Global Leaders Call for Peace on the Korean Peninsula

'We cannot choose war to end war'

South Korea -- The **World Summit 2022 (Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula)** ended its first day in Seoul, Korea, with dozens of world leaders calling for an end to the Cold War's last remaining division -- the Korean Peninsula.

The Koreas need to "swiftly conclude a peace treaty" and end the war, said **Samdech Hun Sen**, Prime Minister of the Royal Government of Cambodia. "My country has been divided by war," but it ended 20 years ago, thanks to the "best choice" of dialogue, he said. "We cannot choose war to end war," he added.

"Peace on the Korean Peninsula has symbolic meaning to all of us," said H.E. **Ahmet Davutoglu**, Turkey Prime Minister (2014-2018). The Cold War divided Germany, Yemen, Vietnam and Korea, but all but Korea have since reunited, he said. "It is time for a new era on the Korean Peninsula."

Some 160 nations are represented in the Feb.11-13 **World Summit 2022**, including 157 nations with diplomatic ties to one or both of the Koreas. The Summit is sponsored by the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) and the Royal Government of Cambodia, hosted by UPF Co-Founder Dr. **Hak Ja Han Moon**, and co-chaired by H.E. **Hun Sen** and H.E. **Ban Ki-moon**, former Secretary-General of the United Nations.

Speakers addressed several hundred people attending in person and a global virtual audience; organizers said 3,500 broadcast networks around the globe were covering the Summit.

US Vice President **Mike Pence** (2017-2021) was one of many speakers who saw great hope for Korea's united future. "There's nothing that's impossible when nations work together for the common good," he said, referring to the global response to the COVID-19 pandemic. This international cooperation is why "the dream of a united Korea is possible," he said.

"We are all for peace. The question is what are we prepared to do to make it possible," said H.E. **Ehud Olmert**, Israel Prime Minister (2006-2009), who praised the Trump/Pence administration's peace efforts in the Middle East. "Words are one thing and real progress is another," said **Kyra Phillips**, ABC Correspondent and veteran newswoman who recalled seeing promises of Korean peace evaporate instead.

Many world leaders offered wisdom from their own or their nation's histories of peacebuilding. "Peace is cultivated in courage, trust and dialogue," said Senegal President **Macky Sall**, who is chairman of the African Union.

There is "defense power" and "diplomacy power," but "peace power" -- the ability to build peace through honest, personal relationships -- should not be underestimated, said Hon. **Yoshinori Ohno**, Minister of the Environment in Japan (2018-2019).

"I personally think the North Koreans are seriously thinking of the possibility of opening up," said Dr. **Claude Begle**, former Swiss Member of Parliament. What is needed is a safe platform for dialogue to eliminate fears, establish mutual trust and plant "seeds for peace," he said, noting that the UPF is well-positioned to offer such a platform.

"We can fix this together... but we need the whole world on board," said US broadcaster **Trish Regan**.

Many speakers presented challenges to peace, such as resistance to denuclearization; foreign troops in South Korea; strained Korea-Japan relations; tensions between China and the US; and core Korean differences, such as the North's devotion to a single leader and its own nationalism versus the South's determination to form a highly prosperous, modern democracy that values individual freedoms.

Summit speakers also offered a range of solutions, such as encouraging new friendships with the North Korean people through trade, tourism, sports, music, and cultural exchanges. Hon. **Lim JongSeong**, one of 35 Members of the South Korean National Assembly participating in the Summit, spoke of forming an official agency to assist with reunification of Korean families. US businessman **Jim Rogers**, chairman of Beeland Enterprises, energized the audience with his presentation on opening up the 38th Parallel to permit construction of an international highway-and-tunnel system, "so people can drive from Tokyo to London."

Michael Breen, a Seoul-based journalist and author, dropped a solution at the feet of UPF, suggesting that the NGO hold its next World Summit in Pyongyang.

US House Speaker **Newt Gingrich** (1995-1999) summed up many of the speakers' sentiments when he said, "The human race will move forward to safety, to prosperity and to freedom only if good people take the time to show courage and get involved."

"Only by honoring God can we end this sad division in North and South Korea," said Pastor Paula White-Cain, spiritual adviser to President Donald J. Trump.

Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula

Backgrounder

World Summit 2022, to be convened in Seoul, the Republic of Korea, on 10-14 February 2022, under the theme “Toward Peace on the Korean Peninsula”, will focus on developing multiple pathways and practical steps towards peaceful reunification of the Korean Peninsula, enhancing the ecosystem of peace in the Asia-Pacific region, and promoting innovative multistakeholder dialogue and partnership for peace and prosperity. The Royal Government of Cambodia and the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) are jointly organizing of the World Summit.

World Summit 2022 will be hosted by Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, Co-Founder of UPF, and co-hosted by Samdech Techo Hun Sen, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, and H.E. Ban Ki-moon, former Secretary-General of the United Nations.

World Summit 2022 is part of UPF’s longstanding and ongoing World Summit series to promote interdependence, mutual prosperity, and universal values. UPF and its global network of Ambassadors for Peace work collaboratively across all sectors of society to resolve conflicts and reconcile the divided human family. The UPF series addresses the critical challenges of our time and promotes constructive dialogue and multilateral cooperation for the sake of peace and human development.

