The humanitarian crisis among the Rohingya ethnic group in Myanmar, as well as among those who have fled across the border to refugee camps in Bangladesh, has only become more desperate in the past couple of years. The military junta blockade of Rakhine State has cut off international aid since late 2023, leaving hundreds of thousands of internally displaced people in desperate need and targeted with daily atrocities. Across the border in Bangladesh, over one million refugees remain in the world's most congested settlements, where dwindling resources are forcing drastic cuts to food, health, and education services.
