Friends, family and fellow students enthusiastically applauded as twenty students received their diplomas at the 37th commencement ceremony of the Unification Theological Seminary (UTS) at its New York City campus on Saturday, May 25, 2013.

The celebration was moderated by remembrances of Dr. Richard Arthur, professor of New Testament Studies, who passed away in February, and Rev. Eric Holt, adjunct lecturer in Management and UTS Board of Trustees member, who suddenly passed away on May 22, 2013 after battling cancer.

Dr. Richard L. Rubenstein was awarded an honorary Doctor of Sacred Theology from UTS in recognition of his outstanding scholarship in the areas of the Holocaust, Jewish-Christian relations, the sociology of religion, religion and public policy and more recently, radical Islam. He also has served as President of the University of Bridgeport in Connecticut.

This graduating class represented a wide range of nationalities, including Sweden, Nigeria, Jamaica, India, Portugal, Congo, Korea, the Philippines, Mongolia, Zimbabwe, the Russian Federation and the United States. Five students received the Master of Religious Education degree. Six received the Master of Arts in Religious Studies. Five received Master of Divinity degrees and four received Doctor of Ministry degrees.

UTS President Dr. Richard Panzer advised the graduates that "this world is sorely in need of leaders who can bring out the better instincts of people in their communities and nations, instead of playing on their fears and resentments. It is this quality of leadership that I earnestly hope that you as UTS graduates can exemplify."
