Sunday Service: God, True Parents and the Spirit World

On Sunday, March 13, Rev. Jeddie and Elma King held a home church Sunday Service during which participants shared about their experiences with the spirit world, and discussed True Parents' legacy. Rev. King testified how he had shared some serious thoughts with his nephew over the phone while taking a walk with his wife. In his attempt to encourage his nephew to stay firm in his faith, he began to talk to him about the spirit world. He told him that all their departed ones are still present in their midst, despite being invisible physically. Both he and his nephew were overcome with strong emotions, and both started crying over the phone. Rev. Elma King also gave a testimony about the spirit world and how she feels it has been connecting her with certain people in her life.

The Sunday message given by Rev. Victorine Souck was titled "Can You Do It All?" She talked about True Father's life and acknowledged his hard work and purpose to bring peace on earth by sharing the heart of love of God. She talked about the many organizations and institutions he founded and developed to reach out through all kinds of human interests including the arts, education, family, sports, interfaith and more. "True Father's accomplishments answer our question that we can do it all," she said, "because with God everything is possible as long as we let God lead and lead our life just the same way as Rev. Moon walked with God throughout his life."

The Kings' 2nd 40-Day Outreach Initiative

Rev. Jeddie and Elma King spent the last 40 days delivering food door to door, by the roadside, in local parking lots, department stores, and beauty shops. They also give people Holy Wine, pray for them, and listen to their stories.

"We have a picture of True Parents on our flyers so they will know what they look like when they encounter them, physically or spiritually," she said. "We are making the way straight for True Parents to reach them."

During this 40-day period, the Kings also gave people education about True Parents, by listening to their stories and sharing True Parents' teachings in such a way that felt relevant to their lives.

"We all need to keep planting seeds," said Elma King. "The harvest will come. We fed 62 adults and 46 children this week. Our goal is to educate 430 people this month!"
