The Korean Clergy Leadership Conference (KCLC) and the Korea Religions Association co-hosted the "2nd Prayer Meeting to Announce a Statement on Religious Freedom" on October 13 in front of the Seoul Detention Center. The gathering brought together more than 300 participants, including leaders from major religious orders in Korea and members of the Family Federation, to reaffirm the importance of religious freedom, human rights, mutual understanding and harmony.
