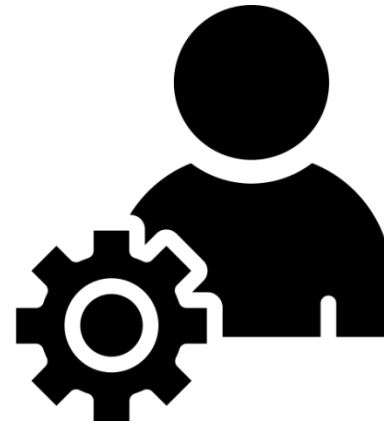

3. Gather diverse **political leaders** to dialogue and cooperate for **regional peace**.

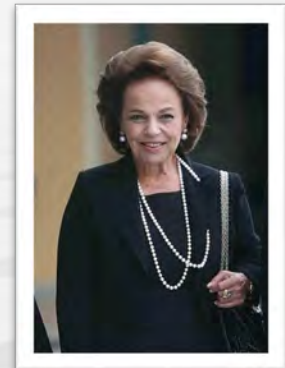

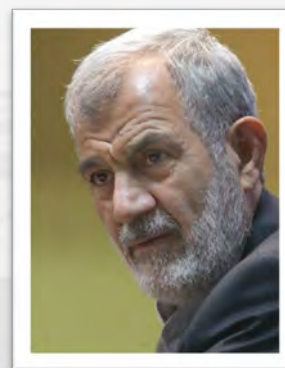

- Strategy for IAYSP -
Raising Capable Young Leaders for the Future

1. Support and **expand YSP national chapters**
- 2. Identify** and inspire **young leaders** to take leadership roles in the Middle East.
3. Develop **education and training** in the Middle East to attract **youth leadership** (MEYE program).
4. Find **financial resources** to support young leaders who are devoted to the public life.

- Suggestions -

- **Young Leaders** – Considering that most of our leaders are in retired age we need young leaders to replace them.
- **Volunteers** – To bring YSP, GPA, UPA youth from abroad to stay for a long period to attract and raise the large youth population.
- **Peace Council** - Because of the conflicts the Ambassadors for Peace are willing to create a Peace Council to help address these issues.
- **Property** - We need to acquire property to give our movement more credibility, Peace Embassies in some locations.
- **Financial Assistance** - because of the small membership we need support temporarily until we strengthen our membership.
