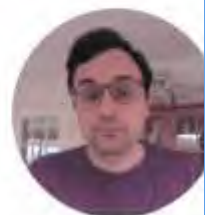

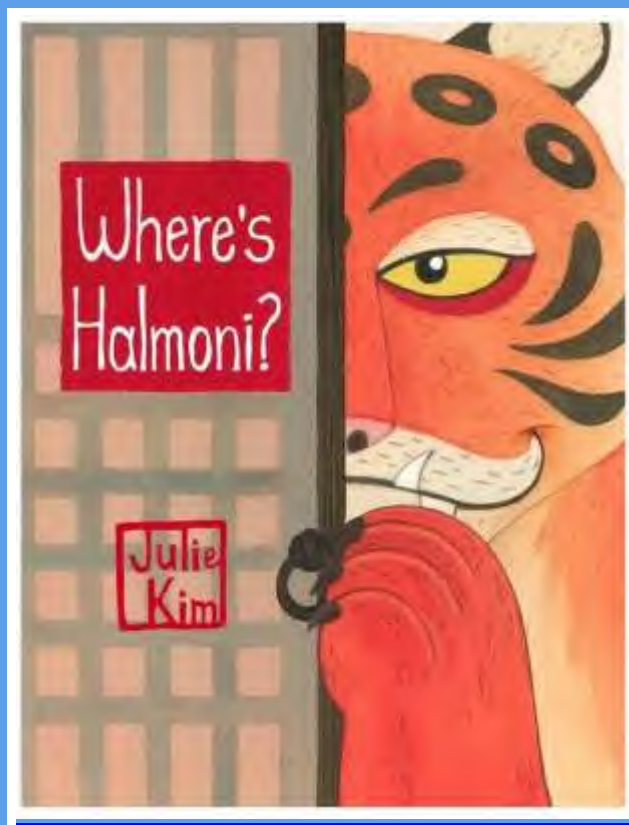

A truly life-changing encounter with Jesus

On Wednesday 17th April 1935, as Easter was about to begin, on Myodu hill in [Chongju](#), not far from home, [Sun Myung Moon](#) had a deep spiritual encounter with Jesus, who explained how 2,000 years ago he had been unable to complete the mission for which he came to earth. In [Sun Myung Moon's](#) own words:

"When I was 15, I had an extraordinary experience. It was an Easter morning, and I was in deep prayer. I cried as I prayed. Then Jesus appeared. He revealed many things to me and explained that God's heart was full of sorrow and pain because of us humans.

Jesus asked me to take on a special mission so that God's will could be completed here on earth. It is difficult to explain to you about this experience. In short, the spirit world suddenly opened before me, and I was able to communicate freely with holy and wise men in the spirit world. In the quiet hills of northern Korea, I spoke directly to Jesus many times. The revelations I received then constitute the very core of the [Unification Principles](#)."

Jesus asked him to take upon himself the responsibility of completing the mission which Jesus himself had started 2,000 years earlier, but which, because of his premature death, he had not been able to complete. [Sun Myung Moon](#) thought at first that he could not promise such a thing, but Jesus urged him repeatedly, stressing that the young Korean was specially chosen by God and that there was no one else who could take on such a mission. Therefore, the 15 year old boy in the end said yes. But he hardly knew what he was getting himself into.

Here is how [Sun Myung Moon](#) describes his encounter with Jesus in his autobiography,

"It was the night before Easter the year I turned fifteen. That day also, as usual, I climbed up the Myodu hill behind our village and stayed up all night praying. As the tears flowed, I begged God for answers to my questions, 'Why had He created a world full of so much sorrow and despair? Why did an all-knowing and all-powerful God leave this world to itself when it is in such sorrow and pain? What should I do for my poor fatherland?'

As the tears flowed, I asked this again and again.

I was up praying all night without sleeping at all. At dawn that Easter morning, Jesus manifested himself before me. Like a gust of wind, Jesus appeared and said, 'Because of the sufferings of humankind, God has a broken heart. That is why he asks you to take on a special mission in God's work on earth.'

