

# FFWPU International: A Providential Journey Through Heavenly Africa

Acting on True Mother's instructions to embrace her children worldwide, Rev. Seung-yeon Doo, Director General of World Mission Headquarters, completed a historic tour of "Heavenly Africa" from January 30 to February 9, 2026. This mission was a powerful exchange of heart, faith, and strategic vision across three nations.

## 1. DR Congo - Polishing the "Diamonds" of Africa

The tour began in Kinshasa, where Rev. Doo was met with an explosion of joy and culture. He immediately identified the spirit of the Congolese people as their greatest asset.

The "Diamond" Metaphor: During the Continental Worship Service, Rev. Doo moved the 1,500 onsite participants by describing them as "diamonds." He explained that while a diamond in the rough may look like a common stone, it possesses an internal brilliance that can light up the world once polished through faith and unity.

A Call to Excellence: In a strategic meeting with 65 HTG Africa Missionaries, Rev. Doo shared a personal story about the importance of "professional ownership." He challenged the youth not just to be members of a church, but to become the most outstanding experts in their professional fields - law, medicine, or business - to prove the greatness of Cheon Il Guk through their success.



Stewardship of the Holy: During his inspection of the 7th Street Church School, he taught that church assets are not just buildings; they are the "external body" of our faith. He urged leaders to maintain them

with the same care they would give their own homes.

## **2. Benin - Healing History and Ancestral Liberation**

In Benin, the atmosphere shifted from celebration to deep spiritual reflection, focusing on the heavy history of the continent and the path to a new future.

**The Pilgrimage to Ouidah:** Perhaps the most emotional moment of the tour occurred at the "Point of No Return," a historic slave trade site. Standing where millions were once taken in chains, Rev. Doo led a prayer of deep repentance and liberation. He symbolically "sanctified" the ground, declaring that the era of sorrow was over and that these sites would now represent the "Point of Return" to God's bosom.

**True Mother as a Biological Parent:** At the Godomey Peace Embassy, Rev. Doo shared a profound insight into our relationship with the True Parents. He encouraged members to stop viewing True Mother as a distant spiritual figure and instead feel her as a "biological mother" whose heart aches for the success of her children in Africa. This "heartistic" shift moved many members to tears, fostering a deeper, more personal faith.

**Youth as Catalysts:** To the youth of Benin, he delivered a message of self-worth, urging them to shed "old mentalities" of being a developing nation and instead see themselves as the primary catalysts for a global spiritual revolution.



## **3. Côte d'Ivoire - Building Networks for the Future**

The final leg in Abidjan was characterized by its forward-looking energy, focusing on how to practically organize the talents of the youth for long-term growth.

**Top Gun Ambitions:** Meeting with the 11 "Top Gun" cadets at the Yopougon National Education Center, Rev. Doo didn't just offer praise; he offered a challenge. He told them that their one-year training was a "womb" where they must develop a "global-sized identity." The cadets responded with a spirited song and dance, showcasing the "boundless energy" Rev. Doo later praised in his reports.

**Reviving the Cranes Club:** In a meeting with 50 young entrepreneurs and professionals, Rev. Doo shared the vision of the Cranes Club, established by True Mother in 2014. He told the story of how professional networking can protect and support young families in their careers, asking the professionals to create a "safety net of success" for the younger generation.

**The Final Exhortation:** Before departing, he held a roundtable with 23 regional leaders. His closing story was one of courage: he told them that the only thing holding Africa back was "hesitation." He promised that if they acted with absolute faith in the power of Cheon Shim Won, the spirit world would work miracles to find solutions for their nations.

## **Conclusion: A New Chapter for Africa**
