
Witnessing

Saint Paul (c.5 BC - c.67 AD)



- ❑ A citizen of Rome
- ❑ A pharisaical Jew
- ❑ Approved the stoning of St. Stephen
- ❑ Dramatic conversion experience on the road to Damascus
- ❑ Most widely travelled and prolific of all the early disciples of Jesus
- ❑ Was fearless in his missionary zeal

St. Paul's Missionary Course

I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, I have been constantly on the move. I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my own countrymen, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in danger at sea; and in danger from false brothers. I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked. Besides everything else, I face daily the pressure of my concern for all the churches.

Saint Patrick (387-493)



- ❑ Born in Roman Britain
- ❑ Became a slave in Ireland at the age of 16
- ❑ Escaped after 6 years
- ❑ Returned as a missionary to Ireland in AD 432
- ❑ Boldly challenged and converted leaders
- ❑ Christian church established in 444
- ❑ Laid a foundation for the Christianization of Western Europe

Saint Francis of Assisi (1182-1226)



- ❑ The son of a wealthy merchant
- ❑ Lived a self-centered life in his youth
- ❑ Had a gradual experience of change
- ❑ Overcame his feelings of repulsion towards lepers
- ❑ Forsook his comfortable life
- ❑ Challenged corruption within the church

Martin Luther (1483-1546)



- ❑ Son of a miner
- ❑ Determined to be a monk after nearly being struck by lightning.
- ❑ Became a Christian theologian and Augustinian monk
- ❑ Posted his 95 Theses of Contention on Wittenburg church door in 1517
- ❑ Defended his beliefs at the Diet of Worms in 1521
- ❑ Translated and published the Bible in German

"Unless I am convinced by proofs from Scriptures or by plain and clear reasons and arguments, I can and will not retract, for it is neither safe nor wise to do anything against conscience. Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me. Amen."
