The grand Lotte Hotel in Jamsil served as the elegant venue for the International Academic Symposium on May 4, 2023. Session 2 embraced the theme "Vision and Peace Ideology for Peace Movements: The Role of UN and UPF on Each Continent." Here, Mahendra Lama, a senior professor of international studies at Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi, offered an Asian perspective on soft power, public diplomacy, and alternative paradigms for constructing world peace. Dr. Rojas Aravena, the 8th Rector of the University for Peace (UPEACE), stressed the necessity for dialogue and consensus. Finally, Keisuke, the chairman of UPF, presented a vision and peace ideology specifically focusing on Europe and the Middle East and the role of UN and UPF in these regions.

After the riveting presentations, the speakers engaged in thoughtful exploration of various facets, especially the roles of religions and the UN in actualizing the peace ideology and vision of the True Parents.

This symposium provided a robust platform for exchanging academic ideas, encouraging lively discussions, and inviting questions. This unique combination of activities was aimed at fostering the academic foundation required to realize world peace, achieved through relentless research and understanding myriad perspectives and prospects.
