On this Easter weekend, all of us in the Unification Movement can reflect that it was built on the foundation of unspeakable offerings. The first quote is from when Father asked sisters from 777 Couples Blessing to leave their families to go out witnessing. To be honest, when I heard about such actions it was hard for me to accept that Father would ask for this kind of sacrifice, but it did help me to understand how serious he was in declaring war on Satan's world.

I remember the many times that Father spoke to you as his "brides," and told all of us brothers that we were "archangels" who should follow and support each of you as you followed the directions of your eternal "bridegroom."