Throughout 2021 and 2022, UPF has been searching for a breakthrough for peace on the Korean Peninsula. UPF’s programs, including its Rally of Hope series, the International Leadership Conference series, and the Forum series of Think Tank 2022, have engaged experts and leaders from across the globe and touched the minds and hearts of millions of people from around the world.

The Korean War began in 1950. Unfortunately, the war concluded with an armistice, not a peace treaty, leaving the once unified Korean Peninsula divided, despite being populated by a people with a common history, culture, and language. Is it possible to resolve this 70-year-old conflict and bring about the Peaceful Reunification of the Korean Peninsula? During the Summit, we will seek answers to these questions.

Toward this end, World Summit 2022 will convene leading experts from various professional fields representing government, academia, civil society, faith-based organizations, the media, business, and the arts with others participating virtually. Their individual and collective experience will contribute wisdom and insights needed to build a world of mutual understanding, sustainable peace and prosperity for all.

World Summit 2022 will feature several components, including the Global Assembly of Heads of State and Government, the Interreligious Peace Summit, the 2022 Sunhak Peace Prize Awards Ceremony, and the Rally for Peace on the Korean Peninsula involving more than one million people.

In addition, the Summit will convene a series of Think Tank 2022 Forum breakout sessions dedicated to the work of UPF’s Associations, including:

- International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace (IAPP)
- Interreligious Association for Peace and Development (IAPD)
- International Association for Peace and Economic Development (IAED)

It is the lifelong dream of Dr. Moon and the late Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon to bring about a more peaceful world and reunify their homeland. Thirty years ago, they travelled to Pyongyang and met with Kim Il Sung for unprecedented peace talks during a weeklong visit.

Afterwards, North Korea signed a safeguards agreement with the International Atomic Energy Agency to denuclearize the Korean Peninsula and supported the reunion of families separated by the Korean War.

Recognizing the need for a broad strategy to achieve peace on the Korean Peninsula, UPF has been a proponent of “soft power” solutions and an emphasis on “track two” diplomacy and, in particular, it has long emphasized the role and responsibility of religious and spiritual leaders in the peace process.

It is our sincere hope and prayer that World Summit 2022 will produce novel ideas and pathways towards achieving long-lasting peace on the Korean Peninsula and the world.

To promote national unity and consensus for the peaceful reunification of the Korean Peninsula, the Summit will propose policies such as the establishment of the DMZ Peace Garden and the Korea-Japan Undersea Tunnel Project. In this way, the Summit seeks to open a new path for inter-Korean relations and Korea-Japan relations and thereby contribute to economic development and peace in Northeast Asia.

On this 30th anniversary of the visit of Dr. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon to North Korea, we seek to open the way for the two Koreas to build trust and open the way to peace. To this end, we will draw on the wisdom and experience of experts for the sake of peace and reunification on the Korean Peninsula. SUMMIT FOR PEACE ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA Opening Ceremony

The Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula, sponsored by the Universal Peace Federation, is a platform that seeks to raise general awareness and consensus within Korea while also promoting international cooperation for peace and unity on the Korean Peninsula. Together with the sounds of drums and dance moves that express the long cherished desire and hope of the Korean people for peace and unity, the Summit will open its doors with an opening ceremony. Since ancient times, the Korean people have sought to put a close to the sorrows and vicissitudes of life through dance and song, enabling them to passionately advance toward a new world. This performance, which awakens the soul of the Korean people, announces to the world that the time has come for a heavenly unified Korea to be realized.

Leaders from the 157 countries with diplomatic ties to the two Koreas will express their support for lasting peace on the Korean Peninsula, demonstrating our common will to achieve peace. Peace performances that express the Korean people's longing for peace will be performed, and will include a performance by the Little Angels, a dance troupe of young children, who have engraved the beauty of Korean culture and arts in the hearts of so many around the world. Finally, the song "Our Cherished Hopes Are for Unity" will be sung for peace and the unification of the Korean Peninsula. The opening ceremony will become a festive platform wherein the Korean people's strong emotions for unification will be shared and celebrated with people around the world.





Interreligious Cooperation

The “Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula” will also feature global religious leaders who come together for the sake of peace through understanding and cooperation between religions. As it has been said, “There can be no world peace without religious peace”, the role of religious believers is essential in realizing a peaceful world. Rev. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, who advocated an interreligious and interdenominational movement from early on, emphasized the role of religious believers in realizing an ideal world of peace. As humanity is now in a state of crisis caused by such problems as climate change, economic polarization, aging and low birth rates, religious believers offer hope and guidance; they transmit universal values and mutual ethics. Accordingly, the Summit aims to prevent conflicts and wars between different peoples, civilizations and nations and to pool the wisdom and courage necessary in bringing about a world of universal values and harmony.

The “Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula”, which will take into consideration the role of today’s religious believers, will be held in Korea in order to concentrate the understanding and insight of religious believers toward peace and unification of the Korean Peninsula, one of the few divided nations in the world. The endeavors and efforts of global religious leaders in leading South and North Korea to realize a righteous world together centering on universal values will serve as the cornerstone for the Heavenly Unified Korea and Heavenly Unified World.





Heads of State and Government Leaders

Today, we who live in the global village are faced with various challenges, such as the coronavirus, climate change and racial and religious conflicts. In fact, both the natural environment and human civilization are faced with the most serious of crises. Hegemonic competition is spreading to all fields of life, giving rise to conflict and clashes rather than understanding and cooperation. Consequently, no matter where we cast our eyes, we are hesitant to speak of hope. In particular, they will hold discussions on peace and the unification of the Korean Peninsula, specially focusing on the peace ideology and peace system through which South and North Korea can move toward the Heavenly Unified Korea. The heads of state and world leaders taking part in this year’s summit agree that the realization of the Heavenly Unified Korea is the cornerstone for the Heavenly Unified World, and they plan to promote international solidarity and cooperation for peace and unification of the Korean Peninsula.





