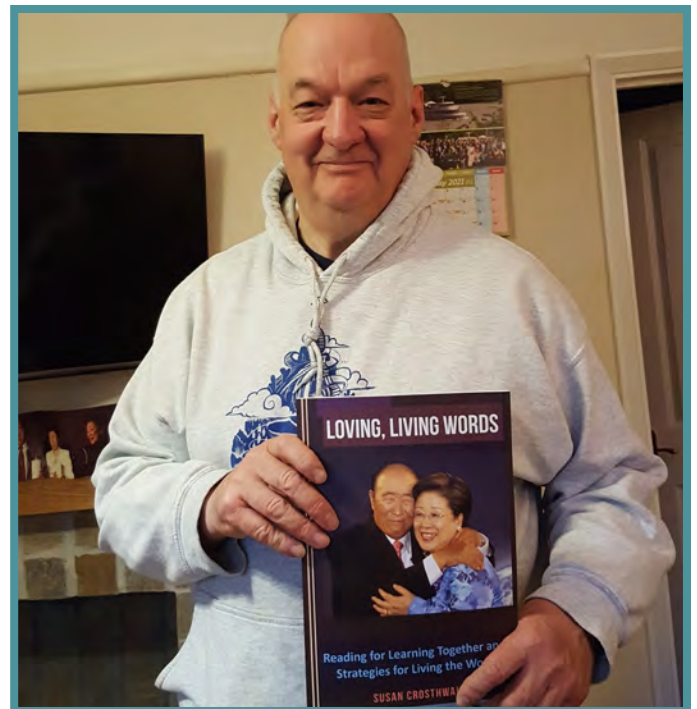


## BLESSED FAMILY DEPARTMENT *by Jeff Bateman*



It has been a busy 6 months. I have been making the most of the current situation by organising or participating in online workshops and webinars. Each one has been attended by 100s of people from around the world. This has enabled the educational activities of the charity to extend beyond the UK to reach people in Africa, Russia and the Middle East. Because the programs have been delivered through Zoom it has meant they could all be easily recorded and then uploaded onto the FFWPU YouTube site where they can be accessed by others. The plan is to use this

raw material to create structured educational programs that can be used by individuals and groups. As well as providing education it will also hopefully foster the development of online and offline communities focussed on the study of God's Word. The lectures are also being transcribed by a group of volunteers and will be published in some format yet to be decided.

As these lecture series are all new a lot of time has been invested in their development.

# BRITISH CLERGY LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE *by June Darby*

## ACTIVITIES

From the beginning of January 2021 we began a weekly cycle of teaching Divine Principle by zoom that was given by Rev Dr David Hanna, with 14 Divine Principle lectures and 4 presentations on the lives and impact of Rev and Mrs Moon. He was also ably assisted by Rev Isaac Ayani who shared the presentation of the last 4 lectures. We averaged 88 participants each time with many coming from around Europe. We averaged 20 Pastors each time, with 72 Pastors in all participating in the whole series. We have an excellent support team who organised the links and programmes each time. Rev Tom Pritty, Robert



and Oksana Torok and Rev Daniel Fenuga. We received many favourable comments about the content and value of the lectures. I also want to appreciate our BCLC Committee for their faithful support and outreach activities: John and Rita O'Neill, Anne Kobayashi, Naomi Gyoten, Sobayo Sobambi, Mulumba Kabongo, and Russell Gough. At present we are following up the Pastors who joined our programme and have sent an Evaluation Form out to glean more specifically their responses. We have also been visiting Pastors and making new contacts, as well as clarifying our plans for the rest of the Year.

On 31<sup>st</sup> March we had a joint webinar with the American Clergy Leadership Conference on the Topic of The Responsibility of Christianity in Building a Unified Global Community. It was very dynamic and inspiring. On 12<sup>th</sup> April we supported the Nordic Rally of Hope that made a contribution towards a world of Interdepen-

dence and Mutual Prosperity with speeches by major Christian leaders. A number of our Pastors also were inspired by the Highlighted versions of the different Rallies of Hope that were sponsored by Mother Moon in Korea this year, as well as the powerful Blessing Festival that she hosted in Las Vegas on 5<sup>th</sup> June.



