


This month, our communities have had the opportunity to meet and listen to Dr. Raphael Ogar Oko's wisdom in different occasions. See how it went below!

On Sunday the 7th of April, he gave a sermon in River South Community at the Peace Embassy on Peace Message #8. The message was an inspiration to many and could bring more understanding on the connection between the UK and Nigeria and the need for interdependence and mutual prosperity between former colonies and the UK.

Dear Dr. Oko,

I have been in Abuja once, several years ago and got a small taste of the country, but I must admit that understanding life in Nigeria is not easy. But in your sermon today you enlightened me a lot. I could understand how Nigeria was put together by the British without necessary considerations to internal issues. But even though the country was not born well, you seem to emphasize the good inheritance of being a part of the empire in which the sun never sets.



Because parallel with the challenging mix of tribes and religions that constitutes todays Nigeria, came the inheritance of both education and language and more. As history cannot be changed, I believe the best way towards the future is to build on the goodness from the past, rather than being too much stuck in historical resentment. In that way you are a role model and I wish more people could take after your example. You gave us good understanding of Nigeria's situation, it's history, its resources and size. Every fifth African is an Nigerian. Even though today's situation is less than good, I think you are right in saying that if Nigeria can move - Africa will move. It has potential.

I did also appreciate your talk about universally shared values, interdependence and coprosperity. These are some key concepts in Divine Principle, for some it is a bit academic, but you gave the concepts life in a way that everybody could relate to. Your comparison between bodily harmony and life in the human world was striking. You shared also openly about your challenges. Being blessed is good but there is a responsibility and expectation attached to it. You shared honestly of the feeling of fear and the feeling of lack of time in order to fulfil the call that we all have to build God's kingdom on Earth.


Finally I liked to hear your belief in education before projects. Not the other way round. How can anybody take care, in the proper way, without education? Thanks for pointing this out. And regarding projects, you mentioned that Nigeria have many natural resources, but a lack of human and technical resources to take care of it. Even printing was mentioned. Printing in Nigeria sounds better than sending books from Europe. Your talk today contributed to a deeper understanding and a desire to help and support. God bless Nigeria. 














#### Radio Nigeria

Radio Nigeria, the federal government nationwide radio has approved our proposal to teach Divine Principle, True Family Values, Peace Education and Community Development Project on the network of Radio Nigeria covering all 36 states and the Federal Capital Territory.

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
