Annual meeting with 36 Delegates from Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Holland, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Norway, Spain, Slovenia, Sweden, Switzerland, and the U.K which was held in Neumühle Trainings Centre, Bad Camberg, Germany, on 5. – 7. September 2014

FFWPU Europe, Mrs. Susan Crosthwaite: Looking over the last 3 years of reports about our Annual Meeting, I read the headings:

2011: “Building the EU-BFD Together” 2012: “Growing as a Team”

2013: “Annual Meeting brings together 43 Delegates from 19 Countries”

This was our 8th Annual meeting and the first to be held in the newly refurbished Neumuehle, Camberg.