That day I saw the sorrowful face of Jesus clearly and heard his voice distinctly. Seeing Jesus manifest made my body tremble violently, like an aspen leaf. Then and there I was seized with an awe so great that I thought I was going to die, and at the same time carried away by emotions so strong that I thought I was going to explode. Right in front of me, Jesus clearly explained to me what I had to do. In an incredible way, he told me that I should save a humanity that was suffering and in pain, and bring joy to God."

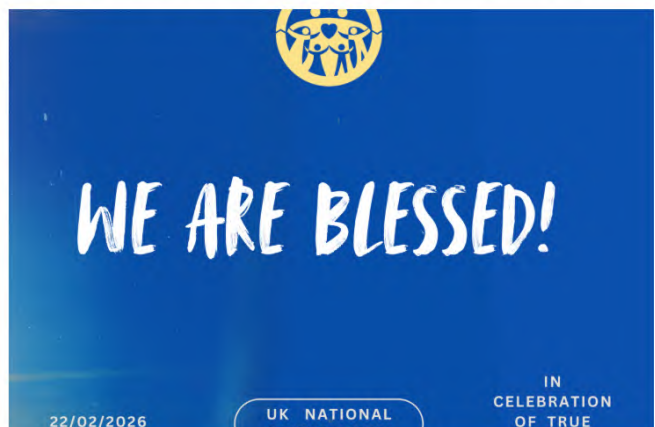

From the very beginning, the atmosphere was full of energy and positivity—and what a blessing it was to have such gorgeous weather! The sunshine really lifted everyone's spirits and made the whole experience even more enjoyable.

To kick things off, we started with a fun icebreaker bingo game. The aim was to find people within the group who matched each description on the card and write their names into the squares. The challenge was to complete a full line—horizontal, vertical, or diagonal. It was a great way to get everyone talking, laughing, and connecting. Out of the 14 participants, we had four winners, which added a nice bit of excitement and friendly competition to the morning.

After the icebreaker, we were warmly welcomed by Sharon, our ranger, who took the time to chat with us and explain the task for the day. As you can see from the photos, there were quite a lot of brambles and branches that had previously been cut but left scattered across the area. Our mission was to help clear and tidy the space to make it safer and more accessible for visitors.

We got straight to work. Some of us used mini saws to cut the thicker branches into manageable pieces, while others used loppers for slightly thinner ones. The rest of the team focused on raking and forking the branches into neat piles, placing them along the very edge so that the grassy path could be properly cleared. Everyone played their part, and it was great to see such teamwork and willingness to help. In just about an hour, we made a really noticeable difference to the area.

Once the work was complete, we headed back to the reception area where we enjoyed a well-deserved break with tea, coffee, and some lovely snacks. This was a great time to relax, chat, and reflect on the morning's efforts. As always, the conversations and fellowship were just as valuable as the work itself.

To round off the day, some of us stayed on to enjoy a friendly game of volleyball, while others took the opportunity to have a peaceful walk around the lakes, soaking in the beautiful surroundings.

The graphic novel format is particularly appealing for younger readers, offering vivid, expressive illustrations that help children engage with the story even before they can read fluently. The inclusion of Korean words throughout the book, with translations at the end, adds an educational dimension and invites families to explore language together.

As we have celebrated Mother's Day and International Women's Day in March, this story also offers a beautiful opportunity to honour the special women in our lives—mothers, grandmothers, and all those who lovingly pass down wisdom, care, and tradition. The character of Halmoni reflects the quiet strength and deep love of grandmothers everywhere, reminding us to cherish their presence and the stories they share.

For grandparents, this book may feel especially meaningful. It highlights the quiet but powerful role they play in shaping a child's identity, values, and sense of belonging. Sharing this story together can open conversations about family traditions, heritage, and the stories that connect generations.

True Parents have often reminded us that tradition, love, and faith are not meant to remain in one generation, but are treasures to be passed down.
