
WFWP USA: You Made a Difference - Voices of Gratitude from Africa

We recently received a wonderful thank you from the New Hope Technical Institute in Rwanda. Our support of \$2,485.00 from WFWP USA enabled them to acquire new supplies to assist students in their education: Cooking appliances were given to the culinary arts program, sewing machines for the tailoring course, and mannequin heads for the beautician and hairdressing courses.



A big Thank You to all who donated and created fundraisers in 2022 to raise money for our WFWP Schools of Africa Program. All donations received are transferred once a year to various schools based on the needs communicated to us. Admin costs are carried by WFWP USA. We will continue to update you as we receive reports and thank you messages from the different schools.


Background about the New Hope Technical Institute




The Institute was founded in 1998 with an objective to help women become financially independent post civil war. The school also accepts many men, such as ex-soldiers, especially since 2007, when it was recommended as a school promoting a project sponsored by the World Bank. Since 1999, students who have financial difficulties have been aided through a sponsorship program. Students also take courses in English, French, and Business Administration. Courses are further enhanced by support from international volunteers.

The Peace Hana School in Liberia received a \$15,000 grant from WFWP USA at the end of 2019. This helped pay for the rent of the building for two years. They also built a new fence, bought 50 new chairs and desks, repaired the school partially, and prepared some pieces of equipment for the school reopening. The rest of was used for teachers' salaries.





Thanks to the support of 2016, the Sun of Mozambique High Shool was able to make the changes necessary to foster a supportive learning environment through various school improvements. As a result, 2017 – 2018 marked an excellent year for academic achievement among the students.



In the early 90s, the founders of WFWP commissioned 1600 volunteers from WFWP Japan to serve in underdeveloped nations. With willing hearts, these women went to the poorest nations, to neighborhoods in every corner of the world. They started schools, fed the undernourished, and worked to empower women.

Inspired by their dedication, WFWP USA initiated the "Schools of Africa" project to financially support 9 schools founded by those faithful volunteers.

This invaluable support has helped the schools purchase critical materials for lessons and provide scholarships to impoverished students.

Contributions from WFWP USA has also supported school feeding programs, expanded and improved facilities, and paid for skilled staff.

Many of the schools operate in the poorest neighborhoods, and have come to serve as a source of stability to their communities.