Unfortunately because of Lockdown we were not able to carry out any Community Service projects. But BCLC members also joined the different events Pastors organised, supporting their different programmes. John O'Neill sends out a Morality Forum Update Newsletter 4 times a year to 2,220 contacts supporting tradition, moral, family and spiritual values, and challenging negative, secular attitudes like abortion-on-demand, the content of school sex education, quickie divorce laws etc. I feel optimistic about our future in the light of all the powerful developments that Mother Moon has accomplished in the past year. And I am confident that we will see new growth as we experience the loving Holy Spirit moving ever more strongly.



# CHAPLAINCY PROGRAM

We started off the year with a chaplain meeting on the 8<sup>th</sup> of January led by Patrick and Yebuny Hanna. This was a ninety-minute zoom call where all of our chaplain volunteers could gather, catch up, hear some updates on the program, plans for the rest of 2021 and receive some helpful input. Yebuny prepared content and discussions on growing our capacity as mentors. We received feedback from the group that this was a great chance to reflect and learn.

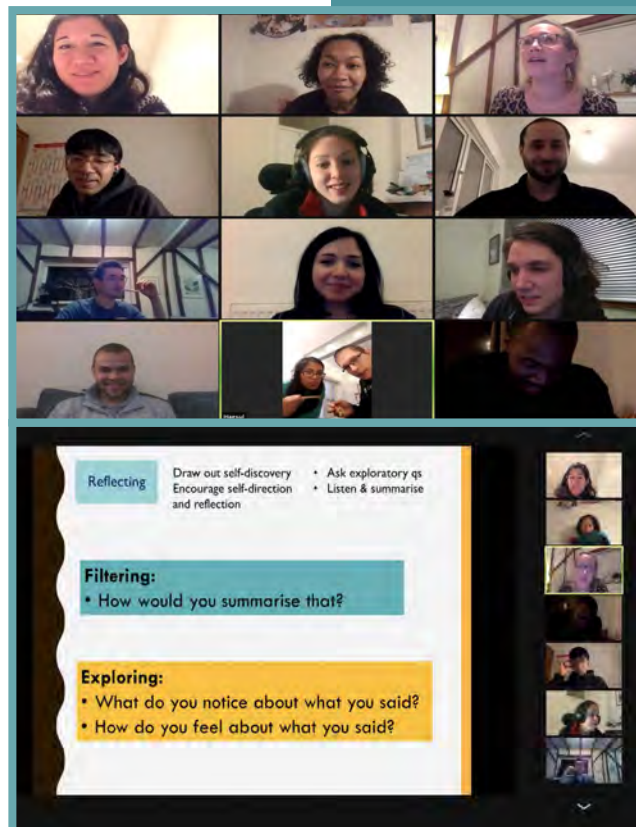
In January and February, our core team made some effort to personally invite more young adults to sign up for the program, had a few planning meetings amongst ourselves and introduced a couple of new chaplains to the group. Otherwise, this time was focused on fundraising within the community to increase our budget, which was communicated to us by HQ to have been non-existent.

We did manage to secure some financial support beyond HQ and were later told we did have a budget after all. This was a disappointing communication error from HQ and unfortunately overshadowed our start to 2021.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> of June, we held another chaplain meeting to wrap up the academic year. During this zoom call, we shared in smaller groups about what we could learn from our efforts to mentor and had a larger sharing about our general experience being involved in the program and what would be good for the next academic year. Despite facing several challenges throughout the year, this meeting was hopeful.

Throughout the six months, chaplains were calling regularly with their paired mentees - from once a semester to weekly! - as appropriate for the individual's circumstances and needs. The program is great in that it is flexible like that. More recently, some chaplains have met with their mentee in person too.

