“Having been born and raised in Nigeria, but having lived the American dream for 40 years in Prince George’s County, I feel a burden for the women and girls back home who don’t have the freedom to dream and learn that I had,” says Rev. Abby Daramola, who heads a congregation in Greenbelt and mentors church plants in several Prince George’s communities. “Having prayed and reflected on the worsening problem of intolerance and violence against women and girls in Nigeria, I have come to believe that U.S. citizens can be game changers if they start speaking out and calling on international intervention to assist law enforcement in the stricken Nigerian states.”
