Romania CARP 'Open HDH' Focuses on Life Goals

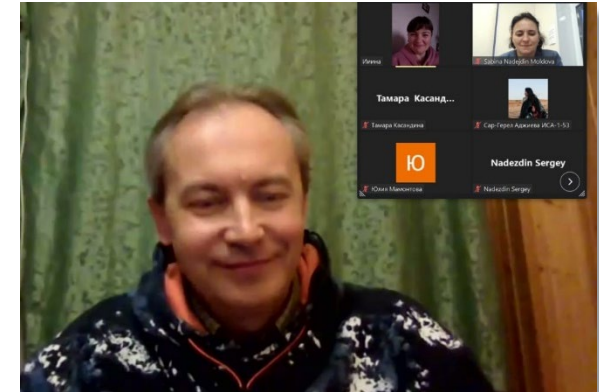

Activities in Belarus



Sixty-seven Belarus members attended the Autumn Special Great Works, with about one-third participating in person and two-thirds online.

Svetlana Novikova returned to Belarus after completing two periods of 21 days at Cheongpyeong. She is full of inspiration about the Cheongshim Won providence, unity with True Mother, and the need for inner purification. She has been invited to give her testimony at night vigils by brothers and sisters from Russia.

The prayer service group is continuing a 340-day prayer condition to support True Mother and Vision 2027. They offer daily prayers for leaders and blessed families. ... Every Thursday parents are holding a prayer meeting to support Second Generation. ... Members regularly join regional conditions and prayer meetings. ... Media Figure Named Ambassador for Peace

Svetlana Drukovskaya, a Russian media professional who has been engaged in the moral education of children and youth for many years, was awarded an Ambassador for Peace certificate in the Moscow Peace Embassy. Mrs. Drukovskaya is the director of the School of Television of the *Prodvizhenie* ("Advancement") TV channel. More than 10,000 children have been trained at the School of Television, all of whom have taken an active part in the creation of morally oriented media content for children and adolescents. – *Dmitry Samko*



UPF Supports Appliance Collection

UPF volunteers in the southwestern Russian city of Voronezh took part in a nationwide project, *ElektroSbor* ("Electro-Collection") 2022, in which unwanted electronics equipment was dropped off at collection points over two days. In Voronezh about 40 volunteers not only received the old appliances but also gave a lecture on the topic "Hazardous Waste" and led a tour of the city's eco-centre. – *Elena Knyazeva*



UPF-Moscow Competes in Waste Paper Collection

Ten UPF-Moscow volunteers took part in a campaign to collect waste paper in the city of Lyubertsy just outside Moscow. It was also a competition, in which the amount of collected paper was converted into eco-points. With the winning points, each county or district received tree seedlings, which are also planted as part of environmental campaigns. The main objective of the campaign is to draw attention to conserving resources. UPF, being a socially oriented NGO, actively participates in environmental campaigns for the separate collection of waste, recycling of batteries, household and electronic waste, collection of plastic bottle caps, etc. – *Dmitry Samko*

Russian Orthodox Archpriest Joins IAPD-EUME Special Advisory Board



Archpriest Vladimir Fedorov of the Russian Orthodox Church has joined the Special Advisory Board of the Interreligious Association for Peace and Development (IAPD) of Europe and the Middle East, part of UPF. On October 26, Father Vladimir had an online meeting with Heiner Handschin, the EUME coordinator for IAPD, along with Konstantin Krylov, Maria Nazarova, and Natalia Chigrina, the leaders of UPF for Eastern Europe, Russia, and Northwest Russia, respectively. Mr. Handschin explained about IAPD and the Special Advisory Board. Then Father Vladimir, who has been a supporter of True Parents' vision and has spoken at several Rallies of Hope, spoke about some of his experiences and, in particular, about a book he is writing about creating a culture of peace. 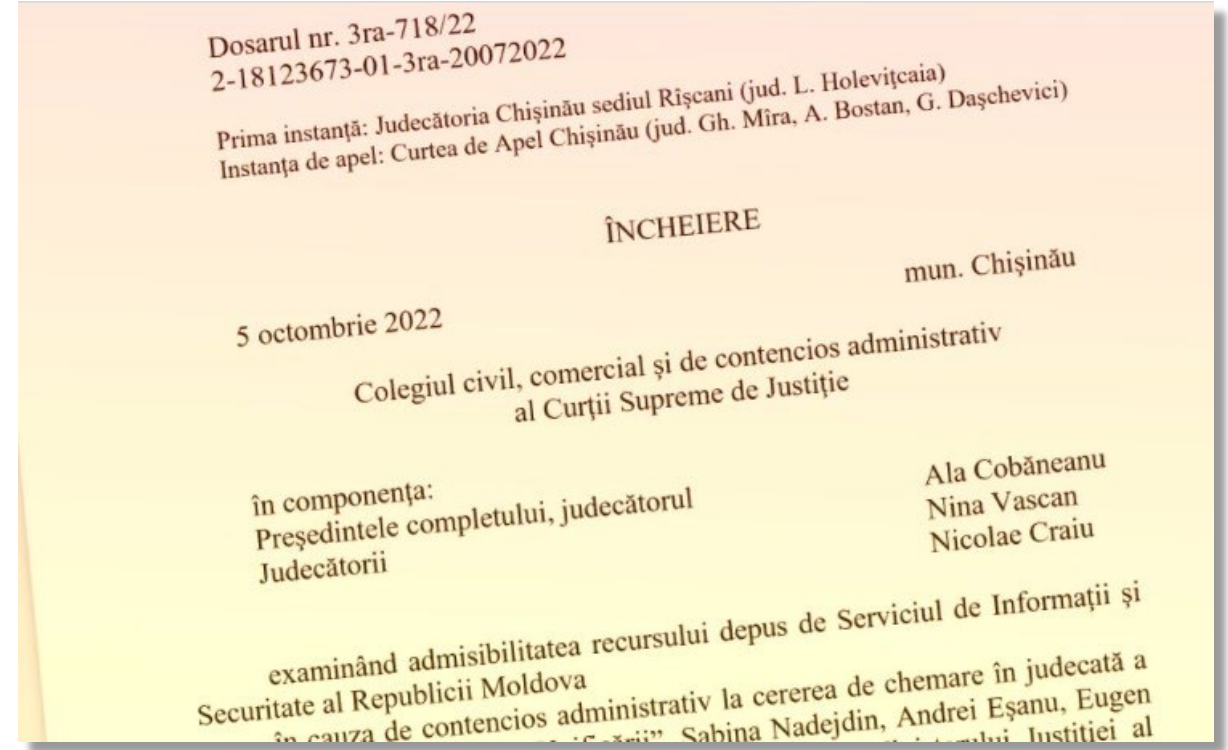