Additionally, Patrick and Yebuny offered opt-in chaplain support for our volunteer group, and everyone involved was encouraged to take the time to reach out to other young adults beyond the program as well.

### International Women's Day 2021

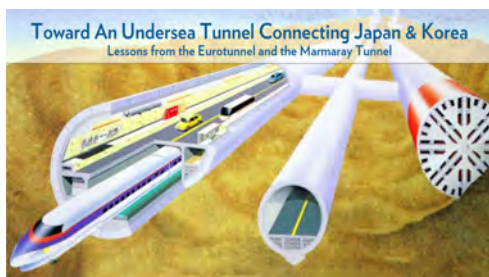

### UN International Day of Families 2021

In their annual celebration of UN International Day of Families, Universal Peace Federation UK hosted a panel on parenting and child development on Saturday, 15<sup>th</sup> May. On this occasion, the panel, Dr Carole Ulanowsky, Frederick Clarke, Dr Nicola Bailey and Teuta Avdyli, are all authoritative speakers who presented their insight into the essential role parents play in society, raising children and very significant early child development.

The Universal Peace Federation's co-founders, Father and Mother Moon, promote the family as a school of love. For this reason many UPF branches around the world commemorate this day each year.



### Toward An Undersea Tunnel Connecting Japan and Korea: Lessons from the Eurotunnel and the Marmaray Tunnel

A significant vision for the establishment of an International Highway Project and a potential North East Asia Economic Region supported by a tunnel between Japan and Korea was presented by UPF's International Association for Peace and Economic Development on April 26<sup>th</sup>. The programme was moderated by Robin Marsh, Secretary-General, UPF - UK with 'Welcoming Remarks' given by Mr. Masayoshi Kajikuri, Chairman, International Highway Project, UPF Japan. Prof. Yoshimitsu Nishikawa, Toyo University presented a Japanese perspective of the proposed Japan - Korea tunnel while Ms. Gözde Dizdar Vice President, Centrist Asia Pacific Democrats International explained the experience of Turkey's Marmaray Tunnel. Prof. Rodger Vickerman, Emeritus Professor, School of Economics, University of Kent and Visiting Professor and Chair, Transport Strategy Centre, Department of Environmental and Civil Engineering, Imperial College London outlined the challenges and the development of the Channel Tunnel before Jacques Marion, Co-Chairman of Europe and the Middle East UPF, gave the concluding remarks.

## Toward the Peaceful Reunification of the Korean Peninsula

UPF - UK supported a series of webinars between April 26<sup>th</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup> that both considered the prospects for the peaceful reunification of the Korean peninsula and prepared for the international launch of 'Think Tank 2022' that aims to coordinate a multi-sectoral effort to explore how the peaceful reunification of the Korea peninsula may be achieved. We have invited a number of UK figures with Korean peninsula issues expertise to join this effort under the Chairmanship of former United Nations Secretary General, Ban Ki Moon. During the Opening Session Reverend Cannon Ann Easter, former Chaplain to HRH Queen Elizabeth II gave an invocation.



## The Role of the Media in contributing to Peace on the Korean Peninsula

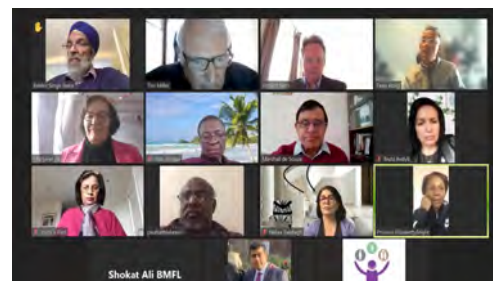


## Role of Parliamentarians in Contributing to Peace on the Korean Peninsula

An event convened by Universal Peace Federation Europe and the Middle East's International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace on April 29<sup>th</sup> 2021 featured speeches by Hon. Gadzhimurad Omarov, Deputy of the State Duma, Russian Federation and Hon. Piero Fassino, Member of the Chamber of Deputies; President, Foreign Affairs Committee of Italy. UPF - United Kingdom invited the Hon. Keith Best, former MP and Chair of UPF - UK Board of Trustees and Baroness Sandip Verma, a Member of the UK's House of Lords who both provided their insights on the topic.

