The following is a testimony by Maryland-resident Liana Gaarder, who, after a year in the Special Task Force (STF), now known as Generation Peace Academy, successfully raised money to pay for her college tuition and to help her family at a time of financial crisis. She is currently a full-time student at Anne Arundel Community College, at which she is completing a transfer program to the University of Maryland (UMD). Gaarder's parents were blessed in 1982 as part of the 6,000 couples in South Korea and have three children: Trellis (22), Liana (19) and Branch (17).

I had so many incredible experiences in this past year on STF – from fundraising to ballroom dancing. The two most valuable aspects of all of that, which I carried with me into everyday life, are the following: First, I took with me my relationship with God. I can actually relate to Him as my parent now, instead of as some eminent being on a throne. And I have developed a deep sense of trust that He is truly guiding my life. I have this peace in my heart that I don't have to worry about anything because God is with me, He loves me, and my value comes from Him. That in itself made my STF year priceless.

Second, I walked away with a deep relationship with True Family. Getting to know Rev. In Jin Moon's family was such a special experience for me. I have felt God guiding me through Rev. In Jin Moon and her husband, Dr. James Park, time and time again. The love and investment they have put into me have propelled me forward and I feel that – thanks to them – I am well on my way to being the person I've always wanted to be, but never thought was possible.

A Happier Perspective and Healthier Life

After finishing a year of focusing on my internal excellence on STF, I decided it was time to switch gears. I'm striving to become a well-rounded person; so after a whole year of STF, I had a lot of external catching up to do.

My entire life I've been overweight. After trying diet after diet, I gave up and accepted that I would always be chubby and out of shape. That totally changed when I started taking Vemma, a liquid vitamin supplement. I had more energy, and I began working out. Through exercise, I became more in tune with

my body so I could significantly feel the negative impact of, for example, eating a slice of pizza before running. Instead of "dieting," I began to cut out excessively sugary or fatty things like soda, fried food, and bread. With the combination of multiple, daily doses of Vemma, regular exercise, and healthy eating habits, I lost 40 pounds over ten months. It felt like a miracle. In addition, my immune system is now in tip-top shape. I used to get sick regularly, but since I started taking Vemma, I haven't suffered through anything but the occasional stuffy nose.

With bills to pay and my empty college fund to fill, my mom and I decided to do something about it; we created our own "MFT" [Mobile Fundraising Team] – she was the driver, and I was the fundraiser. It was

like STF all over again. So far we have gone out for two three-week periods – Thanksgiving and Christmas. She takes care of the product, the area and transportation, and I do the fundraising. At the end of each day we offer it up to God in prayer and then split the result. Through the unity of my mom and me, and my commitment to tithe ten percent of all my fundraising result, I believe the spirit world was inspired to help us achieve our goal. We persevered through each day, and didn't stop until we reached our daily goal of \$500. This experience not only brought me closer to paying for my college tuition, but it brought me closer to my mom. We're already planning our next fundraiser for Valentine's Day.

We started each day by flipping open my STF book, which is stocked with inspiring speeches by True Father and True Children. We would read until we felt ready for the day. It's amazing how much strength was poured into me from just reading! No matter how negative and uninspired I may feel, my mind and spirit always feels so clear and bright after some good old *hoon dok hwe*.

My mom would drive and drop me off at all kinds of businesses. I personally love to fundraise at car dealerships, so we would look up all the dealerships in town and go to one after the other. It was exciting! It was also a constant struggle to get out of the van each time my mom pulled over somewhere, but with the goal in mind and my mom's encouragement, I persevered. It's all about having the right mindset. One of my favorite quotes by Father is: "Please have an adventurous and pioneering spirit." I feel like that explains my mom and me in a nutshell. In the car, whenever I would hit rock-bottom, my mom and I would joke about how grateful I should be to be fundraising, because I could be so much worse off. I have a college education to pay for, I am young and healthy, and I am a good fundraiser.

I approached anyone and everyone, and with a smile I said, "Hi! I'm fundraising for my college tuition! I was wondering if you'd like to help out!" For Christmas, we sold homemade treats wrapped in cellophane with a ribbon and a bell. It was a lot of fun. People are so supportive of helping with college tuition, and they could always use a snack while they're stuck at work.

For me, fundraising is like a roller coaster. The hardest part is getting on the ride, but once I'm on, it's exhilarating! Driving to fundraising area is like waiting in a line. Getting out of the van is like creeping up a hill before a big drop, but 90 percent of the time when I approach people, I have a blast. I really love sales and relating with such a wide spectrum of people. It's all about communication of heart.
