The books were very much appreciated by the families and the older children were able to read excerpts from it to the rest of the group during our morning gatherings. On Saturday, we discussed how God

had a vision when He created humankind and creation, and they were asked to express their own goals for the new year by creating a vision board. That evening, the older children had the honor to receive a tour from True Parents' room hosted by Derk van Dorsten, who explained about the work put into preparing this holy space for True Parents and the significance of many elements in the space such as the furniture and the altar.

The schedule of course also included a visit to the beach and regular time to play outdoors. The children very

much enjoyed the beautiful playhouse and other play structures that have been added to the grounds of Glory House!