## Youth For Peace and Development (YPAD) Introduction

Presented to an audience including several East London Councillors on the 18<sup>th</sup> of May to help them understand the vision of the project. We want Councils in this area to identify possible projects. One of a series of small planning meetings the YPAD has been holding to promote a project in the Spring of 2022. A pilot project is likely in Wales this Summer. A project in Birmingham is being prepared for the time of the Commonwealth Games in the city. A video has been made by Peter Kong to promote the project for young adults, 18 to 30 years old.



## Sunhak Peace Prize: Explaining the Vision and Record

# WOMEN'S FEDERATION FOR WORLD PEACE *by Mitty Tohma*

On Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2021, the Awards Ceremony of the first Artist For Peace Contest, an art competition for young people from ages 5 – 16 was held, sponsored by Women's Federation for World Peace. The young people were asked to submit a painting on the theme of "Paint our Way to Peace", to encourage them to think about and express through art what peace means to them, even at this time of great difficulty due to the worldwide pandemic.

The event was held online due to the coronavirus restrictions. The 9 winners were announced, 3 from each age group. The winners were – Nina Pritchard, Robert Milla, Nicholas Cuthill, Malachy, Kadajah, Imran Nasser, Ahana Murthy, Somal Gopisetti. It was a joyful, memorable event where families from the countries could participate in their children's offerings about what peace means to them.

In observance of the International Day of Women, WFWP UK co-hosted with Mrs Rosjke Hasseldine,

founder of Mother-Daughter Coaching International LLC, an online seminar. The event was attended by 60 guests and followed by over 1500 on facebook. Rosjke chaired the session, she introduced the programme, speaking briefly about her work addressing the dynamics in the mother – daughter relationship and facilitating the process healing and reconciling. Four speakers from diverse backgrounds, shared their presentations emphasising the daughter-mother relationship, reminding us that we are all the daughter of a mother. Loneliness, self-loathing, and despair are experienced by many women. We bury our natural God-given treasures: empathy, intuition, embracing, nurturing, including, forgiving, understanding, communicating, connecting to name only a few are some of the precious attributes of women's abilities. They all stressed the importance of the need to realize the value of the 3 generational relationships of daughter, mother, and grandmother. With support and hopefully a role model we can all live our dream.





On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> May WFWP UK hosted a webinar to commemorate the UN Day of Families - "Women, Faith and Families", with 6 dynamic lady speakers representing various faith traditions. Over 70 participants, the Intl Day of Families was established as essential for supporting the UN sustainable development goals, the co-founders of WFWP, Rev Sun Myung Moon and Dr Hak Ja Han Moon, who see the family as a sacred institution. We had representatives from the Hindu, Muslim, Jewish, Christian, Sikh and Unificationist. All faiths are connected with the one God. Families are a way to nourish, love and care for each other. Women give birth, so we should be an example of those qualities. Women's role is to be the embodiment of love and care. This was the core ethos, shared by all the faith representatives

The Leadership of the Heart (LOH) curriculum is a 3-part seminar newly launched by the Women's Federation for World Peace UK on 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> June 2021. This is an

educational and interactive programme created by WFWP USA, designed with the aim to bring out the powerful leader that is within each person, offering tools to make peace a reality within each person's lives, families, communities, nations and the world. WFWP believes that 'peace starts with me' - how can I make positive change in this world? The answer lies within myself, in my family and my neighbourhood. The programme was spread over two evenings with 40 women from all parts of the UK and some from USA, Sweden and Africa. The programme kickstarted with a talk on the Main Introduction of the LOH, followed by a deeply moving talk on Spirituality. On the second day We shared about the Self-worth and concluded by an emotionally charged delivery of Emotional Maturity. The two day education seminar was deeply captivating and appreciated by all the participants. We plan to hold another seminar in December.

