Korean Teens Graduate from Ukraine's English Camp

The four-week English camp held in Ukraine for Korean high-school students finally came to a close on August 14.

The 15 teens who had come to Ukraine as part of the Korea Multicultural Peace Foundation were quite young, with the youngest being 13 years old. Mostly they studied English, but they also went on an exciting trip to Poland for a few days.



Most importantly, they were given the opportunity to go witnessing in the cities of Odessa, Kharkiv and Chernigiv. For most of the participants, this witnessing turned out to be the best experience of the four weeks.

From a participant's reflections:

Most of us were going out witnessing for the first time, so we were nervous at the beginning. But the more we witnessed, the more confidence we had. And we thank the Witnessing Center members – our witnessing partners—as they helped us a lot. ... At Hoon Dok Hwe we read that if we want to witness to someone, we need to love that person more than we love our parents. I felt sad that I hadn't been able to follow those words until then.
