Dr Ki Hun Kim reported that True Mother is doing well in lockdown at Cheon Jung Gung. She, like all of us carries out her mission through phone calls and zoom meetings. True Mother is always very attentive to what is taking place in USA. Dr Kim believes that Mother gains a lot of hope when she hears reports from America and the good things that members are doing. America is fulfilling the role of elder son and serving the rest of the world through our online presence and all of the ways that our departments are offering education and connection. True Mother talked about utilizing the tools available to get the message out to the world. She cited companies like Amazon being the biggest retailer in the world without having any brick and mortar shops.

Locally, Hearst Avenue is slowly emptying out as the students have only online classes and may have lost their part time jobs. We don't know what will happen in the next semester and whether the students will come back.

Our local CARP members cannot fundraise for their rent and living expenses. they are still very busy doing their witnessing and follow up online. They are having online meetings etc.