We introduced Brother/Sisters evenings monthly, for the purpose of creating a consistent fellowship between the HARP members. This was mostly relaxed events with lots of games, quizzes, movies as well as starting usually with either a passage of HDH or inspirational video to discuss in group.

Sandwich sessions is another event which we had for a few months, took 3 months break and is now coming back in July. The purpose of the event is to "make big topics digestible" a 1-1.15 hour event that consists of a speaker, discussion groups and questions and answers to finish off. We wanted to take some time to rejuvenate the event for July as we felt the purpose starting to slip, it will also now be an event that happens once every 2 months rather than once a month.

We also of course had our Easter workshop which revolved around the theme of "the 4 great realms of heart" as well as parallels of history and parallels in daily life. We had an array of experienced lecturers and many testimonies

from young adults, the general feedback from the participants was that it was well received.

We are also currently working on the ilshim project - aiming to be finished in October.

## Pastor's Report

## Community Building Project Fund

This award is designed to bring together and celebrate community. We actively encourage applicants to build sustainable projects, access other funding and build partnerships and ongoing development opportunities for both the project team and the community. Each awardee is asked to complete a monitoring and evaluation form during the period of the award and up to 6 months after the end of the project. This will help us understand how these awards have helped to support the successful applicants - both financially and through the support services being offered.

So far this year we have supported two projects:

### 1. "A Black Experience"

This project will be a look into the experiences of people of colour in the church and will pose the question as to whether this church has made an environment that reflects its aim of including/embracing different cultures.

### 2. "Paint our Way to Peace"

The purpose of this project is to foster the hope of peace, wellbeing, and confidence among the nation's youth through cultivating their talents in the field of visual arts.

## Peace Festivals

We have held several live events at Lancaster Gate within current health and safety regulations. This included hosting the first National Service. On occasions we have teamed up with other communities to hold joint services, in particular with Wales & West Country.

### Seong Hwa Ceremony for Dominic Hoyte

Our dear brother, Dominic, ascended on 4<sup>th</sup> February at the tragically young age of 32. Prayer vigils were organised and his family received support leading up to the seong hwa ceremony on 17<sup>th</sup> March.

### Cheon Bo Victor Couples

Eddie and Patricia Hartley completed the qualifications to become registered as Cheon Bo victors, having blessed 430 generations of their ancestors and having blessed 430 couples. They submitted their successful registration in March.

### Weekly Worship Services

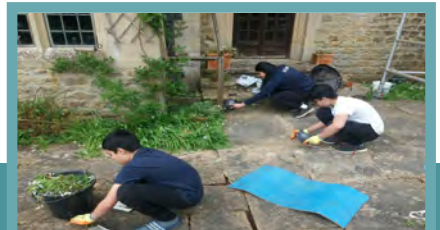

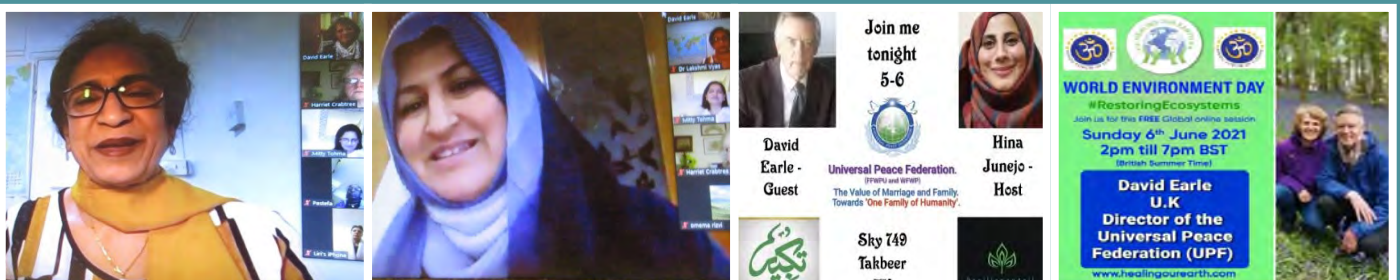
### 02. International Women's Day Event. Friday March 19<sup>th</sup>.