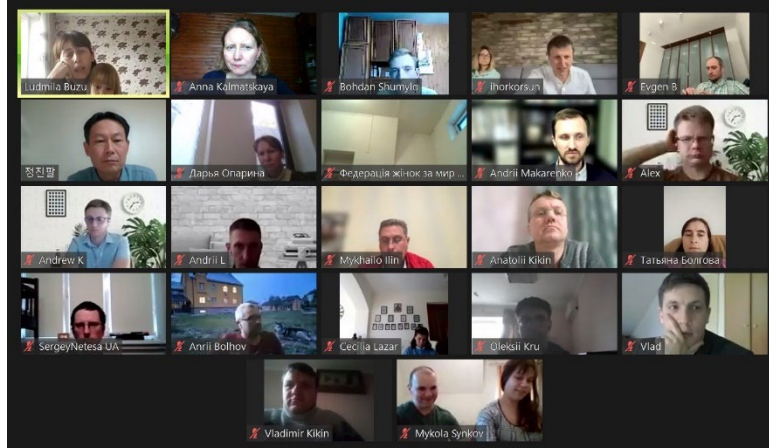
The lower Moscow City Arbitration Court released the full text of its decision about the Moscow Peace Embassy. It took a month for the judge to formulate the document, which normally is released within a few days. Our lawyers are rejoicing at the judge's rare impartiality and emotion. The judge listed all the efforts made to legalize the Peace Embassy, despite the resistance of the authorities. Completely dismissing the Moscow City Government's attempt to destroy one-fourth of the building, the judge stressed, "The continuous push of the Moscow City Government to return the building to its state as of 15 years ago does not seem to restore any lawful rights, but rather is an inadmissible attempt by the authorities to harm the defendant." ... We expect the Moscow City Government to appeal to the higher court within the legally allotted two months. ... Thanks to Dmitry Melnikov for partnering with the lawyer over several years and to Ruslan Salmanov for his impeccable documentation work. – *Konstantin Krylov*

Victory in the Moldovan Supreme Court



After five years of litigation, the government security service's attempt to close the Unification Church of Moldova, accusing it of being an extremist group, was dismissed. The complaint against the UC was submitted by a member of the Moldova Academy of Sciences without the approval of the Academy. Later the Academy of Sciences rejected the letter, but the case, which was already in motion, was required to run its course. – Sabina Nadejdin

News from Ukraine Members



Youth and Families

Participants entering the New World Education Team one-year program attended an online meeting. ... One sister arrived in the Lviv region to do 40-day actionizing. ... Six new guests listened to a one-day DP workshop.

The national messiah to Ukraine held an online meeting with Ukrainian blessed couples, in which they reflected on the tradition of night vigils, which was started seven years ago and has continued without a break, even during the war. In the spirit of making a new start, new night vigil groups were formed, with new leaders appointed. The new night vigil leaders spoke of their determination, followed by a discussion.

WFWP

WFWP-Ukraine volunteers organized humanitarian aid projects for families who apply for help through social networks. Last week we provided support to large families living in the villages of Kyiv and Odessa regions. Food, hygiene products, baby food and other necessary things were purchased. The children hear the rockets coming and ask when the war will end, because they are very tired of hiding. There is no work in the villages, families have financial problems. They have to go to the forest with their children to prepare firewood for the winter. – *Anna Kalmatskaya*

Croatian members set up a book table at an antiques fair in the city of Osijek, where they displayed True Father's autobiography, Divine Principle Level 4, and DP brochures in Croatian.
