GPA Hones Their Skills and Express Gratitude to True Mother

Generation Peace Academy sent a team of ten participants to Las Vegas to collaborate with the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP) Las Vegas in supporting and furthering True Parent's Providence in Las Vegas through witnessing. They will stay there from April 21 to May 31, 2015.

GPA wasted no time. They began activities at the University of Las Vegas in Nevada (UNLV) campus, the same day they arrived, inviting students to attend the weekly "Discussion Night" events hosted by CARP.

"Witnessing is more of a person-to-person, heart-to-heart connection with another person on a deeper level compared to fundraising... it's a different kind of love investment," commented Yuri Shibata, a first-year GPA participant from Chicago, Illinois.

CARP has been hosting the event every week for over a year and has consistently drawn over 30 students per night. Guest speakers have included Katherine Duncan, representative of the City Council Ward 5, and Rev. Kara Keating, the Spiritual Director of Soul Sanctuary LLC and author of spirituality and interfaith books. After hearing a short talk from the guest speaker, the students then break off into smaller groups to discuss and share their thoughts on various themes such as "World Peace Begins with Me" or "Greater Goals for the Greater Good."

"I've participated in many church gatherings where we get together as a church family, but this is the first time where I experienced the same kind of family atmosphere... even though many of the students weren't [Unificationists], they still were able to connect to our principles and core values," remarked Chungbom, a second-year participant from Japan.

The GPA participants have also assisted with several larger activities as well. Recently the team joined in on clean-up projects organized by a UNLV student organization called Shine City Project, and have assisted with the Las Vegas Family Church monthly youth group gathering and an educational seminar about True Parent's Providence in Las Vegas, by Las Vegas Family Church Senior Pastor, Reverend Ken Doo.

Towards the end of the week, GPA, CARP, UPA, and several UNLV students, took some time out from outreach and activities to experience some natural beauty at Red Rock Canyon. The group took in majestic views there, only twenty minutes from the Las Vegas strip, and spent time being able to connect and recharge.

"Before Red Rock, I felt like I was living a life closed-off from others," reflected a first-year GPA participant from Detroit, Michigan. "But lying on the rocks and looking up at the vast blue sky made me

realize that the world was much broader...the beauty of God's creation helped remind me of the important things in life – family"

The day ended with a bonfire, where participants shared their goals and experiences in an intimate and supportive atmosphere. Kobe, a student at UNLV and new CARP member, shared a unique experience,

"Recently, I went with my best friend to celebrate their birthday. After dinner, we took a walk on the strip. It wasn't anything special; however, this time it felt different because I couldn't really enjoy myself. I felt that my spirit and my energy were being drained by seeing what was really happening there. I became very discouraged and began wondering, "How are we ever going to change Las Vegas?" I realized that the best we can do is to win our individual victories. I want to inspire others to do the same. When more and more people begin winning those victories, then Las Vegas can begin to change. I hope we all can do that."

Kobe's experience sums up the determination of many of the participants, including their love for the city and its people. It has been an enriching experience for GPA members to see the work that the UNLV and CARP students have been doing, and to be able to lend support. The participants and students are sure to learn even more from each other in the weeks to come.

GPA can now add Las Vegas, to their list of meaningful experiences. Participants just wrapped up their second annual GPA/STF reunion in conjunction with its annual Family Workshop at Estes Park, Colorado, before splitting up again and heading off to Las Vegas and other parts of the country. While in Colorado, a few of the first and second year GPA members, took some time to write letters to True Mother expressing their gratitude for what they have gained so far, and their excitement at welcoming her soon in America. Letters to True Mother

"My experience on GPA has been life-changing. For most of my life I thought that I was set in my life of faith and that I knew everything there was to know about God and True Parents, because I'd been taught the same things over and over again at church and workshops. But after coming to GPA and being challenged every day, fundraising out in the frontlines, I soon realized that the faith that I thought was mine wasn't really mine but my parents'. I just followed everything that they did and never really questioned or rebelled against anything. So when I met people who had a stronger conviction in their faith and what they believed in, I didn't feel confident and wavered a lot.

