ADVENTURE TRAINING

TREK INTO THE ADIRONDACKS

This year's team leader training included an exciting challenge: a three day outdoor wilderness course in the Adirondack Mountains. Divided into teams of 4-5, the team leaders in training' objective was to trek through swamps and forests with only a compass and map for guide to reach an assigned meeting point. With minimum gear (a tarp, machete, matches...) they learned many survival techniques, but more significantly they learned teamwork on a deep level. What follows is an account from a 3rd year GPA participant, Soogin Ogden from Chicago, Illinois about her experience going through the course.

We trekked for three days in the Adirondack Mountains through swamps and forests with no communication and only a compass and map for guide. Why did we do it?

"I felt like it was very surreal, because we were in the van for 4 hours driving, and then, all of a sudden, we were bushwhacking through a forest. It got more and more uncomfortable as we went along; from the flies, the mosquito bites, the wetness, the mud, and on top of that the energy we had to exert just to survive. It felt very surreal. However, the whole experience was really amazing.

What I liked the most was that there was something eternally peaceful about being in nature. Even if we were so uncom-

fortable, and everything was really frustrating, once I moved past complaining about the situation and realized how we were surrounded by so many beautiful things, I started to feel very free. It was once I harmonized with nature, didn't fight it, and tried to work with it, I really felt at peace in the mountains. It was a really amazing experience; I did it twice and I'd definitely want to do it again."

God made our mountains and being able to enjoy them in the company of brothers and sisters was one of the many epic experiences that made up the 2011 GPA summer.
