The Mindful Path – Positive Change

The fresh new year is upon us. Bundled up in the hopes and expectations of 2022 is the lingering weight of the pandemic. I have been reading "The New Normal: A Roadmap to Resilience in the Pandemic Era" by Dr. Jennifer Ashton. I have found this to be an excellent resource to navigate the coming year.

"The New Normal" suggests powerful ways to minimize our COVID risk. Dr. Ashton recommends all of the usual talking points – vaccination, social distancing, mask usage in public, and frequent hand washing. However, she also strongly recommends that we focus on achieving a healthier weight and exercising. In America, at least 70% of adults are overweight. Many people report they exercise little or not at all.

Americans are aligned with Dr. Ashton when they consider their New Year's resolutions. Year after year, the top two resolutions are dieting and exercising more.

Below you will see amazing highlights, covering the Global Women's Peace Network, Outreach, Education, and Service of how we uplifted, collaborated and made an impact towards a culture of heart.

NATIONAL: GLOBAL WOMEN'S PEACE NETWORK

In 2021, WFWP USA educated **over 3,200 women and men** through impactful Global Women's Peace Network Forums and programs. Nationally, we hosted **four Global Women's Peace Network (GWPN) virtual forums under the theme of "Women's Leadership in Reconciliation and Peacemaking"** to bring hope, encouragement and tips to navigating these uncertain times. Each forum covered an important topics, including <u>family</u>, <u>the next generation</u>, <u>health and healing</u>, and <u>arts and culture</u>.

In close collaboration with WFWP Canada under the leadership of President Lilly Tadin, we have seen an expansion of GWPN activities in their region. They held three virtual webinars under the theme of "Women's Contributions in Peacebuilding," covering topics on domestic peace, public life and sustainable development, and mother-daughter relationships.

INTERNATIONAL: GLOBAL WOMEN'S PEACE NETWORK

Notably, we have increased our international collaboration and working relationship with WFWP Korea and Japan in effort to discuss real steps toward a peaceful reunification of the Korean Peninsula under the theme of "Women's Leadership in Reconciliation & Peacemaking." Three virtual webinars were held over the course of this year, hearing the perspectives from women (Korea, USA <u>forum</u>) and North Korean descendants (Korea, Japan USA forums one & two).







As an action step for the participating audience, Mrs. Kiyomi Schmidt, Outreach Director of WFWP USA, introduced the 1% Love Share Project during each session. This year all donations collected for this campaign in the United States will go to support North Korean defectors and students.

STATE: GLOBAL WOMEN'S PEACE NETWORK

On a state level, WFWP <u>Arizona</u>, <u>California</u>, <u>Indiana</u> conducted **four radio shows and monthly webinar series** to solve pressing social issues and to empower women through peace leadership.





In the last quarter of the year, the **GWPN was revived in the National Capitol** (DC, Maryland, Virginia) since it was launched in Washington, DC two years ago. Thanks to our newly appointed GWPN Southeast Coordinator Natascha Phillips who collaborated with GWPN DMV representatives for putting on **two events in September** with two incredible women panel speakers, and in November, honoring and celebrating Native American Heritage Month.





OUTREACH TO WOMEN LEADERS

As a partner of the Universal Peace Federation (UPF), WFWP, International co-sponsored with the support of WFWP USA the pillar International Association of First Ladies for Peace (IAFLP) sessions within the International Leadership Conference (ILC) from April 28-30, 2021. Prominent panelists, including current and former First and Second Ladies, addressed the theme "Women Leaders' Perspectives on Peace in the Pacific Rim."

On September 23, WFWP USA together with UPF co-sponsored a special webinar on the topic of "The Influence and Leadership of The United States First Ladies: Perspectives of the Chiefs of Staff and Key Personnel," which was sponsored by Women in Leadership, a project of The Washington **Times Foundation.** Featured among the distinguished panelists was our own Mrs. Alexa Ward, former President of WFWP USA, who also held the position of the Executive Director at the Eleanor Roosevelt Center at Val-Kill, New York for a number of years.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Another notable development this year was initiating the <u>Young Mothers</u> (<u>YOMO</u>) <u>program</u> to engage young moms on topics to empower their journey of motherhood. Also offers helpful tips and tools and an opportunity to meet and connect with other moms to support and uplift each other.

Inspiring WFWP Chapters in <u>Illinois</u> and <u>California</u>, **the Leadership of the Heart educational seminar** continued to empower women to discover the leader within and to make peace a reality within each of their lives, families, communities, nations and the world. In 2021, WFWP USA educated **over 470** people in this new paradigm of leadership!





WOMEN SERVING THE WORLD

In 2021, \$35,000 was raised in support of those around the globe who need upliftment, education, and refuge. A national campaign plus fundraisers by our local chapters helped send \$5,390 for our WFWP International's **1% Love Share Project**, donated \$7,200 for the **Arabic Literacy Project** to support supplemental literacy classes for refugee children living in Jordan, collected \$19,465 by the WFWP New Jersey chapter for their **Cambodia Foster Care Project**, and \$2,538 was sent for the Typhoon **Disaster Relief in the Philippines**.

Each year, local chapters and members across the USA organize innovative and engaging events to raise funds for the **Schools of Africa Project** with ten schools throughout eight African countries. These funds have helped to continually maintain the schools, finance school supplies, improve buildings and classrooms, secure funds for scholarships to low-income students, and much more.
