Horizon Summit Capacity Building Sessions

1. Women Brokering Peace with Protocol, Professionalism, and Power: How female leaders engage to build partnerships and coalitions through "working" the room" and then rocking the globe. What's required when one goes from local/regional leader to international game changer. This workshop will help give women the tools to develop their public presentations. They will also learn how to navigate, form partnerships with protocol, professionalism, power and diplomacy.

Ambassador Suzan Johnson Cook: An Educator, Success Strategist, International Influencer, Business Owner, Communications Expert, Diplomat and Faith Leader, Hon. Suzan Johnson Cook was the first female and African-American to hold the position of U.S. Ambassador for International Religious Freedom.

2. Advocacy training on gap analysis, stakeholder analysis, developing an action plan, developing compelling messaging/ "SMART" recommendations, and maintaining coordination across your "coalition."

Margaret Williams is an international affairs and development professional, with experience in peace and security, state-society relations, youth, peace and security, women's empowerment and education. At present, she is the Senior Peace and Security Officer at the World Federation of United Nations Associations in New York.

- 3. "What works": Three strategies that have achieved results in refugee camps in Afghanistan, from a community based approach, broad-based education, and cultural education.
- Dr. Sakena Yacoobi is the CEO of the Afghan Institute of Learning (AlL).
- 4. "Mindful Social Action"- This session will focus on cultivating the state of mind needed for a nonviolent, non-judgmental, inclusive and meaningful social action. The workshop will include a short presentation and few exercises based on practices of listening from the heart and speaking from the heart, not knowing, bearing witness and compassionate healing.

Iris Dotan Katz: A senior clinical & organizational psychologist. She recently submitted her PHD dissertation dealing with the issue of Peace Making and Reconciliation from a Psychological and Buddhist point of view.

The first day of the event, March 17, will consist of the opening plenary, presentation of the Global Women's Peace Award, lunch, and capacity building sessions. The capacity building sessions will convey skills, strategies, and insights related to peace leadership that participants can use in their personal and professional lives.

Themes confirmed for capacity building sessions include advocacy, reconciliation, peace studies, education and training, and peace leadership. Capacity building sessions will be offered at two times in the afternoon and participants will have the opportunity to choose between a variety of topics. A memo will be sent soon concerning the topics and speakers for confirmed sessions.

On Sunday, March 18, participants will have the opportunity to choose from one of four tours during the day. Tour options include: (1) The FDR Presidential Library and Val Kill National Historic Site in Hyde Park, New York; (2) East Garden in Tarrytown, New York; (3) the National September 11 Memorial and Museum, in downtown Manhattan; (4) and the Metropolitan Museum of Art near Central Park. Prices vary according to tour. Dinner and the closing program will take place in the evening at 4 West 43rd St.

Horizon Summit Tour Options

On Sunday, March 18, participants have the opportunity to choose from one of four tours in New York. The cost of the tours is not included in the Horizon Summit registration fee. Participants should be prepared to pay estimated costs listed here upon arrival at tour site.

1. FDR Presidential Library and Val-Kill

The FDR Presidential Library and Museum and the home of Franklin D. Roosevelt are exceptional exhibitions about the history and contributions of Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt in the US and on the world level, including their involvement in the founding of the United Nations and the drafting of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The significance of the Roosevelt era is portrayed with interactive exhibits, immersive audio-visual theaters, and rarely seen artifacts. Val-Kill National Historic Site includes Eleanor Roosevelt's summer cottage and is the site where she worked on drafting the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Estimated total Cost: \$75 adult, \$45 senior (65+)

Cost includes

- Admission to FDR Presidential Library and Museum as well as the Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site (Val-Kill)- \$20 adult, \$12 senior
- Round trip transportation by train from Grand Central station in New York to Poughkeepsie New York-\$37 adult, \$24.50 senior (does this include cost of roundtrip pickup from train station to Val-Kill)
- Lunch at Coppola's restaurant in Hyde Park New York~ \$18

2. East Garden

East Garden is historic not only for the age and grandeur of the property, but also for its role as the former primary residence of WFWP founders, Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon and her late husband Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon. This tour includes the original building as well as the more recent structure, museum and grounds. On this tour, guests can learn about the achievements and history of this remarkable couple and connect to their incredible vision for world peace.

Estimated Total Cost: \$28.50 adult, \$22 senior

3. Metropolitan Museum of Art

This historic museum has served as a center of art in New York City since it opened in 1880. Since then, the Met has developed into a building with galleries and exhibits spanning more than two million square feet filled with art from all cultures spanning 5,000 years. With its vast collection in one facility, this magnificent museum reveals unexpected connections and shared ideas across time and culture.

4. National September 11 Memorial and Museum

The impact of the fateful day of 9/11 in 2001 has been felt around the world. This exhibit gives a unique opportunity to imagine the experience of the people in New York on that day. With rarely-seen videos, unique photographs, stories and audio from people who were there and even the chance to touch items left from the devastation, this is truly an immersive and impactful experience. This is a not-for-profit museum which gives all its proceeds directly to families affected by 9/11 and to FDNY charities.