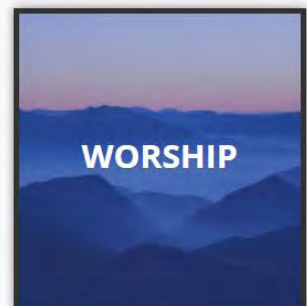
As part of my communications and PR work, I regularly work on updating/managing the new community website. As the site is still relatively new, there is a great

# PEACE ROAD UK 2021



READY FOR A CHALLENGE?  
HADRIAN'S WALL COAST TO COAST  
WALK FOR NATIONAL UNITY

We invite you to join us for Peace Road UK 2021, July 31 – August 7th 2021. This will be an inspiring and challenging coast-to-coast walking tour from Bowness on Solway in the West to Tynemouth in the East, a total distance of about 90 miles. Most of the time we will be following the course of Hadrian's Wall, 1900 years old next year! On average, there are about 12 miles of walking each day, taking between 4 - 7 hours depending on the terrain. There's also time to visit some museums, Roman remains, and take in lots and lots of fresh air. There will be exciting UPF Peace Road programmes at the beginning in Carlisle and again at the end in Newcastle. It's going to be great!

1900 years ago, in 122 AD the Roman Emperor Hadrian built the wall to defend the Roman territory from the fierce inhabitants of the North. It functioned well for almost three centuries before falling into disuse and over the centuries many of the stones were taken away and used for other buildings.

In 2021 there are renewed tensions in Britain with calls for independence and separation. The Peace Road UK walk along this ancient barrier is a statement in support of unity and cohesion, whilst recognizing that there is always room for change. A second purpose is to draw attention to a national campaign to persuade the UK Government to reinstate the committed 0.7% of GDP –

