Dr. Julia Moon is the President of the Women's Federation for World Peace International. An internationally renowned ballerina, she is also the chairperson of the Universal Culture Foundation, coordinating the operations of the Universal Art Center, the Universal Ballet Academy, the Kirov Academy of Ballet in Washington, D.C., and the Julia Company, aside from the Universal Ballet Company.



Speaker:

Dr. Yang-Ho Hong is a Distinguished Research Fellow of the Institution North Korean Studies, and the North Korea Social Research Center President at the Database Center for North Korean Human Rights. He also served as Chairman of the Gaeseong Industrial District Foundation, and President of The Tongil Shinmun.

Dr. Hong will address the nature of inter-Korean interaction and cooperation, inter-Korean women interactions, the significance of women leadership for reconciliation and peace on the Korean Peninsula.

Amanda Mortwedt Oh is a human rights attorney at the Committee for Human Rights in North Korea (HRNK), a bipartisan research organization based in Washington, D.C. She is the desk officer for a series of satellite imagery reports on North Korean prisons published by HRNK. Her research focuses on North Korea and international human rights law. Amanda has interviewed over 50 North Korean escapees in South Korea to document human rights abuses committed in North Korean detention and advocate for



accountability for these crimes against humanity.

Mrs. Oh will address the situation of human rights in North Korea and the approaches we can take to solve these issues.

Rev. Belina Wimbish-Haile is the Founder and CEO of Belina Ministries Int'l and BeYOUtyful Solutions. She is an author, licensed cosmetologist, realtor, IT professional, as well as Vice President and regular speaker of the International Association of Women (formerly NAPW) for the Bowie Chapter. In 2020, Pastor Belina was invited to pray for world peace and was honored to present in 2021 on the reunification of Korea from a Religious Leader perspective for the Universal Peace Federation led by Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon.

She will address the disparities on the Korean Peninsula and the perspective of reconciliation from a mother's heart.
