We also wanted to express a warm welcome to our guests who have newly arrived in Ireland and currently reside in Direct Provision Accommodation.

Overall, there were so many nationalities present, to name but a few, ladies from Syria, Egypt, Burundi, Nigeria, Pakistan, South Africa, Australia, Germany, the US and Ireland of course. Many new and existing members prepared both sweet and savoury dishes, so we had an amazing and plentiful dinner buffet. All the meat dishes were halal, and there were kosher options as well, to make sure that all participants could enjoy the buffet, including the Muslim and Jewish ladies. Several of the Western ladies had made effort to cook with halal meat for the first time.

After the formal introductions, we had a minute of silence, inviting God into our midst, also reflecting on the many people who find themselves in desperate circumstances seeking refuge. Then, we introduced ourselves through an ice-breaker game whereby the ladies were randomly broken up into groups of 5, and after briefly introducing themselves, each group had to act out a simple but fun task. And boy, did the ice break! We were laughing in stitches and the atmosphere was very relaxed and happy. After that, we sat down to eat and chat, and we could get to know each other more closely over the delicious meal.



In the end, each refugee lady was given a flower. We parted with a feeling of gratitude, joy and new-found friendships and are already looking forward to meeting again. This event was a real team effort, with so many people contributing to making it possible.
