As part of our ongoing efforts - including the 100-Day Campaign leading to the International Day of Peace - we invite parliamentary leaders to contribute to a global culture of peace through meaningful dialogue and principled policymaking.

To our <u>Ambassadors for Peace</u>, UPF chapters, and civil society partners: we encourage collaboration with elected representatives in a spirit of respect and shared purpose.

When rooted in ethics and animated by a vision for the common good, parliaments can become pillars of hope and stability. The foundation of lasting peace is not only political but spiritual - grounded in values that uphold human dignity and our shared origin in the Divine.