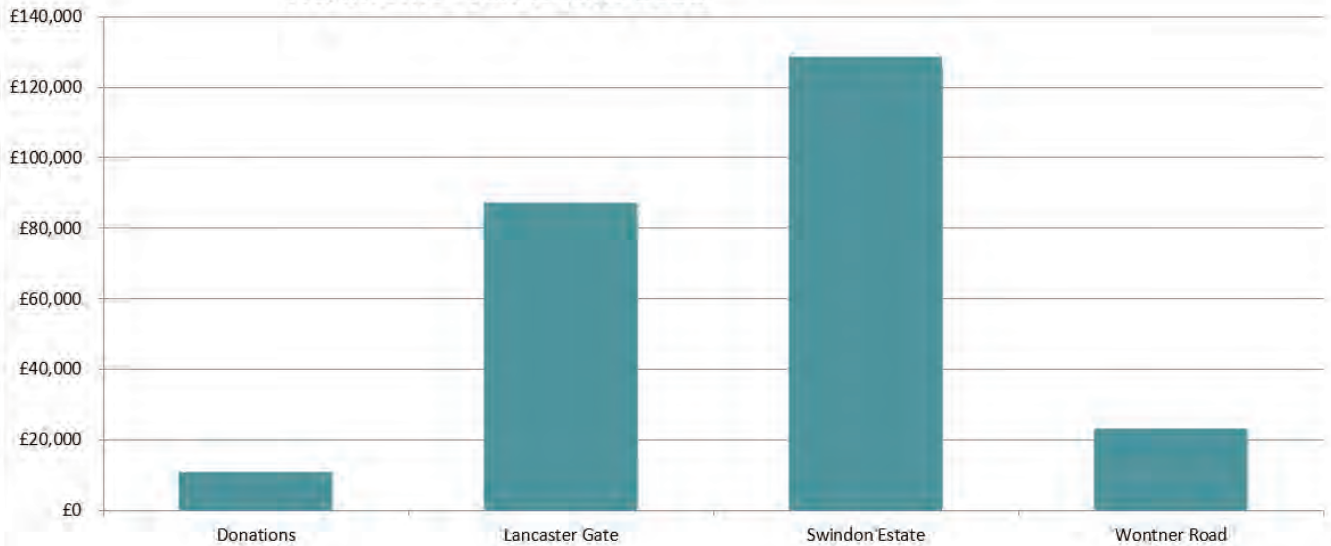

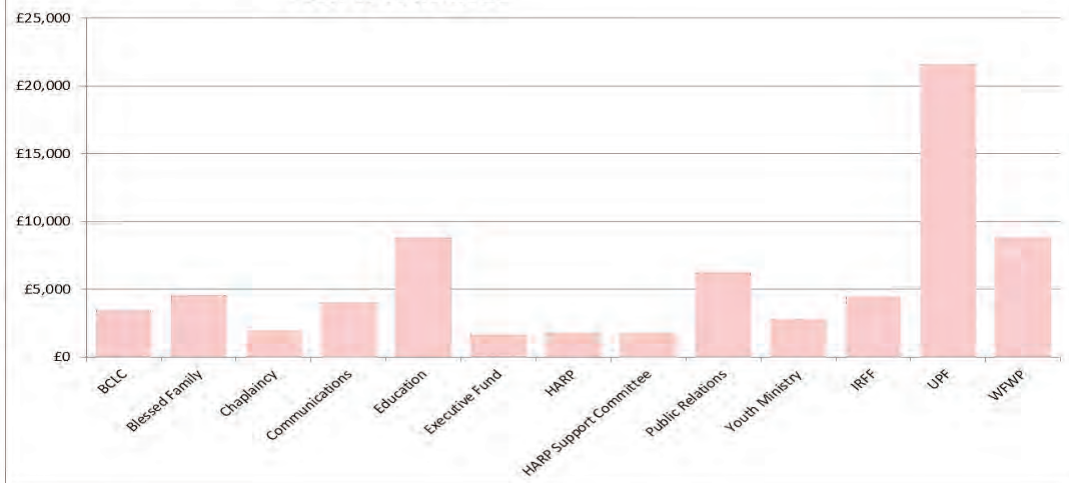

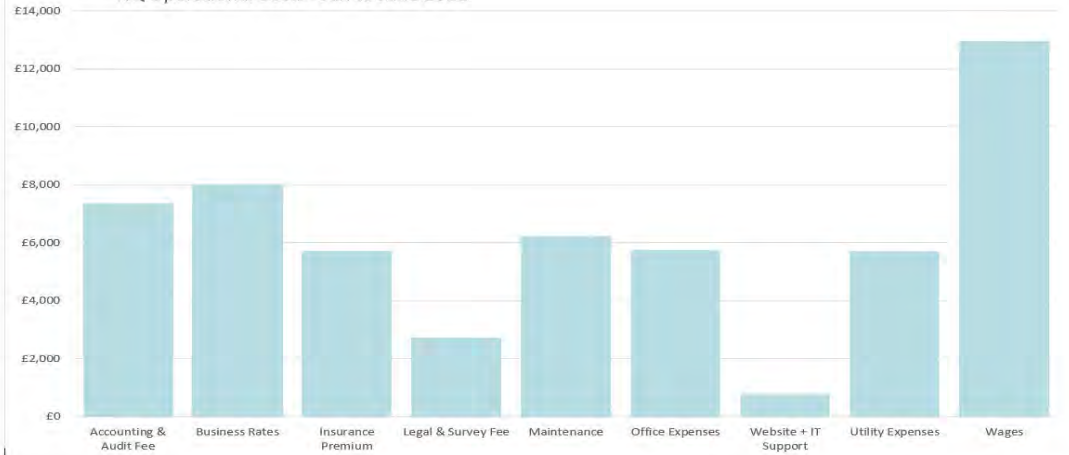
**HQ Income - Jan to June 2021**
