In March 1987, she became the first woman to head the Irish Government Information Service, a position she held until 1990. She then served as the head of public affairs at Radio Television Ireland, beginning in 1990.

Mme. Mutharika has served as Cabinet Minister, Member of Malawi Parliament. Member of Pan African Parliament and Country Director of an international NGO working with grassroots women in areas of food security, microcredit, functional adult literacy, early childhood development, water and sanitation and livestock enhancement. Mme. Mutharika holds a degree in Human Resource Management from the University of Leicester and a Certificate in Education from the University of Leeds (UK).

Mme. Flores de Aleman served as the First Lady of Nicaragua (1997-2002) and is currently serving as a Congresswoman of the National Assembly of Nicaragua. She is also the President of the Foundation for Human Dignity. Residence for the Elderly, which was founded in August 2000. The First Lady is also the creator and founder of the Liberal Movement.



Mme. Debbie Remengesau First Lady, Republic of Palau (2015-2021)

Mme Remengesou is married to the ninth President of Palau, Tommy E. Remengesau, Jr. As a mother, grandmother and homemaker with a deep-rooted love for the Republic of Palau, her people and her culture, the First Lady maintains a strong spirit of community through supporting and promoting women, children, the protection and conservation of Palau's precious natural resources and unique cultural identity.