One Million Rally of Hope

Why is prayer and preparation for a heavenly unified Korea important today? This is because peace and unification on the Korean Peninsula are closely linked to the realization of peace in Northeast Asia and world peace. Rev. Sun Myung Moon and his wife, Dr. Hak Ja Han, who had perceived this connection early on, have led peace and unification movements around the world. While preparing for the future of the Korean Peninsula, they have presented a pioneering philosophy and achieved results. All their efforts are culminating today as preparation to usher in the heavenly unified Korea age. THINK TANK 2022 was launched in response to the needs of such times. Now, it has developed into rallies of hope and forums, leading policies for international cooperation and nationwide understanding for the realization of a heavenly unified Korea.

The One Million Rally of Hope, which will be held in conjunction with the Summit for Peace on the Korean Peninsula 2022, will foster international cooperation and national unity for a heavenly unified Korea. The aspirations and voices of one million people for the unification of the Korean Peninsula will be presented as vision and policy, and will serve as a stimulus for the Republic of Korea to stand tall as a central nation in the coming Asia-Pacific era. The rally will be a festive occasion of great national unity, wherein the hopeful history of the Republic of Korea and the vision of a new future of the Korean Peninsula will be shared.





Sunhak Peace Prize

The Sunhak Peace Prize was established by Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon to continue the legacy left by her husband, who dedicated his entire life toward realizing a world of peace, prosperity and coexistence; a world where humankind prospers as “One Family Under God.”

The Sunhak Peace Prize aims to help resolve worldwide suffering, conflict, poverty and threats to the environment by promoting a comprehensive, future-oriented vision of peace. Sustainable peace in the 21st century can be accomplished only by resolving the tensions and conflicts throughout the world and by developing a global culture of mutual respect and cooperation. Based on the Founders’ vision of “One Family Under God,” the Sunhak Peace Prize encourages all people to dedicate themselves to peace, choosing dialogue and cooperation over conflict and competition.

The inaugural Sunhak Peace Prize Award Ceremony, held in 2015, recognized His Excellency Anote Tong, president of Kiribati, for his efforts at the forefront of ameliorating the climate crisis, and Dr. Modadugu Vijay Gupta of India, for developing innovative fish farming methods as an alternative solution to the future food crisis and for inspiring the “Blue Revolution.”

The 2nd Sunhak Peace Prize Award Ceremony, held in 2017, recognized Dr. Gino Strada, who provided medical and surgical care to the victims of war, poverty and displacement around the world, and Dr. Sakena Yacoobi, who presented an innovative solution for refugee resettlement through education in war-torn Afghanistan.

The Sunhak Peace Prize continues to seek and recognize individuals and organizations who have made significant contributions to human welfare and happiness. In addition to the 1 million US\$ prize, various projects are being initiated in partnership with the laureates.

For the 3rd Award, the Sunhak Peace Prize Committee selected Waris Dirie, for her major contribution to empowering rights of girls and women in Africa by leading the campaign to eradicate Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), and Dr. Akinwumi Ayodeji Adesina, for presenting the vision of Good Governance of Africa which leads Africa to feed itself by implementing innovative agricultural policies.

Waris Dirie was the first person in history to publicize to the world, the violence of FGM and saved millions of lives by taking a leading role in promoting an anti-FGM campaign. She raised the issue of FGM as an international human rights agenda and assisted in passing a worldwide resolution banning its practice.

As an agricultural economist, Dr. Akinwumi Adesina has been a leading agricultural innovator for over 30 years, bringing tremendous improvement in food security. His excellent leadership is building stepping-stones for Africa’s dynamic growth. In addition, Dr. Adesina passionately cooperated with banks in other countries and international NGOs to create an innovative financing system which led banks to extend credit and loans to smallholder farmers, who have no other way to get out of the cycle of poverty.

For the 4th Sunhak Peace Prize, the Sunhak Peace Prize Committee selected Macky Sall (President of Senegal) and Munib A. Younan (former President of the Lutheran World Federation) as the 2020 Sunhak Peace Prize Laureates. In addition, to mark the 100th anniversary of the birth of its founder Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon, a special Founders’ Award was presented Ban Ki-moon (former UN Secretary-General). President Macky Sall was recognized for spreading mature democracy to neighboring countries in the African continent, successfully shortening the presidential term and by leading an economic revival through transparent policy in his country.

Bishop Munib A. Younan, a Palestinian refugee, was recognized for his dedication to bring harmony among Judaism, Christianity and Islam in the Middle East region for over 40 years since his appointment as a Lutheran pastor in 1976, and for his leading role in seeking a peaceful resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

Former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, the winner of the Founders’ Award, was selected in recognition of his devotion in leading the UN toward a sustainable world in the face of unprecedented global challenges and crises, such as the global economic crisis, climate change, terrorism, and refugee issues during his term.

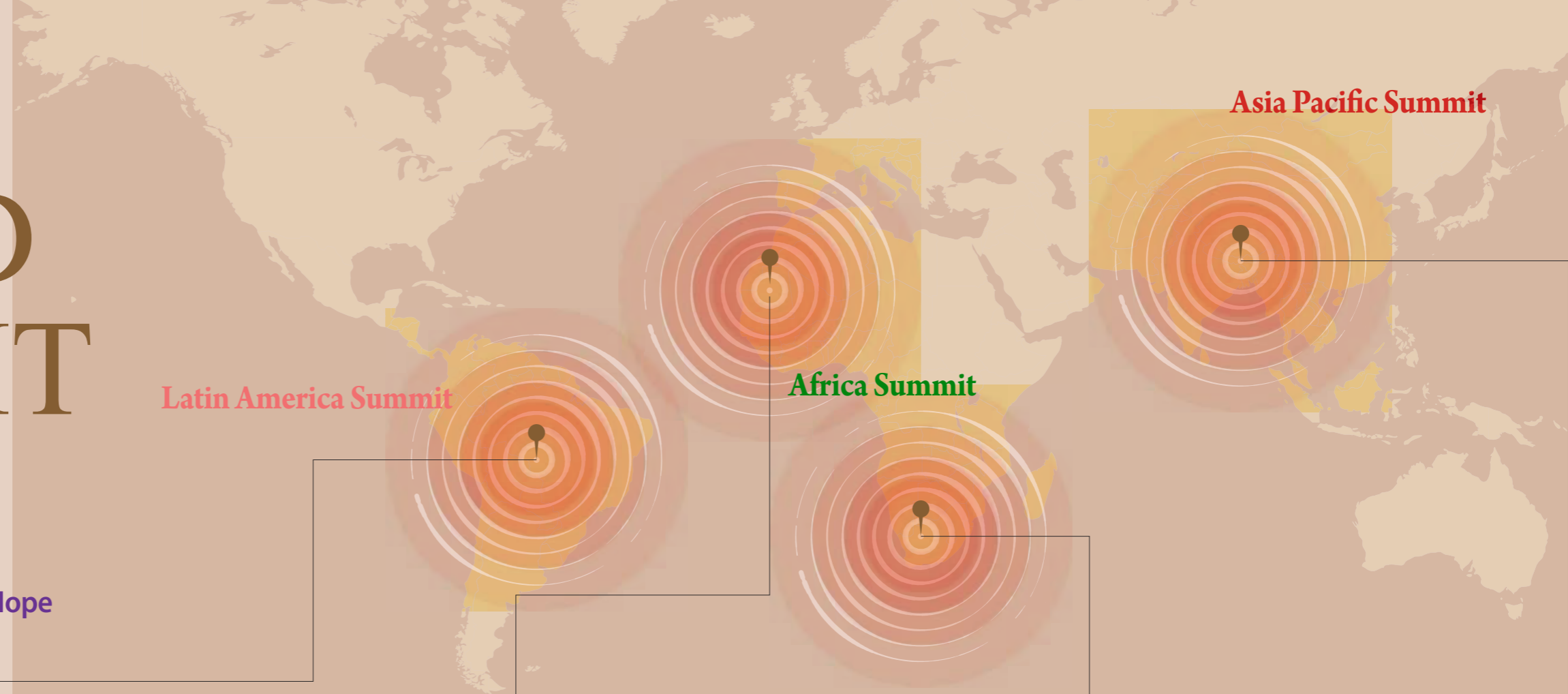

Hyojeong True Family Blessing Festival

The World Summit 2020 Assembly, which was sponsored by UPF, took place February 3-8, 2020, in Seoul, Korea. The summit was aimed at addressing critical challenges facing humanity, from climate change to poverty and conflict, bringing together a wide range of experts and stakeholders to deliberate collaboratively, offering insights and recommendations that contribute to building a world of lasting peace.

The three core values or principles that guided discussions were interdependence, mutual prosperity and universal values. We live in an interconnected world; what happens in one part of the world impacts the rest of the world, and, as such, cooperation and mutual respect are essential. All the world benefits when we improve the lives of everyone, moving toward equitable and mutual prosperity. And, finally, despite our wide diversity in terms of religion, nationality, culture, ideology, and ethnicity, there are common ethical values, universally shared ideals and aspirations that bind us together as human beings, members of one global family.

More than 6,000 delegates representing 170 countries attended the opening session, including former and current heads of state and government, former and current lawmakers, ministers, religious leaders, journalists, businesspeople, women leaders, youth leaders, Nobel laureates and scholars.

Prominent national and international leaders addressed the theme “Realizing World Peace and the Reunification of the Korean Peninsula through Interdependence, Mutual Prosperity and Universal Values,” including former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen, Myanmar Vice President Henry Van Thio, Philippine Vice President Maria Leonor Robredo, former U.S. Vice President Dick Cheney, former U.S. Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich, and former Nigerian President Goodluck Jonathan.



World Summit 2020

The assembly culminated in the adoption of the World Summit 2020 Resolution, which affirms “a global community of peace-loving citizens whose tireless efforts in the areas of interdependence, mutual prosperity and universal values help resolve the conflicts and discords caused by religion, ethnicity or nationality.” The resolution concludes with the following Call to Action: “To support and strengthen the six primary associations of the UPF that have been formed as instruments of peace, and which work as parts of one unified whole, guided by the principles of interdependence, mutual prosperity and universal values, each with unique vocations that contribute to humanity’s well-being.”

World Summit 2020 featured the inauguration of three new associations—the International Association of Academicians for Peace (IAAP), the International Media Association for Peace (IMAP), and the International Association for Peace and Economic Development (IAED). Youth and Students for Peace (YSP) was also integrated into UPF’s family as the International Association of Youth and Students for Peace (IAYSP).

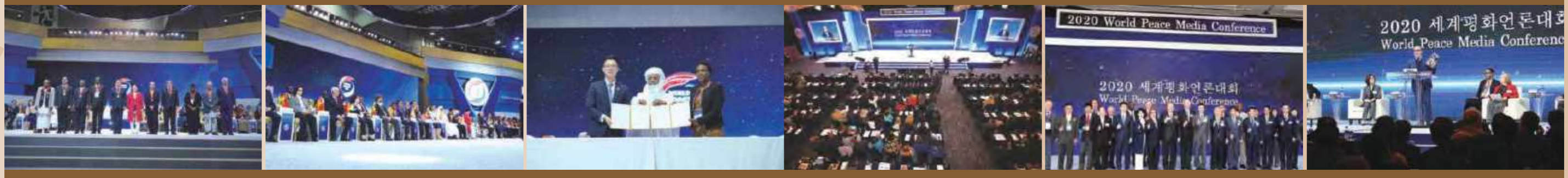

In integrating the efforts and actions of experts, World Summit participants are playing an essential role in the realization of peace in their diverse fields, and forging a path in the direction of goodness centered on absolute values.

Aiming for a heavenly unified Korea in which South Korea and North Korea are truly one
Pursuing lasting peace on the Korean Peninsula and around the world

In the absence of absolute values, there is great confusion, and people in the world at large are increasingly becoming both the perpetrators and victims of material greed and ideological arrogance. Territorial disputes, wars over resources, religious and racial conflicts, environmental crises and climate change, the collapse of family ethics and the breakdown of the family worldwide are taking place at a much faster pace than ever. With COVID-19, we see the severance of relationships, the loss of human dignity, economic instability, and a more and more common trend to go back to exclusive nationalism that prioritizes the interests of one's nation. Life on earth is increasingly put in danger, and respect for human diversity and international cooperation and solidarity are becoming more distant.

In such a rapidly changing environment, Korea has been facing conflicts and division both internally and externally, moving away from the universal human values of harmony, co-existence, freedom, peace and happiness. The grim reality is that people's lives, safety, and health are seriously jeopardized as a result of empty criticism, meaningless condemnation, economic inequality, and social polarization. This critical state is not made any easier with the ongoing new Cold War situation as world powers compete for dominance in Northeast Asia. This is leading to tensions in inter-Korean relations, which could easily trigger a military clash at any time. More than ever, this is the time the Republic of Korea needs great unity and solidarity bringing together the diverse fields of economy, society, culture, religion, media and academics, centered on one cause.

THINK TANK 2022, which was launched in response to the urgent needs of the times as a network of intellectuals worldwide, presents a vision of interdependence, mutual prosperity, and universal values as a basis for peace and unification and a counteractive measure to the crisis and difficulties faced by the Republic of Korea today. THINK TANK 2022 seeks to realize sustainable peace and mutual prosperity on the Korean Peninsula and usher in the age when the two Koreas truly become one as a heavenly unified Korea, and to have the Republic of Korea in the 21st century develop as a central nation of the Asia-Pacific era. To that end, THINK TANK 2022 proposes policies that encompass all fields based on the principles of an interdependent economy, political policies that seek mutual prosperity, and universal ethics that are practiced by all. More importantly, it seeks to contribute toward the peace and prosperity of the future heavenly unified Korea by proposing a new vision and solutions including ways to realize permanent peace on the Korean Peninsula.



Inaugural THINK TANK 2022 Forum

September 18, 2021, Cheongshim Peace World Center

The 1st THINK TANK Forum was emceed by former KBS announcer Jo Woo-jung, following an opening performance by the Little Angels Arts Troupe. THINK TANK 2022 Forum Organizing Committee chairman Dr. Yun Young-ho gave the welcoming address, and the keynote speaker was former U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo. Former Unification Minister Kim Yeon-cheol gave a general comment and this was followed by discussions among a panel of experts, questions from members of the public, and musical performances.

Organizing Committee chairman Dr. Yun said: "THINK TANK 2022 had its inception in the process of seeking answers to questions about the possibility for peace in the world, and was launched to be a cornerstone of international unity and collaboration... Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon proposes a fundamental solution: through interdependence, mutual prosperity, and universally shared values we can resolve the conflict and division on the Korean peninsula."

Former U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo emphasized the importance of diplomacy, dialogue, and freedom of religion, saying: "We should never give up hope for peace and reunification." He explained that religious freedom is truly important for peace in Northeast Asia and the world. "When people are free to talk about the most consequential ideas, societies can find the best way forward.... Religious freedom creates blessings for the world. And America must always stand for it at home and abroad." Speaking of the region of Northeast Asia, Mr. Pompeo said, "Today, across the world, and specifically in Northeast Asia, democracies must continue with clear strategies, strong deterrence, and powerful alliances... It is my great hope that South Korea and Japan can work through their differences and figure out how best to cooperate together... The region's security isn't served well by frosty relations between two of America's most important regional allies. This is one area I do believe dialogue can absolutely, and will, make a difference."



After Pompeo's keynote speech, former Unification Minister Kim Yeon-cheol said in a general review, "With regard to the human rights problem, I believe that practical and effective improvements are key... There is a need for a balanced approach, human rights sensitivity and cooperative human rights policies, a three-principled approach." He also referenced the current international situation: "We should be learning lessons from the Hanoi summit to help with future nuclear negotiations with North Korea... Strategic competition between the U.S. and China is negatively affecting the resolution of North Korea's nuclear issue. To solve North Korea's nuclear issue, cooperation between China and the United States is essential."

Afterward, the main speakers, South Korean, U.S., and Japanese experts conversed with former Secretary of State Mike Pompeo. The Korean panel consisted of former National Assemblywoman Shim Jae-kwon (20th Chairman of the Foreign Affairs and Relations Committee), Lee Ho-jin, acting president of the United Nations Korea Association (former deputy ambassador to the United Nations), Park Seung-hoon, former Marine Corps Education and Training Group leader, and Moon Byung-cheol, former visiting professor at Soongsil University. Former U.S. House of Representatives Speaker Newt Gingrich, former U.S. Congressman Dan Burton, former U.S. Assistant Secretary of State for East Asia and the Pacific Christopher Hill, and former U.S. deputy representative to the Six-Party Talks, Joseph Detrani, also took part and contributed their thoughts.





2nd THINK TANK 2022 Forum

October 16, 2021, Cheongshim Peace World Center



The MC for the 2nd forum was TV host Shin Young-il. The program consisted of an opening performance by the Little Angels, a welcoming address by THINK TANK 2022 Forum Organizing Committee chairman Dr. Yun Young-ho, the keynote speech by the 48th US Vice President Mike Pence, a Q&A session with the panel and keynote speaker, a conversation with the public, musical actor Michael Lee's peace performance and closing remarks.

In his welcoming speech, Organizing Committee chairman Yun Young-ho said: "When the Korean people, whose dream was a united Korea, stood up to oppose foreign colonial rule 102 years ago and attained freedom from it 76 years ago, there was no consensus about what political system a united Korea should implement. As a result, we experienced a tragic and heartbreaking civil war, and even today we are experiencing the resulting painful division of the Korean Peninsula... Dr. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon have proposed the principle of "common prosperity," which is collective politics in which everyone participates as the political system for the reunification of the two Koreas. They have presented a vision wherein the world's people attend God, the vertical True Parent of humanity, as our Heavenly Parent, and realize the ideal of one human family under our Heavenly Parent, advocating for "sibling politics"—that is politics of the siblings, by the siblings and for the siblings—with God, the True Parent of humankind at its center."

In his keynote speech, former vice-president Mike Pence said, "The Bible tells us that 'Blessed are peacemakers.' Today, I commend each and every one of you for coming together at this event to continue sowing the seeds of peace...I



want to express my appreciation to The Washington Times — a courageous voice for freedom in America and around the world promoting faith, family and liberty for all... And finally I also want to thank Dr. Moon for hosting this important event, and for faithfully continuing the significant work she began with her late husband... During my four years as Vice President of the United States, at home and abroad I have seen firsthand that truly great nations embrace the principles of religious liberty, freedom of speech, democracy and free enterprise first. We know that strong families, education, equality under the law, and a recognition of the dignity and worth of every human life, born and unborn, is the true foundation of national greatness. These are the values that have united the people of Korea and the United States for nearly 70 years. They are the same values that my late father, US Army Lieutenant Ed Pence — and freedom-loving Americans and Koreans just like him — fought to defend in the Korean War. And they're the same values I have had the privilege to defend in my 20 years of public life."

There was then a question and answer session between the Korea, US, and Japan panel of experts and former Vice President Mike Pence.

The Korean panel consisted of Professor Shin Yul, a professor of political science at Myeongji University; Professor Hyeong-seok Kim, a professor at Daejin University and a former vice minister of unification; Hon. Won-shik Shin, a parliamentarian from the People Power Party; and Professor Geun-shik Kim from the Department of Political Science and International Relations at Kyungnam University.

The US panel was moderated by former Speaker of the House of Representatives Newt Gingrich and included Dr. Michael Jenkins, president of UPF International; former U.S. Representative Dan Burton; and U.S. Ambassador Christopher Hill, who has worked on Korean issues for 30 years. The Japanese panel was moderated by Masayoshi Kajikuri, chair of UPF-Japan, and comprised Admiral Yoji Koda, who served as commander of the Self Defense Fleet of the Maritime Self Defense Force; Hon. Yoichi Anami, former member of the House of Representatives of the Liberal Democratic Party and an international political scientist; and Professor Yoshimitsu Nishikawa, professor emeritus, Toyo University.

Following this question-and-answer session, a conversation with the public was conducted. Questions were given by Kim Ho-il, chairman of the Korean Senior Citizens Association, Dr. Ahn Chan-il, the first North Korean defector to earn a doctorate and head of the International Research Center on North Korea, Kang Na-ra, a North Korean defector and Youtuber, and Kim Joon-hyun, a student at Busan National University.



3rd THINK TANK 2022 Forum

November 20, 2021, Cheongshim Peace World Center, Korea

The MC for the 3rd Forum was TV host Shin Young-il. The opening performance was given by the Little Angels Arts Troupe, with prayers for peace offered by domestic and overseas religious leaders. The Forum included a welcoming address by THINK TANK 2022 Forum Organizing Committee chairman Dr. Yun Young-ho, the keynote speech by Jim Rogers, Chairman of Rogers Holdings, and general comments by former Unification Minister Kim Yeon-cheol. Session 1 was themed, "The Peace Economy on the Korean Peninsula, How Will it be realized?" The theme of Session 2 was "The Road to a Heavenly Unified Korea, the Korea-Japan Undersea Tunnel." There were questions and answers with Korean citizens, peace performances by Korean singers and Samulnori master Kim Deok-su. The International Association of Economic Development for Peace lent its support towards establishing a heavenly unified Korea.

Former Unification Minister Kim Yeon-cheol said in his general review: "Peace is the land, and the economy is the flower. A fertile land produces beautiful flowers. The task of our era is to create a positive cycle of economic development and peace... We must develop a Korean version of the Cooperative Threat Reduction program that will involve transforming Yongbyon, where nuclear facilities are concentrated, and key military areas into new areas of economic cooperation."

In his welcoming remarks, Organizing Committee chairman Yun Young-ho said: "Rev. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon proposed the principle of interdependence, which is a theory of a common economy based on shared ownership. They emphasized that the reunification of the two Koreas should be approached based on such interdependence, beyond the constraints of capitalism and communism. Just as parents share their possessions in the family, love their children, and their children share those possessions with a heart of gratitude toward their parents, interdependence, in essence, defines God as the parent of humankind and emphasizes shared possessions based on the true love of God, our parent."



In his keynote speech, investor Jim Rogers said, "All we have to do is open the 38th parallel. And you'll see, 3 billion people are going to change their lives. The Korean peninsula will become a hub of great change as it becomes a new country." He also said, "Some of you know about the automobile company Dr. and Mrs. Moon founded in North Korea. Who would have thought of building an automobile company in North Korea 20 years ago? Most people would not—they didn't have cars or anything else."

Honorary chairman of Pyeonghwa Motors Park Sang-kwon, who spoke during Session 1, said: "We who live in the fourth industrial revolution era must present new alternatives and creative ideas with regard to the issue of unification and peace on the Korean Peninsula... We cannot just cry out for the denuclearization of North Korea. I believe it is time to formulate an innovative Peace Economy Project that can go beyond the logic of denuclearization... By presenting this project as a national policy agenda by the government it will be the turning point for peace on the Korean Peninsula. Furthermore, North Korea will be seeking a new direction for inter-Korean cooperation."

Session 2 featured Ahn Byung-min, president of the Korean Peninsula Economic Cooperation Institute. The Korean panel comprised Jeong Heon-young, Professor of Urban Engineering, Busan National University, Heo Jae-wan, Professor of Urban Planning at Chung-Ang University, and Park Young-bae, THINK TANK 2022 Yeongnam Organizing Committee Chair. The Japanese Panel featured Harada Yoshiaki, former Japanese Minister of the Environment, Toshiyasu Noda, Professor of Law, Seinan Gakuin University, and Masayoshi Kajikuri, UPF Chair in Japan. Ms. Park A-ram, former youth chair of the Korean Peninsula Peace and Economy Forum, asked a question representing the Korean public.





THINK TANK 2022 INTERFAITH FORUM

December 4, 2021, Hyojeong Cultural Center, Korea



The Interreligious Forum was moderated by Cho Hyung-guk, Secretary General of the THINK TANK 2022 Policy Research Institute, and the welcoming address was given by Dr. Yun Young-ho, chairman of the THINK TANK 2022 forum. The keynote speaker was introduced by UPF International President Dr. Michael Jenkins and the keynote speech was given by Pastor Paula White, former chairman of the Evangelical Advisory Committee of the Trump administration. A general comment came from Rev. Stephen Kim, co-chair of the Korean Christian Clergy Conference (KCLC). Peace performances were offered by pop-opera singer Kim Jaebin and traditional fusion music group Queen, and the event concluded with a Q&A session.

In his welcoming address, Organizing Committee chairman Dr. Yun Young-ho said, "There are many theories including religious pluralism, religious inclusivism. However, Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon have always spoken of the unity of religions... It has been 30 years since Rev. and Mrs. Moon arrived in Pyongyang, which is like the heart of communism, where they proclaimed God." He further said, "Dr. Moon has traveled around the world for the past eight years, bringing together leaders from countries that have established joint diplomatic relations with North and South Korea, and launched THINK TANK 2022... Religious people of the world must transcend religion, nationality, race, and culture and confess that God is our parent."



In her keynote speech, Pastor Paula White said the following: "Especially in the conflict areas of the world, Mother Moon, your faith is greatly inspiring, and your courage is very moving especially having passed through many trials, persecution, misunderstandings that you and your late husband Rev. Moon endured. However, you never wavered on your commitment to achieving peace through Jesus' fundamental teaching... I know of the invasion [of Korea] by other countries, yet in your suffering, you never invaded another nation... When the Protestant Christian missionaries came from America bringing the Methodist and Presbyterian traditions, they suffered greatly. Nevertheless, the message of the Gospel took root."

Also: "Mother Moon grew up in a Spirit-led church, as her mother and grandmother devoted their lives to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to His return. I believe this gave Mother Moon the spiritual foundation that will continue to be the basis to bring re-unification of North and South Korea. I believe that God did not want communism to take over North Korea or any part of the world. And I ask our Lord and Savior to guide American faith leaders to repent on behalf of America for allowing communism to divide North and South Korea... As Americans, we have a God-given responsibility to restore North and South Korea to be one nation and one people again."