One constant challenge I struggled with was being vulnerable to God and the people I met. This past competition I worked on facing my challenges, instead of running away like I always did. It was a constant battle that I had to continuously face. I especially had a hard time being more honest and open with the people I met on the frontline. Many times I would say only the minimum and exclude anything that might bring me any more persecution.

But I felt like there was something missing, and I felt like I had to make fundraising more memorable. By being more open and vulnerable to God's children, I was able to have more heartistic connections with them and make more meaningful memories and experiences.

Each day we would read True Father's words on "Total Investment" in the morning, and it stuck with me that True Parents lived every day with total investment. Without you and True Father I wouldn't be alive and wouldn't have gone through all these amazing experiences. Thank you so much for everything." — Elly, California



"Thank you for my life. Thank you for raising me to this day. I am so fortunate to not only be part of just a movement but just being able to be part of returning joy to God and trying to establish a world of peace. "This year on GPA has been full of so many experiences that have shaped my perspective and heart toward God and True Parents. GPA has given me such precious opportunities to develop a relationship and trust in God and True Parents through fundraising, workshops, and overseas service work. I would just like to share a bit of what I experienced here on GPA.

After my first half of the year, I felt like I really started to create a foundation for my relationship with God, but I felt like I did not create any real, deep kind of relationship with True Parents. And thus the second part of this year, the GPA group and I focused on our relationship with True Parents and our heart of attendance toward them. I struggled a lot during the condition before going to the Philippines. I was feeling empty and felt like I couldn't feel any of God's love. I was trying to feel something while fundraising, but I just felt so empty even though I was investing every day.

Then one day I realized that I hadn't focused or thought about True Parents at all, even though they were part of my internal goal. That day I decided to focus on True Parents. I tried imagining them next to me,

talking to them, looking at their picture, and chanting "Chambumonim Okmansei." From that day I felt a huge turnaround from my confusion and emptiness.

I felt God's love through True Parents and finally felt this sort of comfort and trust that even if I don't feel anything that everything will be ok. It was because I have True Parents. And that was my first step in my relationship with True Parents. Ever since that condition, I've been taking small steps forward in this relationship through our service work in the Philippines and spring fundraising competition.

I was so inspired about my fresh experience with True Parents that it truly carried me through my time in the Philippines. However, the inspiration didn't last, and many doubts came about True Parents. I questioned whether this was helping me build my relationship or why I was even doing this for them. Why can't I just do nothing? The answer was simply because I am a second gen. I was given the most precious gift, and that is to be able to understand God's heart through True Parents. As much as I don't like the responsibility that comes with this gift all the time, I know it is what I want to do as a daughter to God and True Parents.

Even though I don't always feel like my relationship with True Parents is moving forward, I know that this parent-child relationship is what I want now and after GPA. Whether my investment in this relationship can be seen or felt in the present moment, I know it is out there and that relationships can only deepen when we continuously invest every day. "Hello!! How are you doing? My name is Nao from Arizona. Currently I am a first year here on GPA. It's already less than half a year before we graduate. But during that amount of time, I have learned a lot about God, True Parents, and what it means to be a second generation. "On this program I've come to appreciate having God and True Parents in my life and my respect for you has grown deeply. I'll try my best to be honest with my story, so please bear with me. After the overseas project, I wanted to give back even more to God for the spring competition, so my internal goal was to "comfort God and True Parents' heart." To me that meant to ease their aching heart through the people I met on the front line. Each day I felt more and more discouraged as I kept failing over and over again and started to crash. Then an I.W. named Shiori had a talk with me. She told me that I should change my goal into something I could connect to. The next day I changed my goal to "live for God and True Parents." This was another way of saying: putting God and True Parents as my center and core of my life. As my action steps: I read God's words to recenter myself, prayed to see the bigger picture, chanted my internal goal to remember what I'm practicing, and connected back to my core/center to remember my purpose. My runs became more focused, and my reports were clear on whether I practiced my action steps or not.

Through the internal goals and action steps, I was able to grow closer to you, True Father, and God. I'm grateful for all the experiences I've had on GPA and still looking forward to continue growing with the upcoming outreaches and pilgrimages.
