
FFWPU UK: You Must Take On A Special Mission On Earth To Do Heaven's Work

This week, we join Christians around the world celebrating Easter. From the depths of agony on Good Friday to the stunning revelation of the Risen Lord on Sunday, Easter is the time when the heart of God, our Heavenly Parent, is revealed most clearly. 88 years ago on Easter Sunday, 1935 our Founder, Sun Myung Moon, encountered Jesus after a night of prayer on a chilly mountainside near his home in what is today North Korea. Jesus told him that God was calling him to inherit and complete the work of salvation.

It was not easy to accept such a commission?

Father Moon wrote about that life-changing experience in his autobiography, As A Peace-Loving Citizen:

"It was the night before Easter in the year I turned sixteen. I was on the mountain praying all night and begging God in tears for answers. Early Easter morning Jesus appeared to me suddenly like a gust of wind and said to me "God is great sorrow because of the pain of humankind. You must take on a special mission on earth to do Heaven's work . . .

My encounter with Jesus changed my life completely. His sorrowful expression was etched into my heart as if it had been branded there, and I could not think of anything else. From that day on I immersed myself completely in the Word of God. At times I was surrounded by endless darkness and filled with such pain that it was difficult to breathe. At other times my heart was filled with joy, like watching the morning sun rise."

Not long after, he wrote a poem, Crown of Glory, that captures the intensity of that Easter Morning experience:
