
Meet S. Africa's empowered teenagers

"Many kids my age are involved with drugs or gangs, but this program helped me develop positive habits," Ibanathi says. Determined to set an example for his siblings, he remains focused: "There will be struggles — potholes in the road, hills to climb — but everything happens for the greater good." Committed to success, he vows, "I'll keep working hard, making sure your (IRFF UK's) investment in us turns into something

Thoko Madikane


Thoko is upgrading English HL, Business Studies, and History, with plans to study law.



IRFF UK built Destiny Junior School in Kampala, Uganda in 2009, and has gone on to see more than 500 students graduates go into further education which otherwise wouldn't have happened. £115,000 has been invested in total, starting from £330 a month and now at £1,150 with 206 students in total
