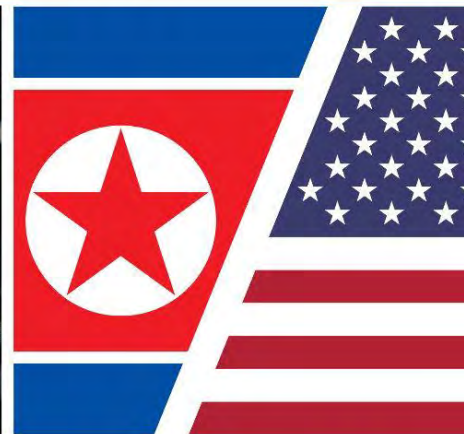

Since April 1992 members of the BGEA, including the late Dr. Billy Graham, his wife Ruth, and his sons Franklin and Ned, initiated what has multiplied into countless efforts to reach North Korean leadership, to develop humanitarian projects in the DPRK and to lobby for the protection of Christians in North Korea, as well as encourage personalized approaches by US leaders towards Pyongyang, which, they feel, are essential to thawing the tense interstate relations between Washington and Pyongyang.
