The Grace Miller Award, established in 2001 by Tim Miller in honour of his mother Grace Miller, is a symbol of recognition for young Unificationists and Blessed Children who exemplify a spirit of selflessness and service. Grace Miller herself embodied a motherly heart and held great appreciation for the 2nd Generation members of the Unification Movement. She joined the, at the time, Unification Movement at the age of 56 dedicating the rest of her years towards living a life with God and for the sake of others.

Her legacy lives on through this award, which serves as a reminder of the importance of living a life dedicated to God and for the sake of others. To nominate a young person, they must be aged between 16 to 25, have demonstrated an exemplary life of faith and must have made an impact in their local community or in their neighbourhood (e.g. at school/university). The award is presented to the recipient during the Annual Gathering Festival which takes place at Cleeve House, in Wiltshire. It is a moment where the community comes together to show appreciation to the young person and to encourage more young people to live exemplary lives.
