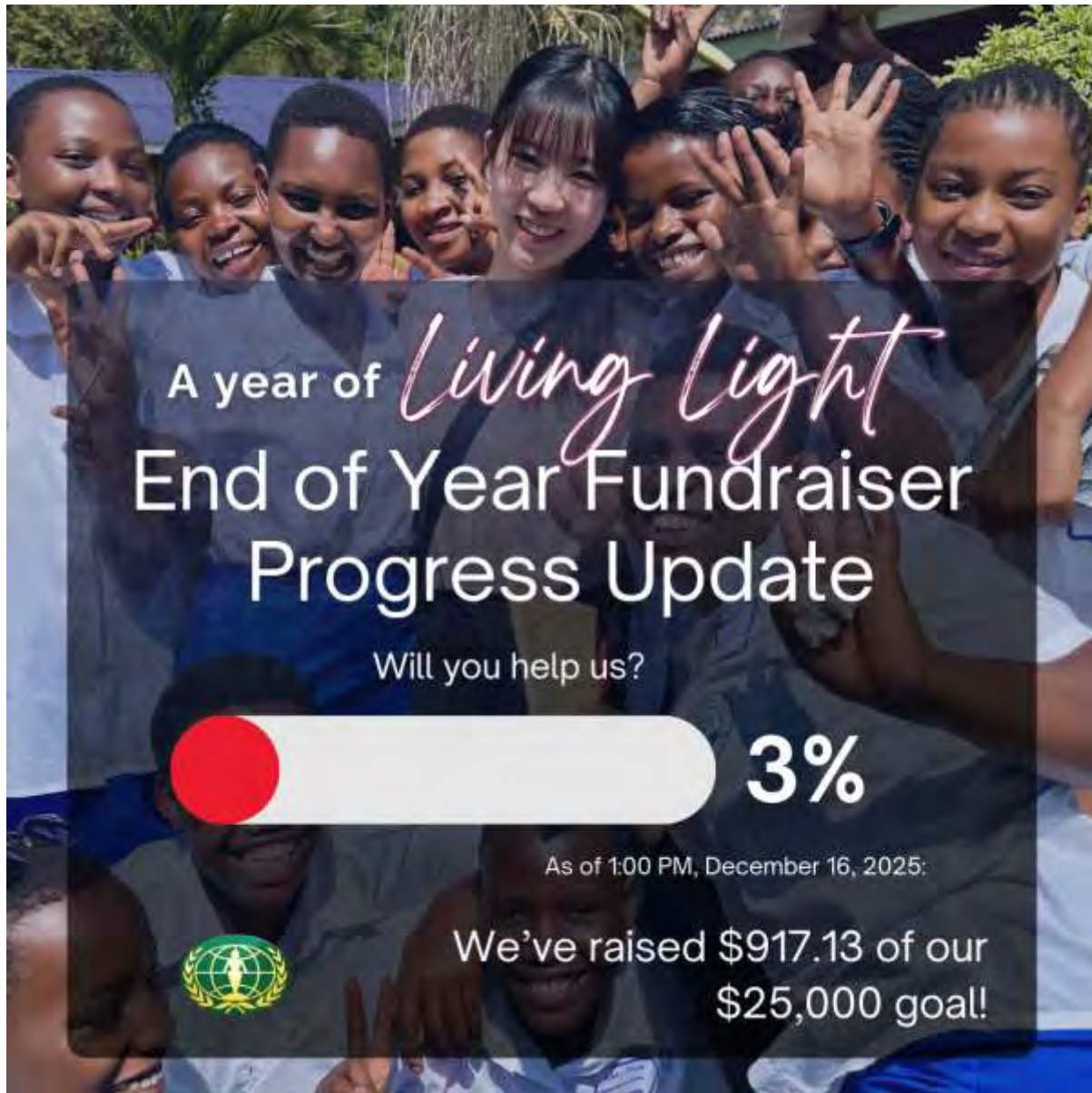


WFWP USA: A Journey That Changed Lives - And How You Can Help Continue It

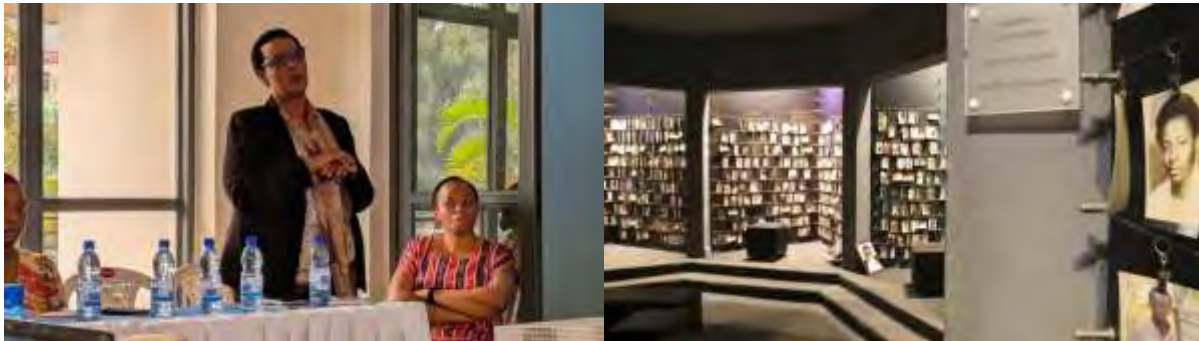
A Journey of Heart, Hope, and Healing in Rwanda

In November 2025, a small group of seven volunteers from WFWP USA traveled across the world to Rwanda to take part in our first-ever Schools of Africa Service Trip. What unfolded over four unforgettable days became far more than a visit—it was a journey into the heart of healing, resilience, and hope.

Led by WFWP USA President Dr. Katarina Connery, the team was welcomed by WFWP Rwanda members with flowers, songs, and open arms at the Kigali airport. One volunteer shared,

“I was embraced warmly and sincerely... I felt the pure hearts of WFWP members.”

Confronting History, Choosing Hope

The journey began at the Kigali Genocide Memorial, where the true weight of Rwanda’s history could not be avoided. What unfolded in 1994 was not a spontaneous conflict, but the result of outside colonial and political forces that deliberately elevated one group above another, weaponizing identity and planting seeds of hatred.

Neighbors were turned against neighbors, as friends, coworkers, and even family members were incited to brutally murder those they had once lived alongside—simply because of how they were labeled.

In just one hundred days, over a million lives were lost, leaving the country shattered. Bodies filled streets and homes, entire families were wiped out, and survivors emerged from hiding to find everything destroyed—no homes, no loved ones, no sense of safety. Fear lingered, trust was broken, and people lived with the trauma of what they had seen, what they had lost, and, for some, what they had been forced to do.

Survivor testimonies, including that of Georgette Umubyeyi, President of WFWP Rwanda, made clear that the horror did not end with the violence. Survivors were left to rebuild their lives in a nation where victims and perpetrators had to find a way to live side by side.

Yet signs of renewal emerged at New Hope Technical Institute, where students' joy reflected not forgetfulness, but resilience—a nation choosing healing over hatred and unity over division as one Rwandan people.

Learning Together, Seeing the Reality

The next morning, volunteers spent time teaching English lessons, singing songs, and exchanging stories with students eager to learn. Gifts collected in the U.S. were distributed, bringing moments of joy and laughter.

Later that day, the group visited the homes of several scholarship students, witnessing firsthand the harsh reality of poverty many still face. **“Each person said ‘food’ when asked what they needed most,” one volunteer shared. “How can they survive eating once a day, if that?”**

Moved to take action, WFP USA sponsored a meal plan for the students as soon as the team returned, helping to meet these essential needs and bring the students’ wishes to life.

These visits deepened the team’s commitment to expand scholarships, meal programs, and sustainable support for New Hope students, ensuring hope and opportunity reach even the most vulnerable.
