His focus at the moment is extending research, programs and practices in the field of cultural diplomacy. Dr. Donfried also teaches courses in cultural diplomacy at the Center for Cultural Diplomacy Studies.



Hon. Muhammad Azhar Siddique is an advocate of the Supreme Court of Pakistan and chairman of the Judicial Activism Panel, writer and social activist, human rights campaigner, and *pro bono publico* lawyer.

Professor Saleh Dauda is a professor of international relations at the University of Abuja, Nigeria. He has published widely in both local and international journals. He has written ten books on international relations and related areas. His research interest is in Africa's international relations, the Third World in global politics, regionalism in Africa and foreign policy formulation and analysis.

Emmanuel C. Njoku is an ambassador of ECOWAS (Economic Community of West African States), the chairman of the Emma Njoku Foundation, an NGO focusing on health and education; and the managing director of Prezzo Shed Investments. He trained as a lawyer and has been involved in renewable energy, human resources management, real estate and law while sitting on the boards of many companies in Nigeria and overseas.
