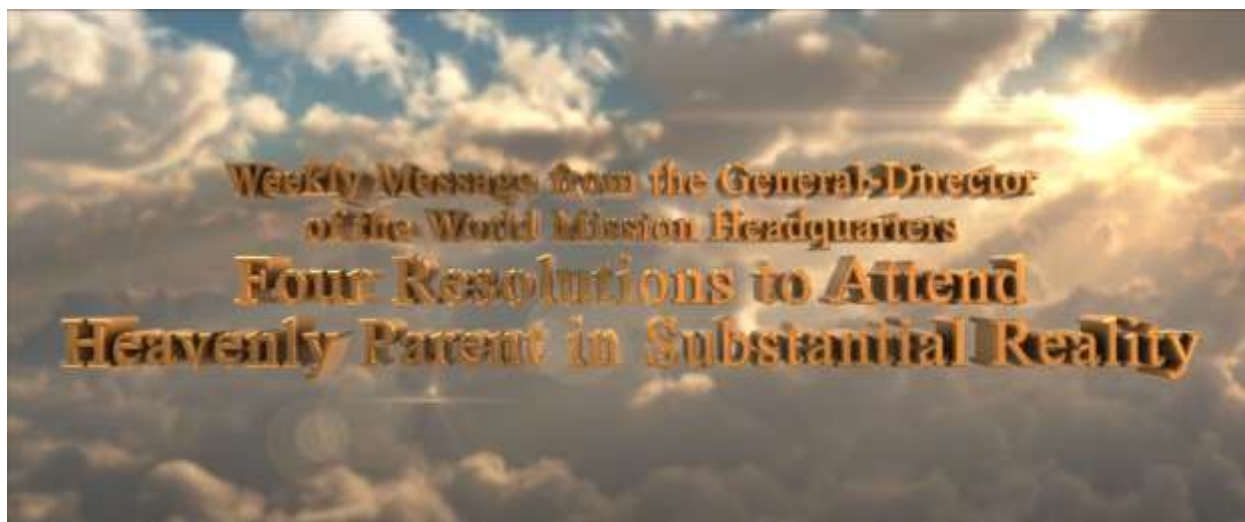


## FFWPU Int'l: Four Resolutions to Attend Heavenly Parent in Substantial Reality

Beloved and respected blessed families of the Unification community throughout the world,

I sincerely pray that the abundant blessing and love of Heavenly Parent and True Parents will fill the lives of each of your family members this coming week.

### 1. Summary of Last Week's Message



Last week, the sermon from the worship service to commemorate the Holy Births of the True Parents of Heaven, Earth, and Humankind and the 13th Anniversary of Cheon Il Guk Foundation Day became my message for the week.

This week, I would like to summarize that message and reflect with you on what kind of transformation we must achieve in our lives in this era of attending Heavenly Parent in substantial reality, and with what determination and practice we should move forward.

### 2. Four Resolutions to Serve Heavenly Parent with Our Lives

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

During the worship service for True Parents' Birthday last week, we shared four resolutions as we welcomed 2026 as the first year in the era of attending Heavenly Parent in substantial reality. In this week's message, I would like us to engrave them once again in our hearts and examine how we are living

them out in our daily lives.

**First: The practice of faith — are we truly making “attendance” part of our everyday life?**



We have now passed beyond the era of seeking the invisible God and entered the era when we should live with our Heavenly Parent substantially in our daily lives. That means we must ask ourselves whether our daily lives are worthy of participating in that attendance.

Is the inspiration we feel in worship carried into our choices and attitudes throughout the week? Do our words and actions reflect the dignity of Heaven? Faith must not remain based on an event or atmosphere—it must become the order and standard of our lives. Only then does the quality of our faith rise.



**Second: Taking responsibility — Are we demonstrating filial love (hyojeong) through our lives?**

Last week, we resolved to go beyond “displays of filial piety” and practice “responsible filial love and devotion.” What matters now is not the decision but the action.

We must ask ourselves whether, in our families and mission fields, we are truly establishing models of true love and true families, and whether we are preparing fruits to offer in our reports before Heaven. Numbers and form are not the essence; the honest report we must offer should be of transformed lives and established communities.

**Third: The universalization of identity—are we breathing together with the world?**



We are the sons and daughters of Heavenly Parent. That identity must not remain confined to particular boundaries, but must be fully connected to society.

We must reflect on whether our community is trusted within society, and whether we are sharing in our neighbors' pain. More important than explanations or justifications is the evidence based on life itself. Our mission is to leave behind a record of truth that the world will willingly acknowledge.

And lastly, Fourth: The substantialization of Love — Is love manifested beyond religion?

Until now, we have cherished true love and heart within ourselves. Yet now it must appear as a reality— something our spouses, children, and neighbors can tangibly experience.

If our faith still remains at the level of concepts and words, the signboard of religion cannot be taken down. But if we ourselves become the substance of love, the world will see Cheon Il Guk without us needing to explain it.



### 3. Practice

Beloved Members,

This weekly message has summarized once again the sermon from the worship service commemorating True Parents' Holy Births. Let us reflect on whether our faith is expressed in our daily lives, whether responsibility is manifested in action, whether our identity is open toward the world, and whether love is

being revealed through the reality of our lives. In so doing, may this week see the writing, through our lives, of the first chapter of the second volume of Heaven's providence in 2026.



We are currently offering a 13-day special period of devotions until March 1. During this time, we have observed the Lunar New Year, True Parents' Holy Birthday and the 13th Anniversary of Cheon Il Guk Foundation Day, and have experienced various events, messages, and devotions. For this week's practice, I encourage you to take time to quietly reflect on this 13-day special period of devotions, and to share with your family or fellow members the insights, realizations, and growth you have experienced during this time.

Through such reflection and sharing, may each of the four resolutions we made on True Parents' Birthday be translated into concrete practices in our daily lives.



I sincerely hope that those small practices will become the starting point of the earthly kingdom we dream of. Once again, I pray that Heavenly Parent's blessings may be abundantly upon you, your families, and your communities this week.
