Students at the school are able to learn a valuable trade, pursuing a four year curriculum of dressmaking, knitting and embroidery. The Salon de Couture Jamoo, a training shop was established 2001 to help graduates get started in the world with their new found skills. Together, these programs have helped over 1,000 women become successful and financially independent.
