The goal of the National Ocean Challenge Program is to allow youth to have life changing experiences in the Alaskan Wilderness. With a packed schedule beginning with Ocean Providence-related Hoon Dok Hae, participants have the opportunity to become closer to God and True Parents through the ocean.

The first few days will be dedicated to safety: participants will attend a Coast Guard boating safety certification class as well as a Red Cross first aid and CPR certification class. Furthermore, boat maintenance, general seamanship, fishing techniques, and fish processing will be taught. There will be many hours spent fishing in the bountiful Kodiak Ocean. Other activities may include river fishing, service projects, bonfires, wildlife viewing, hiking, sports, etc.

There are two programs available: 1) 21-day Senior Program which is for BCs 16 and up and 2) 14-day Junior Program intended for BCs aged 13-15.