The Prayer Rally for the Salvation of Our Homeland was emceed by Family Federation International HQ director-general Dr. Yun Young-ho, who also gave an opening statement. There followed a peace ceremony conducted by religious leaders, a welcoming address by Pastor Paula White, spiritual advisor to President Donald Trump, congratulatory messages, peace performances by the Little Angels Arts Troupe, the Art Bulli Arts Troupe and others, prayers for peace offered by domestic and overseas religious leaders including from the Christian, Buddhist, and Muslim traditions, the keynote speech by UPF and FFWPU founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, and prayers for the unification of Korea. Lutheran Christian Bishop Dr. Munib Younan said, “Let us pray that our Triune God may hear the cries of the divided Korea and that Christ, who is the light of the world, may shine his light on the Korean leaders so that they can unite the Korean people in one nation.”

Representing Islam, Imam Umar Nasarudin said, “Islam is a religion of peace. The division of the Korean peninsula has impacted our region and the entire world. It is not only the problem of Korea but the problem of us all. Therefore, we need to stand together in unity to bring salvation to this Peninsula.” The religious leaders thus expressed their hopes and prayers for peace.

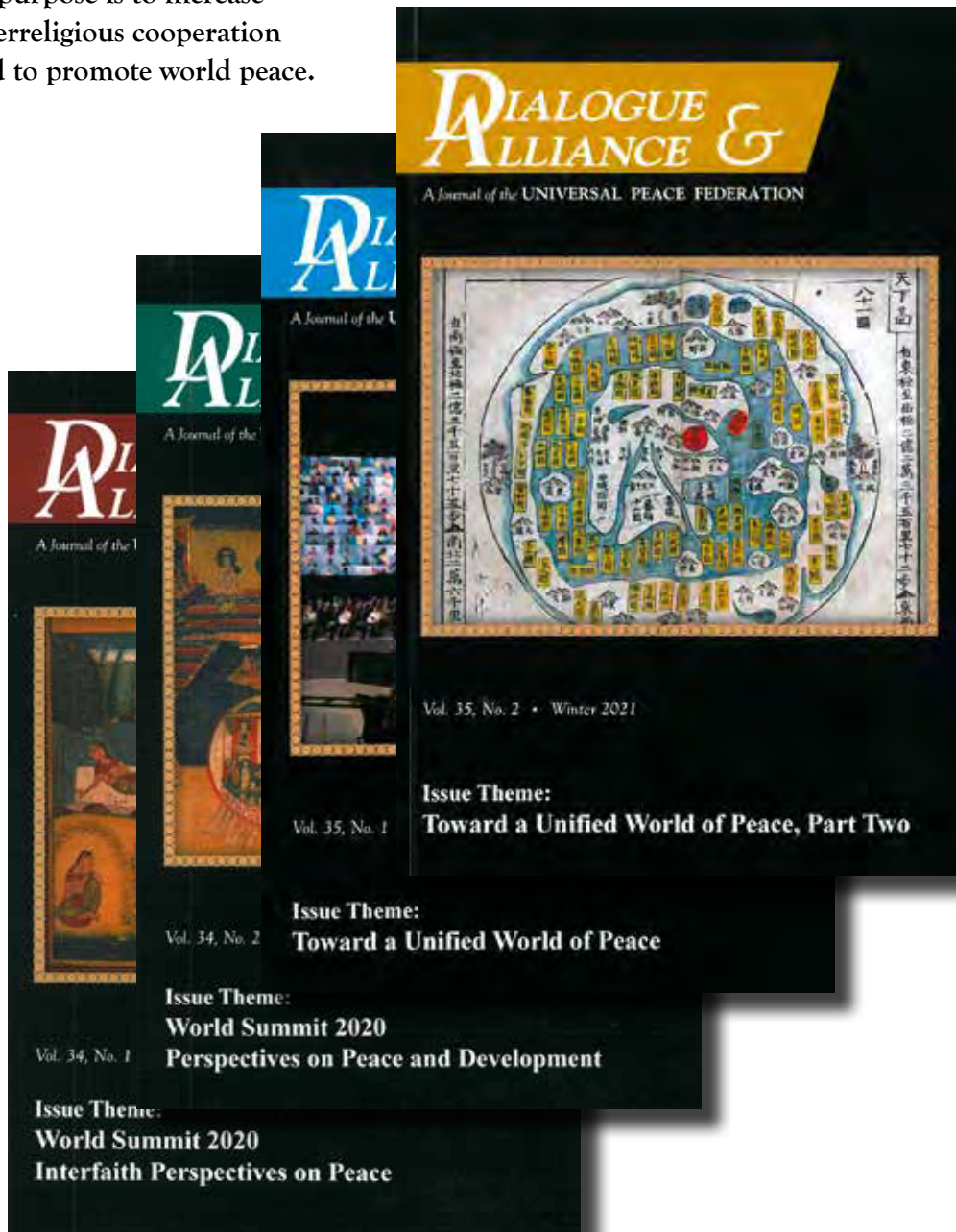
CORE VALUES: A LEGACY OF PEACE

Macky Sall, President of Senegal and Bishop Munib Younan of Jerusalem while H.E. Ban Ki-moon was awarded the 2020 Founder's Award. The peaceful world envisioned by humankind can only be built upon an all-encompassing foundation where peace among nations exists politically, militarily and religiously, and is realized by protecting family values, the sanctity of marriage, and the value of filial piety through the maturity of human character.
